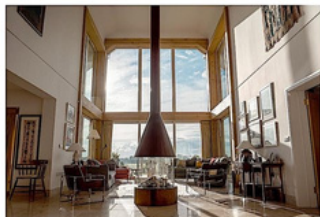

It was tempting to carry on with the lyrical theme from the previous contribution to Kingsley News but the only appropriate song in January seemed to be Bus Stop by The Hollies. Surely, though, few of the Kingsley Walkers date back to that tune's release in 1966. Alternative suggestions would be more than welcome.

Our December adventures using the excellent itravel bus service were followed by the assembly of 19 souls at the fairytale location of Stand E, Chester Bus Interchange on the 9th January. Some wafted in on the X30 from Frodsham, others used the Broughton Park and Ride, magically free for the month of January, whilst a wealthy few forked out for car parking nearby.

After the Christmas Monsoon Season it was a gloriously sunny day, though extremely cold. Rucksacks were excavated to find extra layers and gloves but quickly all the hats bobbed off, over the Shropshire Union Canal, around the Cathedral and up onto the city walls. The group chatted cheerfully about joyful family visits and the presents and overdrafts they had received from Santa(nder).

It was beautifully clear with views over the sandstone finery of Chester and towards Wales. Descending, we used the canal link path to cut through to the swollen Dee and round towards the Racecourse. Climbing on to the footpath alongside the rail bridge we entered Curzon Park where routine property maintenance seems to involve completely knocking down a small mansion to build a slightly larger one.

After a stop for coffee in a community garden we cut through to the South Bank of the river, over the suspension bridge, up through Grosvenor Park, across the A51 and back along the canal, the impressive cutting and to Telfords Warehouse for a generally pleasant, if rather extended, pub lunch.

Though Chester City was familiar territory, most commented that they had visited parts new to them and had enjoyed a fine winter walk. CAF are continuing the Warm Homes and Thermal Cameras campaign with two further meetings:

Most British Homes have poor insulation and air leakage and use more energy to heat than they should, this wastes both carbon and money effecting the Climate Emergency and our pockets.

These free meetings give a range of ways for homeowners to reduce energy loss and save money from free actions, through medium cost modifications to major retrofit schemes. There is also demonstration of use of the thermal camera to find cold spots and heat leakage and CAF have a thermal camera to loan.

Methodist churches
in Kingsley?

Villagers tended to worship in believers' homes until they could afford to build a church of their own. The Anglican church, St John's, was built in 1850, but there were non-conformists worshipping in Kingsley before then. The Quakers worshipped in a cottage, still known as the "Meeting House" at Newton, from 1686 to 1800. The Baptist fraternity had a chapel which stood at the bottom of Chapel Lane where it joins Mill Lane, possibly from 1709 and no longer in existence. A Rev John Phillips was ordained there in 1738. Kingsley's original Methodist chapel on the Hurst may have been a house previously, but was registered as a Chapel in 1788/9, and may possibly have had a thatched roof. A large schoolroom 38' X 20' was added some time later. There was much alteration over the years as the congregations grew. This was all demolished for the present chapel to be built in 1871. The second Chapel to be built in Kingsley was the Brookside Primitive Methodist chapel, built in 1832, rebuilt in 1864 and closed in 1967. It is now demolished. A breakaway (Wesleyan Association) chapel was built in 1843 at Blakelees between the Parish Church and the Norley/Frodsham road.

The Parish Council meeting was held on Tuesday 16th January 2024, at the Kingsley Community Centre, no members of the public were present.

The new Community Orchard has now been planted on Kingsley Playing Field, there were over 30 people that turned out on the day to help in any way they could. The Parish Council received good positive feedback from those present about the Community involvement with many expressing a desire to get involved in more community projects..... watch this space there will be a number coming up in 2024.

The RoSPA recommended works to the playground equipment, including the Zip-wire, have all now been completed ready for a new RoSPA inspection later this Spring. The Zip-wire was full dismantled and serviced prior to re-erection and is now ready for use.

The Parish Council is still awaiting final release of the land from CWaC for the construction of the new ramp between Smithy Lane and the Co-op car park, our Borough Councillor has undertaken to progress this with the Property Department. There have been various comments on Facebook with regards to the proposed ramp, so perhaps further clarification is required.

The new ramp is being installed to assist elderly and infirm residents from the Westbrook / Horseshoe Close /Smithy Lane area to access the Co-op without need to use the steps. The ramp is being constructed in accordance with CWaC specification and will have a smooth tarmac surface, drop kerb to the road and car park, concrete retaining kerbs along its length, hand rails, a bench (sponsored by Forresters) and a hard standing area adjacent, all as required by CWaC. This will be of great benefit to anyone with mobility aids such as scooters, frames, or, indeed those who find difficulty in using steps such as buggies and prams. It is sincerely hoped that work will commence later in Spring.

KINGSLEY PARISH COUNCIL



The Parish Council has set its precept for 2024/25 at the equivalent of £0.94 per month increase on a Band D property. This remains lower than the national average and the precept charged by other similar sized local Councils. Over the past few years, the Council has made efforts to establish a realistic budget. Kingsley Parish Council is now better equipped to respond to issues as they arise and unforeseen circumstances (such as vandalism) without this impacting the delivery of other services. However, between 2009-2020 the precept increased by an average annual sum of just £0.83 per annum. While this produced an overall saving for taxpayers for over a decade, it effectively resulted in real-term budget cuts throughout most of the Council's recent existence as the precept fell far short of inflation.

Across a similar period, CWaC has experienced funding reductions of almost £400 million. In reaction to these circumstances, Kingsley Parish Council has tried to play a more proactive role and reduce the potential risk of watching a decline of services in the Parish by not only maintaining, but undertaking additional improvements to important public realm areas (establishing new wildflower meadows; diversifying use of the playing field; restoration of heritage sign(s); undertaking repairs of village benches; providing additional festive lighting; delivering the future 'ramp' project; and although we have no statutory duty, undertaking clearance of key public rights of way around the village).
