It does seem as though we have had more than our fair share of rain over the last few months.

In February, we had 196% of our long term average rainfall for February in Cheshire, and in the three months from December 2023 to February 2024 we had some 160% of our long term average rainfall for that three month period.

So we've had a pretty wet winter, but then, so has the rest of England (162% of the long term average), though the North West generally gets over 40% more rain than England as a whole.

The whole of the last 12 months has been wetter -average rainfall for the North West in the Summer and Autumn was some 25% higher than normal. It may not have felt like it, but March has been better, only 17% above average across the North West. The last time rainfall in Cheshire was below average was in May 2023.

Surprisingly, the most extreme rainfall we've had in the last twelve months was last July, when we had around 260% of our average rainfall for that month.

In February 2024, water flow in the River Weaver was more than twice the average for February.

It won't make things feel much better, but the North, as a whole, (North West and North East) has been noticeably "drier" than the Midlands and the South, but Cheshire has been the wettest part of the North West.

Of course, its not just the rain that makes life just a bit miserable, it's the ground that it falls on. For those of us with clay soils, persistent above average rainfall results in a saturated garden with standing water and lawns that can't be mowed.

As you'd expect, reservoirs are currently generally brimful, but this doesn't mean that hosepipe bans are a thing of the past. Annual water supply and normal rainfall in the North West will drain and refill the reservoirs several times in a typical year, so only a few months of significantly below average rainfall can soon reduce reservoirs levels to "hosepipe ban" levels.

Kingsley Players stage 'fiendishly clever farce' - 15 – 18 May, 2024

Award winning Kingsley Players will be back on stage again in mid-May performing the hit West End farce, 'There Goes the Bride', by the dynamic duo of comedy theatre, Ray Cooney and John Chapman.

Described by the Daily Mirror as: "A fiendishly clever farce that gets madder and funnier as it goes along", the play revolves around the nightmare scenario of a harassed advertising executive who hits his head on the morning of his daughter's society wedding.

He wakes to find himself in the company of Polly Perkins, a 1920s flapper girl straight out of his current advertising campaign and it soon becomes apparent that no one else can see or hear her...

Malcolm said: "I am delighted to be working with a fantastic cast on this revival. When I revisited the script, I decided that although it retained its character as a classic mid-century piece, it would still resonate with a modern audience. Set on the morning before a wedding at the bride's home, it is just as riotous and hilarious as when it was first written. The cast agree and we hope audiences will enjoy it too."

"There Goes the Bride' will be on stage at Kingsley Theatre in Kingsley Community Centre, WA6 8ED, from Wednesday 15 to Saturday 18 May, nightly at 7.30pm.

The "In-Between" Time

As the church progresses through this vacancy we are in a sort of 'in-between' time as we wait to appoint a new incumbent. A position not unlike the disciples after that first Easter, although we are not without Jesus in our lives and we have to trust in this waiting time.

On the first Ascension Day the disciples find themselves bereft of the one who has captivated them, given their lives significance, meaning and purpose and stimulated within them a passion for the Kingdom of God.

They feel like abandoned orphans, as their beloved Lord evaporates from their sight into the great, blue yonder. They are at a loss to know what to do next. For the moment they are caught in what might be called the 'inbetween' time. They're caught between the Ascension and Pentecost - between loss and promise.

There are times when we find ourselves in a situation not dissimilar to that of the disciples, between things we have lost and things that have not yet unfolded. Perhaps it's a broken relationship, a divorce, or estrangement from a child, we find ourselves between brokenness and healing.

Prayer at these times can be a release even if like the disciples we don't feel motivated and the only prayer we can offer is 'I can't pray.' When in these dark places when we feel spiritually numb, it is through the cracks that light breaks through and grace takes hold of our threadbare prayer.

During this 11 days between the Ascension and Pentecost when we are called to pray and bring others to know Jesus, let it be for us a seedtime of hope as we sow gospel seeds of grace, generosity, love, forgiveness, reconciliation, peace, service and compassion to those we encounter.

KINGSLEY WALKERS



The March 26th long walk once again set off with the background of the persistently rainy forecast that the Met Office seems to default to, at this time of year. However, apart from a very brief and very light shower, we were to have a pleasant day. We drove only a short way to Acton Bridge, parked and walked up a quiet lane to join the Trent and Mersey canal, 88 miles to Shardlow apparently but we weren't planning on going that far. We lost a brief race with a friendly couple and a dog, who did have the advantage of being perched on a brightly painted canal boat, before climbing over the Saltersford Tunnel and then descending through woodland to the River Weaver. We then found our own perches on lock gates, walls and even benches to drink from our flasks (coffee only, no brandy was sighted though I wouldn't put it past some on a chilly morning).

Proceeding now in a westerly direction we passed some peculiar structures, fenced off and with Ministry of Defence warning signs. Our best research efforts suggested this was a part of plans, prior to WW2, to pump brine from caverns where fuel could then be stored and connected to the (then building) Government Pipeline and Storage System GPSS. This was to stockpile fuel and move it around military bases across the country and has been in use ever since. The network was sold to Compania Logistica de Hidrocarburos in 2015 for £82 million.

Lunch was had by Dutton Locks before we headed up past the Bluebell Cafe and back to the canal for our return to Acton Bridge. A further discussion covered the beams stacked at intervals along the canal side. These are stop planks and can be dropped into masonry slots on the canal bank to isolate a section of canal in the event of a breach. An example of this being the Dutton Breach on 22nd September 2012 which closed the canal for 8 months.

A deep and meaningful relationship with the weather is, I guess, a feature of living in England. This is true for walkers and generally we don the right clothes, the weather is kind enough to match them and we head off, not quite regardless but still determined. However, on Tuesday, 9th April a rare defeat was admitted. After a brief discussion, huddled in the doorway of the community centre, lashed by rain and howling winds the walk was called off. Spare a thought though for your commentator, who had taken up an invitation to help sail a 36 foot yacht from Belfast to Largs Boatyard (near Glasgow) for maintenance. Delayed by a day, a Force 7 forecast for the 9th (33 mph winds) turned into a Force 9 (Strong Gale - 50 mph winds) halfway across the Irish Sea, most unpleasant.

As some of the group head off to a long distance, multi day, walk along the Yorkshire Wolds Way our programme will continue on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month.

KINGSLEY BOOK CLUB



The Kingsley Book Club met in April to discuss our thoughts on Trust' by Hernan Diaz.

Trust is a collection of four manuscripts at different stages of completion, and they tell different versions of the story of a Wall Street businessman and his wife in the years leading up to the Great Depression. In "Bonds" (ostensibly a bestselling novel authored by one Harold Vanner), a monkish mogul manages to make a massive windfall during the 1929 stock market crash, while his wife tragically succumbs to mental illness far away in Switzerland. "My Life" is the partial autobiography of Andrew Bevel, clearly the model for the tycoon in "Bonds", strewn with half-finished chapters and paragraph outlines. The first few pages of "Futures", the scribbled diaries of Andrew's wife, Mildred, have been randomly ripped out. The Bevels' competing narratives are mediated by a long postmortem memoir, written by Ida Partenza, once the gullible ghostwriter of Andrew's book.

A very American book - in some ways, too American, with all its brashness and overpowering capitalism. It was very difficult to feel any empathy with any of the characters: the greedy businessman who kept telling us their actions were 'for the good of the people' whilst making a killing on the stock market; while his wife concentrated her 'philanthropy' to the elitist arts and libraries. Any sympathy for the 'poor' socially-awkward wife who died in a Swiss sanatorium was lost when you start to see her role in causing the Great Depression of 1929.

The book asks you to look at the story from four different views - which one can we trust? Was the whole book corrupt? It included a number of popular subjects: 'the oppression of women', 'fake news', 'man bashing'; was this to get the Pulitzer prize? Are all writers, fiction and non fiction, corrupted by American capitalism?

Unfortunately all this intrigue and wheeler dealing did not make an exciting read. Some area's were very long winded to the point of boring and many unanswered questions we all scored this low giving it a average of just 2.29 out of 5.

At our next meeting on the 2nd May we will be discussing 'In the time of the butterflies' by Julia Alvarez.
