Brian stated that the Planning office had come back with more questions, especially around the idea of a car park and possible Highways issues. The Allotment Society are asking the planning officer to visit the site to better discuss and understand the situation.

Stephen Lawson to amend his draft constitution that he based around the Transition Movement and EST etc. He asked everybody at the meeting to consider and suggest objectives for KTI so they can be included.

### **General**

SL suggested renting chickens to people so they can try keeping chickens for a couple of weeks (to accompany an article on the subject?) but give them back at the end if they don't like it/can't cope.

SS to ask Heather from EST to put her statistics on the insulation of the village into money terms so people can see how it hits their pockets more easily.
