## **Kingsley Gardening Club**

It might appear to the untrained eye that winter gardens have gone into hibernation along with the hedgehogs. But take a closer look. If you walk around the village you'll see that this is not so.

Shrubs seem to make the most impact in a winter garden with bulbs not too far behind, snowdrops being one of the first flowers to appear. Mahonias with racemes of yellow scented flowers continue to flower for many weeks. Another shrub, Skimmia japonica 'Rubella' has wonderful buds of deep maroon and is often grown with early flowering Viburnum Bodnantense 'Dawn' which is fragrant. A plant worth growing by the door for winter scent is Lonicera purpusii. The flowers are small but they don't half pack a punch on the perfume front. Something with a bit more drama is Hamamellis mollis or witch hazel, as it is known. Its erect leafless stems are covered in flame coloured spidery flowers wafting a subtle scent to passersby. When winter arrives, heathers finally come into their own. Clumps of Erica carnea have flowers ranging from white through to red.

By January, most of the red berries will have been gobbled up by the birds but some do remain untouched, along with the pink, yellow and white berries of the more choice Sorbus trees. Cornus, or dogwood, is grown for its winter coloured stems. The fiery colours of yellow, orange or red look stunning given the right backdrop.

I hope I have whetted your appetite with just a few tasters of the colours which can be seen in winter gardens around Kingsley. To find out more about gardening, why not come along to the Kingsley Gardening Club on the second Monday of the month (except January). Our next meeting is on Euphorbias by the well known Don Witton (as seen on T.V.) on Monday 9th February 2009 at 8.00pm in the Community Centre where visitors are very welcome
