Wishing everyone a Happy and Prosperous New Year.




KINGSLEY CRICKET CLUB

After much hard work by club members and in particular Club Vice Chairman Adrian Burden the ECB have awarded the club a combined grant and loan in the region of £40,000, for the construction of a new three lane practice net facility at The Croft Cricket Ground in Kingsley.
- The Club has applied for, and obtained, planning consent for the necessary work. It is hoped that the new net practice facility will be constructed and ready for use before the start of the coming 2010 cricket season.
- Of course, the Cricket Club will have to raise its own financial contribution to the cost of the work on the new nets, and much hard work is going to be needed with fund raising activities over the coming year. The Club would like to thank all those individuals and businesses in the village and locality who have supported the Club over recent years and very much hope that that support will continue in this new and exciting development which will provide safe practice facilities to the ever expanding junior sections of the Club as well as for Senior players.

All through the award I have met and talked to many amazing people including my colleagues on the expeditions. They gave me many memories that I shall never forget. I fully encourage anyone who wants the time of their life to try the Duke of Edinburgh's award.

Kingsley Garden Club

It's mid December and in my garden there are still roses in full bloom! Even some of the late flowering Clematis are still bearing a few, admittedly smaller, flowers and the January/February flowering shrubs and other plants have also started to show a few flowers, as have some of the mid-year flowerers, such as Weigela and Viburnum.

Indeed a most unusual year again! The first light frosts will no doubt put paid to this unusual state of affairs, so that I can start to organise next year's gardening activities. The last of the summer and autumn vegetables have been harvested and stored where appropriate, the soft-fruits pruned, the perennials cut back and prepared for the harder weather yet to come. The lawns have had their last cut of the season only a few weeks ago, plus their winter dressing and application of moss killer, spiked and aerated, leaves from the wood swept up and put into a wire netting pen to compost for next year, so hopefully, that's the majority of "must do jobs" done before the traditionally colder months of January and February set in and the gardening becomes mainly of the "fireside" kind – planning for next year.

Don't forget to plan ahead – especially if you grow your own vegetables and fruit, and you own annuals or replacement perennials, as I do – get or order your seeds in plenty of time (it's amazing how quickly your "favourite" varieties of seeds disappear from the garden centres once Christmas is over!). Maybe you save your own seeds? If you do, bag them in old fashioned paper bags, keep them in a cool, dry place, and don't forget to inspect them from time to time, to make sure they don't go mouldy!

Not much else to remind you about, as I'm sure you're further ahead than I am! Hopefully you will all have a peaceful and prosperous New Year (even that's as doubtful as the weather these days!). Don't forget that the garden Club has no meeting in January, and that the next meeting is on February 8th, when the topic will be "Gardener's Question Time", presented by Steve Roberts of Morrey's Nursery, Kelsall.
