



Kingsley Parish Plan Moving from Ideas into Action!

Finally, the Parish Survey is complete and the results will be published by the end of January. Now that we know what residents of the village want, it is time to organise some working groups to bring some of these ideas into reality.

From the survey results, the fact that more than 80% of people said that they rated "Living in Kingsley" as 8 out of 10 or better was the best thing we heard. Ideas for developments that had the most support were:

- 1. To do something about parking, especially in the centre of the village
- 2. To make the village look more attractive by planting up some of our verges
- 3. To start a film club in the village
- 4. To improve the footpath network and do something about the "missing pavements".

It is now time to move on to implementation. That means we need to form small working groups who want to work on each of these areas. They will be supported by the Parish Council, and Cheshire Community Action will provide guidance on how to access funding and officials in Cheshire West to help progress the work.

Some volunteers have come forward, and work is about to start. If you are interested in joining any of the planned working groups, why not come to the first planning meeting at **7.30 on January 30th 2012** at the Community Centre? It will be a real chance to actively participate in the development of the village – and maybe help to improve our "Living in Kingsley" score to 10.


