

Ice Queen brings panto cool to Kingsley



Kingsley Players will be transforming the village community centre into a palace of ice for their traditional January panto.

The theatre group is staging the 'The Ice Queen and the Enchanted Mirror', another magical pantomime written by Norley's talented musician and playwright William Arnold Ashbrook.

Punk blackbirds, a chorus of slaves and an Ice Queen with a frozen heart will be casting the traditional panto spell at Kingsley Community Centre on Wednesday 22^{nd} – Saturday 25^{th} January at 7.30pm. There will also be a Saturday matinee starting at 2.30pm.

Director Mary Lightfoot explained: "We have a fantastic cast of more than 30 adults, teenagers and children, superb costumes, catchy songs and great dance routines.

"It is a traditional panto-style story about an ice queen who has a heart of ice and rules her kingdom with a rod of iron. On seeing her reflection in a witch's mirror, she is duped into thinking she's a great beauty. The mirror shatters into a million pieces which spread far and wide. A piece lands in the eye of a young boy Tom and, as the sages foretell, anyone who catches a shard in his eye will be compelled to kill the Ice Queen.

"It's a heart-warming tale guaranteed to dispel the worst chills of January," she said.



Tour de France 2014 Sat 5th and Sun 6th July - Yorkshire

The continued growth in cycling is something we should all welcome. It's fun, low cost, keeps you out of the doctors surgery, (if you don't fall off,) and helps keep the weight down. As this should be going out early in 2014 then perhaps it'll be the prod needed to get active and shed a few Christmas pounds too!

With 137000 new riders in the last 12 months the sport has grown immensely and it's pinnacle, the Tour de France can be seen on our shores next year.

Kingsley has a number of very active cycling groups, with loose connections to each other, ours (Kingsley Velo Club) is organising a trip to see the first two stages of the race next year and we'd welcome any local riders who want to witness the spectacle to join us.

The initial plan is:-

- 1 We drive part way and then ride to a suitable point on the course to see the peleton fly past. Accommodation will be difficult /expensive, so the plan is to come back after the race passes
- 2 We aim for a section on a particularly hilly bit,
- a on day 1 this means leaving after breakfast and heading up the M6 to Hawes and parking up then riding onto the circuit stopping somewhere in the Kettlewell / Aysgarth area \sim 20 mile ride. This being subject to the timing of road closures etc
- b on day 2 this means leaving a little later and heading for either Hebden Bridge or Holmfirth, the latter catching the race across Holme Moss, which we think will be one of the toughest and most popular spots to view at, again probable need to ride 15-20 miles so that we can park and get access to the route.

We think that there may be big screen points set up so we can track the stage, if any of these are convenient for us we may adjust the above plan a bit.



HISTORY OF ST JOHN'S SCHOOL, KINGSLEY

The original building of the present St John's School was built in 1846, when it was called the National School. It was expected by the parishoners to be an undenominational school, so that Anglicans and non-conformists together contributed towards the cost.

However, the lord of the manor, Mr Smith Barry, gave the land on which the school was built to the Church of England and therefore the property came under the ownership of those who owned the land, the Church of England, so the Vicar had the right of entry into the school and the right to give religious instruction.

The first headmaster of the National School was name Taylor, whose assistants were his wife and a Miss Dally. Since then there have been over a dozen headmasters of the school. One of the earlier heads, a Mr Cole, believed that there was great educational value in the rise of the cane. He practised this belief but all the same, he was a good and popular head..

All the earlier headmasters lived in the school house, until a Mr Thompson was given permission to live off the school premises. Then all following heads decided not to live in the school house. One very long serving headmaster, Mr A E Williams, lived as far away as Hoole in Chester.

The original accommodation of the National School was sufficient for the children of Kingsley and Newton, there being room for 150 boys and girls.
