#### KINGSLEY PLAYING FIELD PATH AND OUTDOOR GYM

Kingsley Parish Council is delighted to report that we have been successful in our bids for funding to build a new path and outdoor gym at the playing field, off Westbrook Road.

Thank you to all the residents who participated in the consultation and to the local organisations who sent in letters of support. Your enthusiasm for the project undoubtedly helped us to secure almost  $\pm 60,000$  of grants.

The largest funder, WREN's FCC Community Action Fund, has given us a very generous £50,000 towards the project. The multi-use path which will run around the perimeter of the field should be available by May/June 2016 for all sorts of healthy activities including cycling, running, dog walking and roller skating. Lottery funder, Awards for All, contributed £4,399 towards the outdoor gym, which will include a cross trainer, treadmill and exercise bike. We also had contributions from CW&C Councillor Ralph Oultram and from local business, Forresters, who have kindly donated 2 picnic tables.

We expect the work to begin sometime after the Easter holidays and we hope to host a mini-carnival and launch event when the project is completed. Our consultants, Groundwork, and a few representatives from the Parish Council will be at the next KTI market on 19 March to answer any questions you have about the project and detailed designs will be on display.

We hope that you will enjoy these new facilities for many years to come and thank you again for all your support in helping us to raise this money.

The consensus was that the story was absorbing although we all felt that the end let it down a bit. Our discussion led to some time being spent on inventing a new ending, which we were much happier with!

#### Not already enjoying local shows? You really ought to get out more.

In January, there is a wide selection of productions within easy reach of the village for both young and old. The star attraction has to be the ambitious production of *Oliver* to be presented by Kingsley Players with their experienced director *Lynn Pegler* (*The Wizard of Oz*). The cast includes award winning actor *Phil Mitchell* (Cheshire Theatre Guild Best Supporting Actor for the waiters in (*Time of My Life*) as Bill Sykes, and Kingsley favourite *Neil Silcock* (*Scrooge*) as Fagin. A cast of about 50 so I expect tickets will be scarce. Don't miss the chance to see what promises to be a brilliant musical, performing Wednesday 27th to Saturday 30th and the box office is now open at <a href="http://www.kingsleyplayers.co.uk/boxoffice.php">http://www.kingsleyplayers.co.uk/boxoffice.php</a>

Of pantomimes, if you are quick you might be able to catch **Snow White** at Altrincham Garrick until 3rd and professional pantomimes are **Peter Pan** at The Grange, Hartford with Nikki Grahame and Christopher Maloney until 2nd and at the Brindley, Runcorn, **Aladdin** starring Dean Gaffney which finishes on 10th.

As a panto alternative you should look at Harlequin Juniors' *Jungle Book* at Harlequin Theatre, Northwich. The famous story by Rudyard Kipling has been adapted by Kingsley Players own talented *Ellie Hamer* (*Time of My Life*) who adapted *Sleeping Beauty* for this group earlier in the year. Performing on 23rd and 24th, tickets online http://www.harlequinplayers.com/jungle-book. At The Lyceum, Crewe ion 11th & 12th there will be a professional production of the *Gruffalo's Child* by Tall Stories Theatre Company.

For those who prefer more grownup theatre, The Altrincham Garrick are presenting *The Price* by Arthur Miller from 11th to 16. *The Price* of the title is the legacy of the past and is billed as one of the most entertaining plays that Miller has written. This is followed by *The Rise and Fall of Little Voice* by Jim Cartwright from 18th to 23rd. This is a wonderful heartwarming Northern comedy play about a shy reclusive girl with hidden talent. You may recall the brilliant film with Michael Caine and Jane Horrocks. At Chester Little Theatre, Chester Theatre Club is presenting *Passion Play* by Peter Nichols from 16th to 23rd. *Passion Play* was premiered in 1981, winning The Evening Standard Award for Best Play, and has had successful revivals since, most recently in 2013 with a cast that starred Zoë Wanamaker, Owen Teale and Samantha Bond. It has been described as a modern classic and "hard, brilliant and painful ... Adult in the only true sense of the word". It combines technical virtuosity with coruscating dialogue and all too human, deeply believable characters.

Look out for productions starting at the beginning of February, with Hindle Wakes starting on 1st February at Altrincham Garrick and from 5th Nantwich Little Theatre has Playhouse Creatures. If you are at all interested in the latter you should register with Nantwich http://www.nantwichplayers.com/ as soon as possible. At the time of writing the box office opening date has not been announced but be aware that at this theatre, most if not all of the tickets are sold on the opening day. Also if you have not yet seen Kingsley Players much celebrated touring show, Allo Allo, there are 4 chances to see it in February (and book early as these shows guickly sell out) and details are at http://www.kingsleyplayers.co.uk/productions/allo-allo/ Thank you for those of you who took the trouble to forward feedback about the December shows you have seen. Frodsham Players Seasons Greetings, was a cracking play that was so well performed. At Harlequins they ventured into thriller territory with Aurelia and again this experienced company skillfully portrayed this murderous thriller with more twists than any corkscrew, right to the dramatic and surprising finale.

#### **Kingsley Walking Group**



There was a 5 mile walk on 25 November from the Hazel Pear to Pickerings Lock via Acton Viaduct, carefully avoiding waterlogged paths on our return route. 19 of us enjoyed the walk followed by a good pub lunch.

The traditional Christmas walk and lunch were held on 8 December. Starting from Frodsham Golf Club we took a 5 mile walk along the length of Frodsham Hill, via Middle Walk, pausing by the ancient settlement at Woodhouse Hill, before returning via the Shepherds Houses. We were once again blessed with fine weather apart from a very light shower towards the end. There followed a good lunch at the Club House. 20 people made the walk and 25 enjoyed the lunch!

## Peace Garden

If you are out and about in Kingsley village for a peaceful walk, stop by to see the new Kingsley St John's peace garden at the front of school.

The school Chair of Governors, Kira Fayle commissioned a local company to create 5 wooden planters. She then handpicked suitable plants to fill them. The completed garden planters are displayed alongside the school's ceramic poppy. This was bought from the Tower of London display commemorating the 100th anniversary of the first world war. All of the poppies that made up the installation were sold, raising millions of pounds which were shared equally amongst six service charities.

To finish the garden the school has created 2 wooden plagues.

The first quoting Matthew 5:9 bible passage.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God."

The other plague shares the start of the school prayer.

"This is our school, let peace dwell here."

The single plant at the front of the garden is named Paris and the children shared prayers for Paris and hope for peace throughout the world. You are invited to reiterate those prayers and hopes as you pass by.

## Kingsley Parish Council Meeting Update - 15<sup>th</sup> December 2015

Budget proposals for 2016-17 were discussed. The final decision will be made at the next meeting.

After an enormous amount of effort put in by Councillor Jones, the funding application for £50, 000 for the playing field enhancements from WREN has been approved. Cheshire West and Chester Council (CWaC) offered a photo opportunity for the Councillors due the application's success.

Work on the enhancements to the car parking around the Community Centre are still ongoing. Further detailed plans are to be drawn up and high level costs acquired to enable to decision to be made.

Funding for KU17's was approved for the this year however a decision on the long term sustainability was discussed.

The Council has agreed to provide funds to support the local charity Medicare should they wish to organise a firework display on the playing field in 2016. It is anticipated that local businesses would be encouraged to support the event.

It was noted by Councillor Warbusrton that some minor repairs are required in the Cemetery.

Councillor Moores is again reviewing the options around car parking near the Co-op, and the area on Hollow Lane between Scotlands Lane and Town Well without a footpath.

The Christmas tree and lights were successfully installed, and the lights switch on at The Brow was well attended.

It was agreed to review the Publication Scheme and Data processing and any implication surrounding these. Councillors Billows and Fletcher will report at the next meeting.

The tree replacement on the verges on and around The Cross and Top Road is approved, Councillor Cliff to progress.

The Parish Clerk, Doreen Woods, attended her final meeting and the Councillors would like to thank her for all her hard work and wish her a long a relaxing retirement.

The new clerk, Jo Preston, will take over from January 2016 – welcome Jo.
