This is the first time in 8 years that she's been away at this time. We all owe her a huge thank-you for the work that she does, quietly and without fuss.

Looking back over the last 12 months, Kingsley has been a busy place. The WI and Gardening clubs have offered a regular and wide ranging programme of events, the bookclub has read books of all types and the Youth Group has provided weekly activities for younger members. Kingsley Players have entertained us with 4 regular productions as well as two productions by the newly formed youth theatre. The scouts, guides, cubs and brownies continue to thrive and Cricket Club offers coaching to a huge number of young people. They also put on a well attended beer festival again this year. Kingsley's walking group has wandered far and wide, covering about 200 miles this year.

2017 was a big year for the Kingsley and Newton Village Institute (KNVI). They have had a major programme of improvements and updates and the number of people using the Institute has grown, including an active tennis group. Terry and Ciaran took the Red Bull by the horns and have turned it into a thriving village pub providing a friendly meeting place for all sections of the community.

As ever, the churches offer a variety of events and ongoing activities from soup lunches to coffee mornings. When is comes to coffee mornings, the Macmillan coffee morning was a star, raising a magnificent £2050.

Sadly, we said goodbye to the Transition Group and to Kingsley Travel. Many people in the village and beyond will miss them. The Horseshoe pub is gone, shortly to be transformed into a bigger and better Coop. We were also pleased to welcome the mid Cheshire 5K run to Kingsley again. It was great to see so many people turn out to see them.

All this has been reported in the Kingsley News, a community asset created by volunteers every month except August for well over 30 years. As well as Elizabeth's work, thanks are due to Bert Brooker (until he moved to Cornwall), John Woulds and Chris Goy who print the magazine and an army of collators and distributors who make sure every household gets their magazine through their letterbox for free each month.

Kingsley Bookworms Next meeting 11th January 2018 at the Hurst Chapel

At our last meeting of 2017 we talked about "The Hare with the Amber Eyes" by Edmund due Waal. This is a family memoir starting in the 1870s and charts the progress of a very rich Jewish family in Europe. At the heart of the book are 264 Japanese netsuke which are tiny carvings of animals, plants and people.

While many of us thought that the book was slow to get started, we loved the language and we all learnt a lot of interesting history including about the war in Austria and its effect on the Jewish people. We were particularly intrigued to learn about "salon culture" in Europe.

The book scored an a average of 4 out of 5, one of our highest scores.

In January we will be talking about "Restoration" by Rose Tremain and optionally the sequel "Merivel, a man of our time". Restoration tells the story of a 17th century physician, turned painter. The sequel, written 23 years later revisits this character.

After a lot of thought, we have decided to move our meetings to the Chapel in the Hurst. The main reason was that both the bookclub and the Red Bull have grown over the last 12 months and it's become difficult to find a big enough, quiet space to have a discussion. The Chapel is very close to the Red Bull and lets us keep an open membership because we have plenty of space. We are planning some outings to literary festivals over the next 12 months and we have a book list for the next 12 months.

<u>Higher Heyes Development</u> Following the approval by the Cheshire West and Chester Council's Planning Committee for the development of 15 affordable houses to be built at Higher Heyes there was much discussion at the December Council meeting. It was decided to set up a Working Group consisting of councillors and members of the parish in order to take legal advice from a solicitor.

Playing Field

Three new pieces of play equipment will be installed in the playing field, a zip wire, swing for older children and climbing frame during February 2018. The zip wire will be placed in the middle section of the field adjacent to the existing play area, away from neighbouring properties. The new rotor web (climbing frame) will replace the large springing unit on an existing area of blue wetpour and the springer unit will be moved onto the grass between the existing swinger unit and see saw. A new area of wetpour surfacing will be created for the new swings.

It is hoped that the Council will have their own website up and running early in 2018.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan.(NP)</u> There was a further meeting in November to discuss the NP and 3 new members of the public attended. John Heselwood reported on the workings of the Housing Needs Survey and how it may be of use when producing a NP, it is hoped the report would be available by the end of March 2018. It is fully paid for by Cheshire West and Chester Council. Richard Thresh of Cheshire Community Action attended and answered various questions put to him on the night. He will be offering assistance during the early stages of producing the NP.

<u>Town Farm Quarry.</u> Dr C Pownall produced a report on the large amount of material being taken to the Quarry. The last survey of the site was undertaken in 2015. Along with members of Crowton and Acton Bridge Parishes, Dr Pownall is trying to ascertain how much more material is planned for the Quarry. This quarry work means several heavy lorries are travelling within the parish most days.


