PHILIP (PHIL) ALDERMAN 1930 - 2019

The family of the late Phil Alderman would like to thank everyone for their kind thoughts, cards, and messages of condolence following his passing on 15th October 2019 in the Countess of Chester Hospital at the age of 89 years.

Phil was extremely proud of his Kingsley roots where he was born and lived for over 70 years. He was the son of Eddie and Kitty Alderman who owned the village grocery store and brother to Murray, who still lives locally. He was married to Muriel (who passed away suddenly 36 years ago) and together they took over the shop on his father's retirement. He worked on Ravenscroft's and Harvey's farm s before moving to Marley Tiles and then BICC, Helsby.

He involved himself in village activities, playing football and cricket in his younger days as well as being a member of the Church Lads Brigade, and later enjoyed bowling at the Institute and played darts and dominoes for local teams. He was a trustee of the Village Institute, Chair of the Parish Council and supported fundraising for many local causes including helping raise money for the building of the village Community Centre.

The funeral took place at Kingsley Church followed by burial in Kingsley Cemetery and refreshments at the Village Institute. Generous donations will be passed to the British Heart Foundation.

A huge thanks from the family – he will be missed.




A large enthusiastic cast, golden eggs, giant beanstalks and a cornucopia of corny jokes are guaranteed to wipe away the winter blues.

Kingsley Garden Club - January 2020

Happy New Year!! Well as you read this, the turkey will be on its third or fourth reincarnation, the Christmas tree will have dropped all over the carpet and you will be looking forward to a new year.

Before we look forward, there was a sterling effort by four members (Linda, Richard, Marian, Gail) of Kingsley Garden Club on Saturday 7th December when they planted two of the sacks of daffodil bulbs donated by our Borough Councillor on just one small section of the playing field (they don't go very far), the third sack was used to supply bulbs to KNVI verges and St John's School Playing field. Due to an objection by one Kingsley resident no bulbs were planted in or around Guest Slack.

Looking back to 2019; following our AGM in May we reluctantly decided to increase the cost of membership rather than close down the club due to lack of funds. The result since the start of the 2019/20 season in September has been to increase our full membership, increase the number of people attending the meetings with only a handful paying visitor rate. We have implemented a "swaps" table which has taken off and is bringing additional revenue by the voluntary donation to the club for each item swapped.

We are looking forward to 2020/21 season (I know we have only just got used to the idea of 2020) but we need to plan and book speakers well in advance. If anyone has any ideas, or, wants to join the committee please make yourself known to a committee member. As we have stated previously we do NOT have a meeting in January; so the next meeting is Bob Worsley on Monday 10th February 2020, who is speaking on "A Story of Cyclamen, Hepaticas and Snowdrops", a true spring subject if ever there was one, to lift us out of the winter gloom towards the lengthening days.

Gardening Tips and Jobs to be done.....

- Prune your wisteria, cut back summer side shoots to 2 or 3 buds
- Prune your roses whilst they are still dormant, but not in frost. Cut back above an outward facing bud, cut out crossing branches and dead branches.
- Cut back dead stems on perennials but look out for any new growth.
- Tidy up hellebores removing any old or damaged leaves, look out for new growth.
- Remove any dead flowers on your winter pansies to keep them flowering.
- Prune apple, pear and blackcurrant, gooseberries
- Stay off your lawn and just sit down, relax and think of the spring to come!

Kingsley Walking Group - January 2020

The Kingsley Walking group is an informal walking group that has been meeting for many years. We organise two walks each month. A long walk is held on the SECOND Tuesday of the month and a short walk is held on the FOURTH Tuesday of the month. Generally long walks would be classified as "moderate" (a full day and 8-10 miles) and the short walks are leisurely (a half day and up to 5 miles) ending with an optional pub lunch.



Long walks usually start up to 90 minutes drive away from Kingsley. We meet at the Community Centre and organise lifts and car shares. We have a leader for every walk who checks for stiles, distance, closed paths etc in advance. Our favourite places are the Peak District, the Clwyds and the south Lakes. Our groups are between 8 and 15 people. Everyone is welcome.

December 2019 was a good month, allowing us to complete our Christmas walk without rain. Twenty two happy walkers were warmly welcomed by Ciaran at the Red Bull for a lovely lunch. This marked the end of a busy year of varied and interesting walks.

Our **long walk on January 14th** will be to the Macclesfield area and has been planned to avoid the worst of the mud. Meet at the Community Centre ready to *leave at 9.30* and bring lunch. The **short walk will be on Tuesday 28th of January**, leaving the Community Centre at 9.30.

At our last meeting we talked about "Wuthering Heights" by Emily Bronte. It was our "classic novel" for 2019. I'm pleased to say that I wasn't the only person who had not read the book and was surprised by how unpleasant Heathcliffe was. A few of us had been expecting a tortured soul who was transformed by love. We were sadly disillusioned. Some people found the style of the book – using two narrators a bit difficult. Our discussion included consideration of how a young, unmarried woman in the early 1800s had gathered the experience to write a book about love and vengeance. We scored the book just over 3 out of 5.

In January we will be talking about "Becoming" by Michelle Obama. This is a memoir described by the author as a deeply personal experience. The book talks about her roots and how she found her voice, as well as her time in the White House, her public health campaign, and her role as a mother.

Our next two books are:

February – "The Incredible Pilgrimage of Harold Fry" by Rachel Joyce (for those that have already read this, "The Music Shop" by Rachel Joyce).

March – "Rebecca" by Daphne du Maurier

We will be looking at our wish list and taking suggestions for future titles during our January meeting. As well as choosing books for 2020, we will be deciding on some outings for the year. Previous events have been to literary festivals and events held at public libraries. We also have an annual group outing to the Grosvenor Park theatre to see one of the Shakespeare plays and enjoy a picnic. So far we have always managed to have great weather for these.
