RAISING FUNDS FOR BRITISH HEART FOUNDATION

Those of you that know me well will know that the Britsh Heart Foundation is a charity that means everything to us as a family. My son, Jake, was born with a congenital heart condition and he underwent open heart surgery when he was just 5 days old.

British Hear

We had no idea that Jake had a congenital heart condition until he was sent to hospital by our midwife who, after a routine check, had spotted that Jake was pale and was concerned he was anaemic (Iona - we owe you everything!). We arrived at the hospital for what we thought would be a routine visit, but within minutes, there was a 'crash' situation. We were told that Jake needed specialist care and was to be transferred to Alder Hey hospital - the situation was so serious that the Birkenhead Tunnel was shut and the ambulance transferring Jake to hospital was given a police escort straight to Alder Hey. This was a terrifying time for us all.

Jake was operated on the next day and the operation that was meant to take 4 hours actually took 15 hours due to complications. Having arrived at the hospital on the 20th December, we didnt leave at all until New Year's Day spending our days by Jake's bedside. He had two designated nurses and countless machines hooked up to him, constantly monitoring his condition. Jake had a further operation, on Christmas Day, to close his chest up (which is left open after open heart surgery). After 11 agonising days in ICU, HDU and finally the cardiac ward, we were able to take Jake home.

Jake is now 16, fit and healthy - he's a black belt in karate, an avid badminton player and a typical teenager. He is a cardiac outpatient at Alder Hey Children's Hospital in Liverpool, where he has annual check-ups. Jake's condition (Transposition of the Greater Arteries - TGA) is rare and, as such, his story was selected by the British Heart Foundation as part of the Christmas fundraising and awareness campaign back in 2008. His story was also featured in local and National press in both newspapers and TV where it featured on Granada News.

40 or so years ago, Jake's condition would have been fatal, however, developments and advancements in both medicine and medical research mean that babies born with TGA can now go on to become fit and healthy adults. Much of this research has been funded by the British Heart Foundation. It is for this reason that myself and my family will be forever indebted to the British Heart Foundation charity.

I ran the London Marathon in April 2023, intending it to be my one and only attempt at the iconic race, however, when I finished, Jake asked me to run again this year and asked me if I'd run and raise money for the British Heart Foundation - how could I say no?!

Running the London Marathon for charity on the 21st April 2024, I feel, is an amazing opportunity for me to give something back to the British Heart Foundation in acknowledgement for what they have facilitated for my family. Any donation you could give, no matter how small, would mean the world to us all, but especially to Jake.

<u>i</u>travel is a public transport service which offers on-demand pre-bookable travel. There is no fixed route or timetable.

Where can I use itravel?

• itravel serves key towns, villages and railway stations incorporating Kingsley, Frodsham, Sutton Weaver, Acton Bridge, Cuddington, Delamere, Elton and Helsby.

<u>Availability</u>

• itravel operates from 7am to 7pm on Mondays to Fridays (no service, weekends or bank holidays)

<u>Booking</u>

- via the itravel app: download from Apple App Store or Google Play store
- By phone: 0330 678 1545
- online: https://bookings.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/login
- You can book an itravel trip up to one hour before you wish to travel (depending on availability) and up to 30 days in advance. You are recommended to book in advance where possible to avoid disappointment.
- If using the itravel app, you will be able to track the minibus from half an hour before your pick-up time. You will then have real-time updates of the vehicle's progress. You will also receive notifications via the app to let you know when your vehicle is nearby. Please ensure push notifications have been enabled for the itravel app.
- If you have booked by the website or by the call centre, you will receive text notifications of the vehicles' progress.
- itravel will endeavour to always get you on the move when you need them. If it is not possible to meet your request, they will offer you a choice of alternative times.
- You can cancel your journey free of charge up to 30 minutes before your pick up time.

Accessibility

- itravel minibuses are accessible, and can accommodate one wheelchair.
- You can take a pushchair on the bus, but you may need to fold it if the bus is busy so as to keep the aisle of the bus clear for safety reasons.

How much does it cost?

- Introductory fare £2 single journey within the designated zone (rising to £2.50 from 1st November)
- Half fare for young people up to the age of 19.
- English National Concessionary pass holders travel free.





Between November 26 - December 4 it's National Tree Week and the Parish Council has been investigating how to increase Kingsley's tree canopy to make our green spaces more environmentally friendly.

Orchards provide local harvests for everyone on their doorstep and sadly have been in national decline with 60% lost since the 1950s, and a staggering 75% lost in the North West. We all know that trees are a great way to combat pollution, reduce noise, reduce flooding risks and provide shelter to wildlife. However, orchards are also important for providing locally grown food, which in turn helps to reduce food miles, and support our vital ecosystems. It can be difficult for newly planted saplings to establish. So, we need your help!

CAF are continuing the Warm Homes and Thermal Cameras campaign with two further meetings:

- Tuesday 9th January at 7pm at Helsby Community Sports Centre.
- Tuesday 6th February at 7pm at Frodsham Community Centre.

Most British Homes have poor insulation and air leakage and use more energy to heat than they should, this wastes both carbon and money effecting the Climate Emergency and our pockets.

These free meetings give a range of ways for homeowners to reduce energy loss and save money from free actions, through medium cost modifications to major retrofit schemes. There is also demonstration of use of the thermal camera to find cold spots and heat leakage and CAF have a thermal camera to loan.
