February always reminds me of a visit to Tatton Park gardens many years ago, soon after we had moved to Kingsley. I bought a small pot of *buddleia davidii*. As I paid, the elderly gardener serving said ".. always remember to cut your *buddleia* back in February . . ".

Over the years the plant has thrived, growing to over ten feet tall but each February we remember to cut it back to just above the lowest shoots.

Already snowdrops are blooming and crocuses are starting to appear. Several gardens locally, including Ness and Rhode Hall have snowdrop walks where many varieties carpet large areas of the gardens.

Many gardeners in Kingsley will have started to prepare for the **Kingsley Garden Trail 2008**. This year will be a great time to visit gardens in Cheshire as it is Cheshire Year of the Garden 2008, linking in with Liverpool Capital of Culture.

CELEBRATION FOR KINGSLEY SCOUTS



Scouts in Kingsley and Newton are celebrating the arrival of the 'missing link' to their meeting hut.

A long-awaited new structure linking the two existing buildings used by local Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Brownies and Guides was officially unveiled by John Frodsham - NW Cheshire

District Commissioner - at a special opening event on Tuesday, 22nd January, at 1st Newton & Kingsley Scout hut.

The opening marks the completion of ongoing renovations to the aging buildings - made possible by the fundraising activities of parents and group supporters, as well as donations from local businesses, the Big Lottery Awards for All, Vale Royal's, Rural Delivery Programme, Frodsham Forward, Frodsham Round Table, Cheshire Police, The Disability Resource Exchange and Stuart Begg Architect all contributed funds and advice to the £10,000 project.

Scouter in Charge, Alison Storey said "We recently updated the meeting hut by adding a new portacabin, but needed a corridor to link the existing building with the new one. We raised £10,000 to build the new link and thanks to help from parents and local trades people managed to provide this great new facility. This means we can provide safe and comfortable facilities for all our Scouts."

Many Scouts, their families and local people attended the opening event. More than 60 local boys aged between 6-14 attend 1st Newton and Kingsley Scout group, enjoying a range of activities provided by the volunteer helpers, including practical skills, camps and community awareness.

WHO ARE THE BRICK CHILDREN?

The Brick Children School at Tikathali, Nepal was established in 2001. The School is a UK charity funded by donations and Rotary International grants. Its President was up to quite recently Carol Vorderman. It is managed in Nepal by a board representing the Rotary Club, the Red Cross, the Village Development Committee and the school staff and parents.

The school gives 150 children, from poor illiterate families in the hill villages of the Himalayas, an education, food and water, medical checks and school uniforms. Aged 5-14 years, they are taught essential subjects in preparation for Nepalese Government assessment. All this happens in the children's limited breaks from work.

At certain seasons the children come down into the Kathmandu valley to produce bricks by hand. Working conditions are primitive. They are expected to do heavy work making the bricks and taking them on hods to the firing kilns. They live in temporary huts with no power, sanitation or water supply,
