Kingsley, Acton Bridge, Crowton, Norley Revisited By Tom Wright & R.M.Bevan

A nostalgic ramble around the lanes and byeways of Kingsley, Acton Bridge, Crowton and Norley, with photographs from the Tom Wright collection and from other contributors, notably including Brian Moores, of Kingsley.

The photographs, with supporting text, are superb and the cover illustration, of Kingsley Windmill at Crofton Lodge, is a collector's item in its own right.

All together the book contains over 170 photographs, of long forgotten places and faces... a rare treat for anyone who knows and enjoys this lovely corner of Cheshire.

Tom Wright, born in Norley and now in his eighties, has spent much of his life collecting material relating to the district and his previous book "Three Parishes", covering Norley, Delamere and Oakmere, was immensely popular. Co-author, Mark Bevan, a former editor of the Northwich Guardian, has been writing and publishing local books for over twenty years.





Kingsley Gardening Club – ideas for March

I have read in the paper that a very hard winter as we have experienced brings forth a beautiful spring! Let's hope by now the spring flowers are showing us colour and a taste of what is to come in the garden.

Maybe you have been thinking that you will grow some things for yourself this year. A few packets of seeds can give lettuce, cucumber and tomatoes in abundance. It is also fun to grow runner beans and courgettes in pots. A recent gardening club speaker suggested buying grow bags and standing them vertically and growing potatoes in them. They will need to be fed and watered, but what a delight to have fresh potatoes and salad freshly grown and direct to the table. Plants can be bought at garden centres so don't even have to be grown from seed.

The middle of February is usually recommended for chitting seed potatoes. This means placing tubers on a tray with the part of the potato showing small buds (eyes) uppermost in a frost free area in natural light. Strong chits or sprouts form over several weeks and this gives faster growth and possibly heavier crops once they are planted out. Seed trays, shallow boxes or empty egg cartons are ideal for the process. However, it is not essential to 'chit'.

If you are fond of eating rhubarb early on, it would be a good idea to have placed a pot over you rhubarb crown. Deprived of light, the plant won't be able to photosynthesise, meaning new shoots will be pale (and therefore sweeter) and also elongated as they strive to reach light. You don't have to buy a special forcing terracotta pot – an old dustbin does the job just as well.

Depending on your plans for the ornamental garden, you can be starting off your seeds in March. Sweet peas should be encouraged to develop long roots, so plant these in special sweet pea tubes or use the cardboard tubes from old toilet rolls or even trimmed kitchen roll centres.

The tiny plugs of annual flowers are now on sale in garden centres. They are much cheaper bought at this stage and can easily be potted on and then grown on, in a No 1 potting compost, to create good sturdy plants to go out in May after the frosts cease.

Why not try some unusual vegetables this year? Chinese artichokes have a crunchy texture and nutty flavour and are good in stir fires. You can even grow herbs like parsley, basil and coriander on a sunny windowsill – you don't need a garden!

Our next meeting will be on Monday March 9th and Nicola Reynolds will be speaking on 'Opening a garden in the Yellow Book Scheme.' This will take place in Kingsley Community Centre and begin at 8p.m. Visitors are always welcome!
