### KINGSLEY & NEWTON VILLAGE INSTITUTE (KNVI)

Great news!! The funding has now been raised to pay for the refurbishment of the two tennis courts at KNVI, with help secured principally from grants from Cheshire West & Chester Council's Rural Support Programme, Kingsley Parish Council, Frodsham and District Round Table, an anonymous donation, and Tesco's "Bags of Help" initiative – more on this below!

The target is for both courts to be resurfaced, relined and repainted, and for new fencing to be erected around both courts. One of the courts will also allow for disabled access.

We're hoping that both courts will be ready for play by early Summer.

Quite a few people have already expressed interest in joining the tennis section of KNVI, so if you are interested, don't delay – get in touch with Elizabeth Batey (phone 01928 788788, or email <u>embatey@msn.com</u>).

We are very grateful to all our funders, especially our support from Kingsley Parish Council and CW&CC.

Also, Tesco is providing a minimum grant of £8000 from its recently launched Bags of Help initiative (in conjunction with Groundwork) covering hundreds of regions across England and Wales. This grant will fund most of the costs of refurbishing one of our tennis courts.

#### The Tesco grant could be higher, with your support!

Bags of Help offers community groups and projects in each of Tesco's 390 regions across the UK a share of revenue generated from the five pence charge levied on single-use carrier bags. The scheme will see three community groups and projects in each of these regions awarded grants of £12,000, £10,000 and £8,000 – all raised from the 5p bag charge.

Our project is one of the three community groups in our local area and you now have the opportunity to vote in our local Tesco stores from 27 February until 6 March on who should receive the £12,000, £10,000 and £8,000 awards.

Please vote for our project to increase our grant from £8000 to £10000, or even £12000!!

#### Urban Trendz Theatre presents "In the Company of Women"

Ed Green, the Director of the hugely successful "Bite Sized Shakespeare" has set up a new theatre company which will be putting on contemporary drama across Cheshire and beyond. The first production will be at Davenham Theatre, home of the Davenham Players. The cast includes a few familiar Kingsley Players.

The show is called "In the Company of Women" : it is all about women and their lot in life, their struggles and fight for identity. It consists of three short plays.

"Medea" by Dario Fo & Franca Rame is based on the mythic story of Jason & Medea. (with Vanessa Duffy, Denise Barry, Sue Elliott, Andrea Scott and Jo Oultram).

"Rise & Shine" by Dario Fo & Franca Rame is about a factory worker with a child and sleeping partner trying to get ready for work in her crowded life. (stars Kelly Cowley)

"Where do little birds go" by Camilla Whitehill. This is a play about Lucy who gets caught up in 60s London as a teenager and is used by the Kray twins as a woman to "amuse" mad axeman Frank Mitchell while he is holed up in a London flat after being broken out of prison by the Krays. (starring Laura Elizabeth Bason).

#### **Kingsley Walking Group**



We had a 7.5 mile walk on 9 February, from Plumley, following the 'Plumley Rail Trail Route'. The terrain was mainly flat, across farmland and by several small woods. After heading south to Plumley Moor we turn northward to skirt the Royal Wood by Tabley Mere. Continuing, we crossed the Peover Eye trout stream and passed the moated Holford Hall built in 1620 for Mary Cholmondeley. We finally circled back via Trouthall Lane and Holly Tree Farm to the station car park. Conditions were wet under foot after recent heavy remain, but the weather remained dry until towards the end of the walk. !0 of us took part

Bright weather greeted the twenty seven walkers who assembled at the Boot Inn at Willington for the Short Walk on 24 February. We climbed through 'Little Switzerland' to reach King's Gate and followed a good dry path along the southern edge of Primrose Wood to arrive at Tirley Farm. We took the footpath along the west side of Tirley Garth, to 'The Willingtons', then west to join the Sandstone Trail, and north to Summertrees. Finally, we turned back to the south to Gooseberry Lane to return to the Boot. Just over 5 miles.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.


