<u>Members of the Public</u> One member of the public attended the meeting. Mr Adams of CAMRA gave a brief talk on Assets of Community Value.

<u>Police</u> CPSO Copczyk attended the meeting and wished to remind everyone that for any non urgent concerns regarding matters within the village please do not hesitate to ring the police on 101.

Planning Application 17/00198/OUT Orchard End Farm Depmore Lane Kingsley replacement dwelling. 17/00306/FUL Castle Farm Waterloo Lane Kingsley change of use of redundant barn to single residential use.17/00037/S73 Rose Cottage Norley Road Kingsley Variation of Condition 2 of planning permission 11/05340/FUL to allow changes to material and position of garage.

<u>Playing Field</u>. Treefellers Ltd will be carrying out necessary work on certain trees during the year. Ongoing work being carried out on the lights within the field.

<u>Cemetery.</u> A specified area within the Extension at the Cemetery is being planned for cremation plots. The Boardroom (the building inside the entrance to the cemetery) is to have a new floor and will be painted both inside and outside.

Kingsley Bookworms – Next meeting 2nd March 2017 at the Red Bull at 7.30

At our February meeting we talked about "Perfume: The Story of a Murderer" by Patrick Suskind. It is set in the 18th century and translated from German. As expected, the book generated a good discussion. We though that the book was well written, but the theme was along the lines of a Grimm's Fairy tale, very dark. The book was translated from German and everyone agreed that this had been very successful.

Because of the theme, we ended up having a number of votes to try to reflect the discussion. Most people were happy to have read the book and scored the "writing and impact" an average of just over 4 out of 5. We then scored the story which scored an average of 2.75 out of 5. It was a very interesting evening.

At this months' meeting we will be talking about "My Husband's Wife" by Jane Corry and the four Costa shortlisted books including the winner "Days without End" by Sebastian Barry. In the past we have been critical of some award winning books so we decided to see how our views compare with the judges. It promises to be an interesting evening.

Kingsley Walking Group

The February long walk was an 8 mile circuit of Tatton Park. The weather was good and although the park, at half term, was popular with families, there was plenty of space for the 11 of us to explore, with only deer and sheep for company. Lunch was taken at the picnic tables in the stable yard near the mansion.



The short walk was a 5 mile tour of the pretty village of Lymm. 19 of us started at the Barn Owl Inn, walking across fields and through Helsdale Wood, alongside the High School playing fields to St Peter's church and then past the Water Tower house. After walking around Lymm Dam, we returned through the village centre and along the Bridgewater Canal to the pub for lunch.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. 




