Kingsley Players record success at NODA Awards

Kingsley Players have enjoyed record success at the 2020 North West awards from NODA (National Operatic and Dramatic Association).

At a glittering awards dinner and ceremony at Knutsford's Mere Golf and Country Club, the group beat off stiff competition from other theatre groups to win four awards from an outstanding total of 14 nominations.

Lynn Pegler scooped Best Director of a Drama for the production of '*Peterloo*', which she wrote and directed last April. The premiere of her play about the Peterloo Massacre, which featured a talented cast of 16 actors, was also nominated for Best Drama and Best Staging.

Kingsley Youth Theatre, led by Jake Powell, notched up an incredible 11 nominations for two productions, '*Chatroom*' and '*James and the Giant Peach*'.

Jake won the award for Best Direction of a Youth Theatre Production and acting awards were won by Kate Burge and Ben Mather-Dodd, who received two nominations for leading male actor in both of the Youth Theatre's plays.

The hard-hitting social media play '*Chatroom*' was in the running for Best Youth Production and Teigan Withey, Matthew Betteridge, Eva Lemmy and Gemma Smith were nominated in various young actor categories.

Colin Smith, Kingsley Players chairman, said: "The NODA awards are a phenomenal achievement and a fantastic tribute to the whole team, both on stage and behind the scenes, who work so hard to bring our theatrical productions to life.

"For each show we transform Kingsley Community Centre into a theatre and although we may only perform in a village hall, audiences can have the assurance that we always strive to deliver productions of the highest quality."

Future shows include Alan Ayckbourn's popular bitter sweet comedy '*How the Other Half Loves*', directed by Malcolm Barker, on stage for four nights Wednesday 28 April – Saturday 2 May.

And later in May, the group celebrates Cheshire's most celebrated children's writer Lewis Carroll with a festival of two plays.

Thursday 21 – Saturday 23 May, Kingsley Players Youth Theatre will perform a stage adaptation of the traditional classic *Alice in Wonderland*, directed by Jake Powell.

This will be preceded for one night only on aturday 16 May, with the performance of a new play by Lynn Pegler 'Alice's Quest for Wonderland: Down the Rabbit Hole with Lewis Carroll' which explores the fact behind the fiction of the relationship between the enigmatic author and the real Alice.

CHESTER BASED COMMUNITY ORCHESTRA LOOKING TO GROW ITS MUSICAL FAMILY IN 2020

With the arrival of a new year and many people looking to take up the challenge of a new hobby, a Community Orchestra based near Chester is looking to recruit new members of all ages and all abilities to help swell its ranks in the run up to concert performances being staged in 2020. The Jan Modelski Community Orchestra, founded in 2001 by Conductor and Musical Director Jan Modelski is currently based in the village of Barrow near Chester and was set up with the aim of enabling musicians of all ages and abilities to participate in a performing amateur orchestra.

Rehearsals are relaxed and informal whilst at the same time ensuring that every musician becomes the best they can possibly be. This, in turn, ensures a high level of professionalism and develops the musical skills and experience of everyone taking part. He also strives to ensure that the repertoire of any of his orchestras is always varied and challenging. The atmosphere is friendly, informal and geared towards encouraging the best performances from its members and aiding their musical development. The orchestra has an "open admission" ethos - which means that there is no audition and no one is ever turned away, the only requirements are a basic ability to read music, a desire to play with other performers and a sense of humour."

Richard added "There are 3 separate orchestras; Introductory, Intermediate and the "Main" Orchestra, so there is sure to be an orchestra suitable to most playing abilities. The average attendance is between 60 and 70 players and a number of players participate in more than one Orchestra. All three Orchestras share the common goals of enjoyment, encouragement and development".

All three Orchestras perform two concerts each year. The Orchestras rehearse on Saturday mornings in term time at Barrow Village Hall with the Introductory and Intermediate Orchestras session starting at 9.15 am and the Main Orchestra at 11.10 am.

Kingsley Walking Group - March 2020

The Kingsley Walking group is an informal walking group that has been meeting for many years. We organise two walks each month. A long walk is held on the SECOND Tuesday of the month and a short walk is held on the FOURTH Tuesday of the month. Generally long walks would be classified as "moderate" (a full day and 8 – 10 miles) and the short walks are leisurely (a half day and up to 5 miles) ending with an optional pub lunch.

Long walks usually start up to 90 minutes drive away from Kingsley. We meet at the Community Centre and organise lifts and car shares. We have a leader for every walk who checks for stiles, distance, closed paths etc in advance. Our favourite places are the Peak District, the Clwyds and the south Lakes. Our groups are between 8 and 15 people. Everyone is welcome.

Our **long walk** in February was cancelled due to bad weather. This is the first year for a long time that we have had to postpone two walks due to weather. We're hoping that the worst is now behind us. We had a good short walk in January when we set off from the Ring O'Bells pub in Frodsham along the Sandstone Trail to Woodhouse Hill, Snidley Moor, Shepherds Cottages, across the fields (skirting the golf course) to Beacon Hill and back to the pub for lunch. We had good weather and good company.

The March long walk will be on March 10th, leaving the Community Centre at 9am. Bring lunch. The **short walk** will be on **Tuesday 24th March**, leaving the Community Centre at 9.30.

Bob is a member of The Alpine Garden Society and a grower of cyclamens, he has been on plant hunting trips looking for these amazing plants. Bob showed us magnificent show exhibits of this remarkable plant, and he brought along some of his home grown plants to buy. We had 27 members in attendance with three very welcome visitors on the night after Storm Ciara had struck, not a pleasant night, so thank you to everyone, including Bob, who braved the weather.

Our next talk is **Hardy Geraniums "The Good, the Bad and the Ugly"** to be given by **Sue Clarke on Monday 9th March 2020;** without doubt we all have a geranium in our gardens in some form or another, and possibly, at this moment on our window sills seeing the winter out. Remember we also have our very popular swaps table, which is going from strength to strength and your donations from this table, is helping the finances of the club.

Things to do in the garden in March....

- Protect any new green shoots from those pesky slugs
- Consider planting your early potatoes and onion sets
- If you have been shopping at the garden centre then don't forget to plant summer flowering bulbs.
- If you haven't done already, lift and divide over large clumps of perennials
- Top dress containers with some fresh compost your plants will love it.
- Apply feed to rose trees and shrubs to give them a boost after winter.
- Cut back Dog Wood (Cornus) to ensure lovely coloured winter stems.
- Prune rose bushes if you haven't done already
- And if you must, when your lawn is DRY, mow it with the blades set high.
- Apply a good lawn fertiliser later on in March to ensure good strong growth.
