How has it been to collaborate with the National Theatre?

It has been a little surreal!! As a youth theatre, we've grown from nothing over the past 6 years, so when this opportunity became available, we thought it is the next step to widen our reach. One of our highlights has to be meeting the writer with the cast and of course, the director's weekend at the National Theatre on South Bank.

Can you tell us a little bit about Variations?

Variations is a brand-new play. It looks at a young person and their mental health in a clever and entertaining way. There is something that everyone can take away from it and how to live in the present. Not to forget croissants, lots of croissants!

You're also performing this play at the Crewe Lyceum?

Yes! That's correct. We will be taking this production to Crewe Lyceum for a wider festival on the 25th April. Our cast have already visited the dressing rooms, been on a backstage tour and spotted the theatre ghosts. It's certainly a different venue, seating 677 compared to Kingsley Community Centre.

Why should we see Variations?

Our cast of 13 have been working tirelessly on this production and are keen to share it locally. Dutton Hydro Electric Scheme

Built in 1874, the Grade II-listed Dutton Locks on the River Weaver in Cheshire are still used by boats today, and are a popular destination for walkers and cyclists.

Going back as far as 2012, both Kingsley and Frodsham Transition Initiatives showed interest in the potential for development of a hydro system to generate power from the sluices near the locks, which form part of the river's flood control defences.

The Canal & River Trust has announced that a hydro scheme is now being constructed beside Dutton Sluices by Hydropol, a company which has extensive experience in the construction of hydro power plants worldwide. The scheme itself, which comprises a single Archimedes screw, is due to be complete by Spring 2022. The site is predicted to generate 900,000 KW hours per annum equivalent to the electricity requirement of approximately 150 average homes.

The land for the scheme at Dutton is leased to Hydropol, who will own and maintain the hydro scheme. Once completed, the construction site will be reinstated and a two -metre high fence will be built around the scheme as per the planning permission already granted.

The Canal & River Trust now has 11 hydro sites, with third parties using its waterways to generate approximately 22 megawatt hours per annum, equivalent to the demands of approximately 6,000 average homes.

Kingsley Parish Council March 2022

The Parish Council met in the Green Room of Kingsley Community Centre for the February meeting, and there was a single member of the public in attendance by Zoom.

The Parish Council welcomed a new Co-opted Councillor to our February meeting. Tim Vernon who is the school caretaker at Kingsley Community Primary School, Tim lives in the Parish of Kingsley and had decided after much thought to join the Council and we welcome him to our number. We still have five other vacancies, so if you have lived in Kingsley for 12 months or more, why not follow Tim and join the Parish Council, it is the only democratic way to have your say on the future of the village.

Cllr Hugo Deynem, our CWAC Ward Councillor, reported that Kingsley was on the list for the delivery of the new larger wheeled recycling bins between w/c 14th February and w/c 28th March 2022. An information pack will be issued to all residents and whilst this was due to be issued prior to the bins arrival, it is likely that the bins may arrive before the information pack. He also reminded residents of Kingsley that if you wish to have your Green waste (bin) collected, you will now have to register with Cheshire West & Cheshire and pay the £40 annual fee. Please go to Cheshire West and Chester Waste Recycling for more information on both of these issues. A link will be provided on the Parish Council website in due course.

We wish to remind residents of Kingsley that the Parish Council had previously agreed to provide a financial contribution to any formal village activity organised to celebrate Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee between the 2nd to 5th June 2022. Please submit your proposals to the Parish Council for consideration in the coming months.

There were 2 planning applications to consider this month and in both cases, the Parish Council agreed to submit a response to CWAC with no concerns.

The Parish Council has now agreed on the Contractors for the following; grass cutting of the Playing Field, cutting of selected access to Public Rights of Way (the actual PROW's are cut by CWAC twice a year) and grass cutting at the Cemetery. The relevant contractors will be advised in the coming weeks. The contract for the enhancement works across the village will be awarded at the March meeting.

The repairs to the Cemetery memorials damaged before Christmas, is still with the Council's Insurers who have now requested three competitive quotations for the works. These will be submitted to the insurers in the coming days and we hope the works to repair the memorials will start soon. The Council is also investigating quotations for the provision of CCTV cameras in the cemetery for security purposes. Once again we await the provision of three competitive quotations.


