TRANSITION VILLAGE INITIATIVE

On Tuesday 17th March I had the opportunity to speak with the Kingsley Parish council about the Transition village initiative to be launched on Friday 28th March at the Kingsley Community Spirit day. Council members expressed their support for the initiative.

The transition movement began in Devon 3 years ago. There are now 82 transition towns or villages in England; 152 worldwide. Transition towns near to us are Chester, West Kirby and South Liverpool.

The aim of the initiative is to develop local resilience in the face of peak oil, climate change and other global challenges. The movement seeks to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels and to encourage local action and projects, based on sustainability and in a spirit of optimism, to counter climate change. We have many excellent community groups in Kingsley and the purpose will be to network with those groups to build that local resilience.

To develop awareness of the transition village initiative, an initial meeting of films and discussion will take place at 7.30pm at the Kingsley Community Centre on Tuesday 28th April 2009 and all are most welcome.

MYRA KILLIP

One of Kingsley's oldest and well-loved residents celebrates her 90th birthday this April.

Myra Killip (born Eaton Lewis) was born in Hind Cottage, Top Road, and has lived there and next door in Eaton Lodge for most of her life. She went to school at St. John's, Kingsley, and when she left, she trained to be a nanny in Norley.

She met her husband, George, at the start of the Second World War. He was from the Isle of Man and was in the army. They married in 1941.

In 1965 Myra and George went to live and work on the Caribbean Island of St. Lucia. Myra soon became involved with the local women and was concerned by the fact that they had no productive work. She founded the St. Lucia Perfumes which proved to be very successful and provided employment for many women. It thrives to this day.

They returned to Kingsley after thirteen years away and Myra soon picked up the threads of village life. She started writing village news for the Chester Chronicle – following in her mother's footsteps. Myra's outgoing and friendly nature made her an ideal candidate for this task. Myra has always enjoyed writing and many of us have appreciated her works on village life. She was involved with The Red Cross, The Ockenden Venture, The Imperial Cancer Campaign – to mention but a few, which reflect her energy and compassion.

At the age of ninety Myra is a lady to admire. She is outward-looking and hospitable and fun to be with. She gives hope to those of us who have a few more years to go to reach her age. We would like to think that we will enjoy our lives with the enthusiasm and joy that Myra displays.

Congratulations to you, Myra, and here's to the next decade!

Kingsley Garden Club

I hope many of you reading this will have seen the Garden Club stand at the Community Centre on Kingsley Day and recognised what a good source of information for anything horticultural the Garden Club is. April is a very busy month for gardeners with the days lengthening and hopefully with warmer weather the soil is warming up. Putting fleece over an area before sowing or planting will speed the process up. Many vegetables such as broad beans, beetroot and leeks can be sown directly into ground this month but if you haven't the time or inclination to do this, many plants can now be bought at garden centres or through seed catalogue companies.

If you have a water butt in which the water has gone green you can buy a product from garden centres which will stop this happening. You add a small amount to the butt after draining it and continue doing this regularly. A small bottle will last through the summer months.

Our AGM is being held at 8pm on Mon 20th April in the Community Centre. We are having a quiz and garden swap so look out for garden items you no longer need such as plants or tools, bring them along and you may pick up something for your garden. This is our last meeting until September but the programme for the first three meetings is already arranged.

The club reopens on Mon 14th September and the first speaker is Derek Jones, a lecturer at Reaseheath College. He is going to give advice on 'Practical Vegetable Growing'. In October the speaker Hugh Beggs is giving a talk entitled 'Hedges around Edges' in which he will explain why our hedgerows are so important to wildlife and our countryside. We are fortunate to have for our November meeting Bob Brown who is a well known plantsman, nursery owner and plant collector. This will be the first 'Elaine Jones Memorial Lecture'. His talk has the title 'So many Plants So little Space' in which he will give advice on the best plants to choose.

So hopefully your appetite has been whetted to come along to the AGM and to join the Garden Club in September.




Dear Readers,
