

As we approach the end of the Easter term there is a lot to celebrate and share.

We have been busy on some artistic projects. Upper junior children spent two days with artist Jane Dixon working on a ceramic plaque for the entrance hall focusing on the Christian character of the school. Along with work from other schools, it will be on display later on in the summer term at Woodford Lodge Professional Centre. In addition, we welcomed a 2ft model Rhino into school. Each class is planning a range of Rhino mania activities including finding out about endangered Rhinos in the wild, and time sketching the model. The children individually have been submitting ideas for painting the Rhino and it will go on display in Chester along with lots of other Rhinos as part of a special event later on in the summer term.

The school has been working with local churches to focus on Easter. This includes our special Easter service in Church on 22nd March and a visit by year 5 children to an interactive music and drama event hosted by Frodsham main street chapel to retell the Easter Story. The spring term also saw the children working with Ruth Basden from Bible Explorer, this has focused on understanding the Bible and in particular the New Testament.

Lower juniors also enjoyed a two day residential visit to Beeston Outdoor Education Centre. This included a range of exciting activities - willow weaving, hiking, orienteering and a visit to Beeston Castle and Bunbury Church.

KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

A party of seven (and one well behaved dog) met at Kingsley on Tuesday, 9th, March, 2010 and journeyed to Rostherne village to enjoy a brilliantly sunny day out.

Leaving the village via field paths to the Home Farm gate of the Tatton Estate, on entering the park the Foresters Walk was taken through woodland circling Westwards to reach the Tatton Mansion, former home of Lord Egerton. After lunch taken in the courtyard of the house, the route took us South past Melchet Mere and across the head of Tatton Mere to reach the area of Old Hall.

Going North across the parkland area known as the 'dropping zone' from it's connections as a training ground for No 1 Parachute School based at nearby RAF Ringway. Troops were dropped over the park and then bussed back to Ringway to do it all over again, even dropping in Tatton Mere to practice a drop going 'pear shape'!!!!!!! S O E operatives also trained the same way but chose to just do one practice drop by nature of their task over occupied Europe.

Model aircraft were in operation, a long standing connection with Lord Egerton who had his own airfield on this area. Next we arrived at the memorial boulder, a tribute to the Airborne Regiment which is situated on the highest point within the park. After a short stop at the memorial we retraced our way back to Home Farm gate and back to Rostherne via Cicely Mill pool.

On 24th February despite the threat of unpleasant weather 10 hardy walkers and a dog set out from the River Weaver swing bridge on the short walk. At Dutton Locks they crossed the river and up the incline, passing Manor Farm and heading towards Cliff Lane. Several turnings later they arrived in Crowton. They then turned along Station Road, passing Birch House and eventually crossing Acton Brook and a bridge over the railway, eventually returning to the A49 and the cars. Local Produce Market - Firstly, thank you to everybody who supported the market on 20 March - it was a huge success and was busy from start to finish. It's great seeing people buying local produce and the local businesses gaining more awareness and customers. Thanks also to Mrs Siddall who, at 100 years old, officially opened our market along with her daughter Audrey.

One estimate was that between 350 and 400 people came to the market where there were 18 stalls of great diversity; from Blinds and Curtains to local jams and fresh vegetables. People involved left telling us that their expectations had been exceeded and that they were very happy with how the day had gone.

By using local markets and produce you are encouraging less food miles, which is good for the environment, less packaging and, best of all, meat and vegetables purchased at local produce markets are among the freshest you are likely to buy unless you have reared or grown them yourself.

Several new residents in the village also said they were delighted to find so much buzz in the community and for the first time the KTI stall gave space to local trades people to advertise themselves in person.

We are already looking forward to the Summer market, which will open the **Carnival on 26 June 2010** so please get in touch if you want to be part of it, either as a stall holder or as a helper. The autumn market will be on 11th September and Xmas market 27th November.

On the subject of the Local Produce Markets Alison Davies recently gave a presentation at the *Cheshire and Warrington Sustainability Alliance Annual Meeting*, which was very well received.


