OTHER ACTIVITIES



<u>Parish Plan Project – Update</u>

The Parish Plan project is going well. We have established a Steering Group of more than 20 people and working groups for each task will be set up as we need them. This means that people can get involved in small parts of the project if they wish.

The first part of the project was to see what issues the community was interested in. This was done through a series of workshops and brainstorming sessions. Thanks to everyone who got involved. We ended up with about 200 ideas.

The main categories that came up were planning, environment, youth and community activities. The Parish Plan will set out a view for the future in each of these areas, looking at the next year or so, 5 years and 10 years.

For the last few weeks, a working group has been developing a survey which will be sent to everyone in the village. The idea is that we take as many views into account as we can. As well as the main survey, the group has developed a junior survey. The Scouts have taken the project to heart and are getting involved by helping us with deliveries and collection later on. Both schools are also involved.

The next stage will be to get the surveys delivered and collected. If you would like to get involved with organising this or you'd like to volunteer to help, we'd love to hear from you.

The Parish Plan Project is being chaired by Claire Jones who is supported by a good team, with a good range of backgrounds. The survey will be sent out by the end of April and we hope to get the results back within 4 weeks.

The date of the next meeting is Monday 18th of April at 7.30. Everyone is welcome.

History at Your Fingertips

If you would enjoy browsing through photographs of Frodsham's changing scenes in the 1960s to 1980 and snippets of centuries old scandalous court and church records, then there are 943 images for you to view on the computer in the lower ground floor of Castle Park House.

All were photographed by the late Dr. Philip Dodd, whose detailed research into Frodsham's history from the 14th century, is stored in our archive room and available to everyone. The slides have been improved as far as possible, identifying titles added and scanned onto a CD for ease of use.

A green plastic envelop is held in the lower ground floor permanently - just ask for it and take a little relaxing time to delve into the past.

A second CD and a paper copy of all our extensive archive lists from the c.1300s- books, documents, maps, posters, artefacts and Journal Index, are also there for you.

Mrs Christine Spencer, a German by birth, was the speaker at the March meeting. Her talk entitled 'Living with 50 million foreigners'. 'It won't last', family and friends warned her. 49 years later they are still happily together. She told us how foreigners see us – we drive foreign cars, love to eat Chinese and Indian food, sit on Swedish furniture, watch Japanese televisions and are very suspicious of foreigners. She has become very British, learning the art of understatement, drinking tea at every opportunity and has become very good at discussing the weather, but she has realized that cricket rules are only understood by the English. It was an entertaining evening!.

Our Speaker in March was Dr. David Toyne who gave an illustrated talk titled 'Multi Season Shrubs & Trees'. David explained the short flowering seasons of shrubs such as Ribes (Flowering Current) also known for its pungent aroma and Laburnum were you have a couple of weeks of bloom and then very little else for the rest of the year, however he did suggest that you can extend the interest by planting Clematis or climbing roses through the structures. While shrubs such as Camellia's, Magnolia's and Azalea's some of which are scented appear better value in the garden.

Lots of trees such as Maples, Beech and Flowering Cherries not only have colour in the leaf but also have interesting barks that look beautiful in the autumn. All Fruit trees again have a long season with the blossom followed by the fruits whether edible or not. Conifers are also well worth considering because of the various varieties, size and colours which can be attractive throughout the year.
