FARM UPDATE MARCH 2012 NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

The exceptionally dry and warm spring has continued. Crops that started spring growth during February have continued uninterrupted. They are about a month ahead of where they should be at the end of March. This has played havoc with our crop protection plans this Spring. All the wheat and barley and oil seed rape have had their first feed of nitrogen fertiliser. Potato planting has continued without a break, and the first 'earlies' we planted in February are well up under the fleece covering. We should be finished planting by the end of March. I cannot remember the last time this happened.

We started selling our fat cattle last months. We sell them at Beeston Market near Tarporley, where local butchers come to buy them. The cattle are around thirty months old and weigh between 600 - 700 kilo each. They grazed outside until November when they were brought inside and fed on our home-grown silage and barley. The barley is rolled to crush it, so that the cattle can digest it, and is then mixed with sugar beet shreds to sweeten it, to encourage them to eat plenty. Cattle prices have risen considerably in the last couple of years. A combination of events has occurred to create a slight shortage. First, there are very little imports of beef coming in to Britain now. Brazil and Argentina have problems with foot and mouth disease, therefore their beef is banned from this country. Ireland, a traditional exporter of beef to Britain has no surplus, so British Beef prices have soared. We are now getting over £2 per kilo for our best cattle live weight. Before you think that we are making a small fortune, the calves and store cattle we buy in have also increased in price outrageously.

Our ewes are very heavily pregnant and are due to lamb at the beginning of April. More on this next month.

The hens are laying well. We have lots of blue, brown and white eggs. Also duck and goose eggs for sale. Please call in at the weekend if you would like to purchase..

PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT AT DELAMERE FOREST

As a Kingsley resident who was unaware of the proposed development in the forest until this week, may I request that some information about the scheme is printed in the next issue of Kingsley News as I am sure there are other local people who will wish to know about the proposals and may wish to have a say?

The information can be found on www.cadd.me.uk, but in brief the proposal to be developed on the Kingswood side of the forest, comprises:

78 Holiday Lodges (some with tree houses)

A common lodge size is 49ft long x 29ft at it's widest point Around 500 Bed spaces

47 Acres of forest - just for the lodge area

1.5km of new roads to be added into forest area

A further 2km of existing roads to be upgraded and public access allowed.

A new visitor centre over twice as big as the original one

A 90 seater restaurant

300 new car parking spaces near new centre

4 New shops (400 sq. mtrs.) opposite visitor centre

Local people are urged to contact their local councillors, MP, the Forestry Commission to register concerns regarding the impact this development will have on the unique environmental haven of Delamere Forest. It is a resource which once it has gone, cannot be replaced.

With all the influences and distractions on kids today the need for a Scout Group in the village is greater than ever. We would like draw your attention to the problems experienced nationally with Impatiens (Bizzy Lizzy's).

They are prone to a disease called Impatiens Downy Mildew, which is specific to Impatiens.

All of our plants will receive preventative chemical treatments prior to leaving the nursery but regrettably we can not quarantee the eventual performance of the plants after they are in the care of our customers.

I am privileged to have been the Chairman of the Parish Council for the first year of the new Council and to have had the help of both old and new Councillors.

This year has seen the completion of the affordable homes project on Pike Lane and the moving in of the new tenants. I know you will follow me in saying that the development is a credit to all those concerned in its original concept and final completion. Also we should not forget the input by the previous Parish Council to ensure that the best site was chosen and the interests of the residents were upheld in the writing of terms of reference for the letting of the properties.

The Parish Plan has progressed during the year and the thoughts, observations and needs of the residents have been collected by a survey. This information has now been collected, collated and analysed and the findings are now being circulated to all the residents of the village as part of the first phase.

The second phase has now begun with the setting up of an implementation committee to look at those areas of main concern to residents. This is not easy as some people have no problem in raising concerns, but are reluctant to come forward to help, this entails the setting up of sub-groups of residents who have an interest in that particular area. It is important that the implementation is successful otherwise all the work put into planning, collecting and compiling the data will be of no avail.

So, on behalf of the Parish Council I would thank all those people who have been involved in the first stage and congratulate them on a job well done and to those involved in the implementation. Their work is only starting, however its importance is significant to the completion of the plan and to the hopes and wishes of the residents and therefore the final goal should not be forgotten, that of providing a better life and facilities for the future of the residents of Kingsley.

PLAY AREA REPORT

The play area is well used. Some graffiti has been dealt with behind the shelter. There has been a request that the grass is cut shorter on the playing field this year. New contractors have been appointed and will be asked to fulfil this request. The play equipment continues to be inspected weekly by Parish Council officers and this year's annual inspection raised no concerns.

CEMETERY REPORT

The board room has been painted externally and leaking gutters have been repaired. The seat at the entrance has also been painted. The annual risk assessment has highlighted one headstone in a dangerously leaning position. This is being repaired at present. There was some serious damage to the boundary sandstone wall alongside the main road, by a vehicle. This has

been repaired. The new grass cutting contractor seems to be doing a good job and the cemetery is looking very tidy.

HIGHWAYS/TRAFFIC REPORT

Kingsley Parish Council worked closely with CWAC contractors to replace the eroding kerb/edge of the brook (from the bottom of The Hurst to Well Lane ~ adjacent to the Red Bull PH) using recycled stone from Chester City Centre. The edge of the path along the brook near Chapel Lane was also reinstated and secured. Particular thanks must be given to Cllr R. Oultram for helping to arrange the project and also to the contractors for their help in doing some 'extra' bits of work for us, the standard of work completed and general attitude shown throughout their period on site.

Refurbishment to the 'Cheshire style' railings (Junction of Top Road and Dark Lane) was completed in January 2012. Thanks must go to Allan Duncalf (Ironmongers), Mike Leigh and Co. (Painters and Decorators) and all the adjacent landowners who allowed access to the railings for contractors.

Throughout the year several residents have expressed concerns about the increasing car parking problems around the village – particularly outside the village shops, Kingsley St Johns Primary School and the Community Centre.

Kingsley Parish Council have considered a number of options to help address and alleviate the problems including articles in the Kingsley News and communication with the KCA. The Parish Councils powers are very limited in respect of 'controlling' or enforcing parking issues in the village but we will continue to monitor the situation and liaise with others (local authority and other agencies if necessary) to try and help the situation.

FOOTPATHS REPORT

During the year there have been very few complaints or queries concerning the footpaths. A stile has been repaired on the footpath from Chapel Lane to Mill Lane. The future plan is to initiate a footpath programme in order to check that the footpaths are fit for purpose.

KINGSLEY WEB

The website continues to be a tour de force. Simon Sherlock does an amazing job in maintaining the site and the Parish Council would like to express our sincere gratitude for all his hard work again this year. There were 9000 visits to the site last year which is 1500 visits greater than the previous year. The village's Facebook page also has 158 members. Note: At the Annual Meeting, the potential for superfast broadband in Kingsley was raised. Cllr. Goodridge agreed to look further into the issue and report his findings back to the Parish Council. In the meantime, you can register your demand for Superfast Broadband in Kingsley at www.connectingcheshire.org.uk following the link 'Join the Campaign'.

KU17 CLUB

The average weekly attendance has increased this year and the group have expressed their thanks to Kingsley Parish Council for their donation. Funding continues to be an issue for the group and they plan to do some additional fundraising this year.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

This has been a very good year for the affordable housing project. Building work finally started in March 2011 on 13 new houses in Pike Lane. We had meetings in

March and May to update everyone on progress and also to make sure that local people had made their applications in good time. The houses were finally released for sale and to rent in November 2011. Plus Dane, the Housing Association, received 42 qualified applications (that means people who meet local residence criteria). The houses were completed on 17 February 2012 and people started to move in the next week. The project has been very successful and the houses have been well received. The contractors were thoughtful and friendly throughout.

PARISH PLAN

The first stage of the Parish Plan project is now nearing completion. A survey was conducted during the summer of 2011. We had a 50% return rate which was excellent. The Parish Plan project encouraged people to get involved with the Parish Council which led to 5 new Councillors being elected in May 2011.

The report on the survey and high level Action Plan will be published in March 2012 at which stage the project will move to Implementation. Thanks are due to Malcolm Barker who stood in as Chairman for the last 6 months.

CARNIVAL 2012

The 2012 Carnival will take place on June 30th at the Kingsley Community Primary School. Preparations are going well.


