FARM UPDATE SPRING 2013

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

This long long wet cold winter refuses to relent into spring. It is now mid-March as I write, and is snowing and freezing cold. Cold easterly winds blowing straight from Siberia are known as lazy winds, because they don't blow round you, they go straight through you! The winter started in September last year and it has not stopped raining since. Half our oil seed rape will not make it through the winter, and will have to be ploughed up. It never got established property and looked sick in the cold wet soil and the wood pigeons finished it off.

The few acres of wheat we did sow have struggled and are about half as advanced as it should be, coming into spring. It will grow away but probably will not yield very well. It is so cold that daffodils are still refusing to open, and hawthorn hedges are still closed buds.

We started planting our early potatoes on 23rd February during a brief dry few days. We covered some with fleece to try to protect them from the cold winds, but is has remained so cold, they will not be ready very early this year.

Not everything is doom and gloom though. The scare over horse meat in beef products has pushed the beef price even higher. The beef price has been climbing steadily all year. Now, we think the housewife is buying real joints of beef instead of processed mince burgers etc. which could be contaminated with horsemeat. There is nothing wrong with eating horse meat and it will do you no harm, but if a product is labelled beef, it should contain only beef.

The exceptionally cold snowy spell during mid March was very unusual and has delayed spring work and planting by several weeks, but the Channel Islands have had there worst snow since 1963, up to a foot deep and frosts to -6 deg. This has decimated the Jersey Royal early potato crop which they were aiming to start harvesting at Easter. Also the daffodils, tulips and cut flowers etc., have probably been ruined by the snow. Daffodils on the mainland are at least a month behind last year, again due to the constant cold weather. Growers aim to have them out and ready for Mothers Day and Easter: the two biggest times for sales in the year. They just were not ready this year, and imports had to be rushed in, at a much higher price of course. The trial badger cull, to try to stop the spread of TB (Tuberculosis) in cattle, was postponed at the end of last year. This disappointed many dairy farmers who are at their wits end with TB in their herds. Over 38,000 cattle were destroyed last year after 'reacting' to the TB test. The Government say the two trial badger culls will commence again this spring. Trial culls in Ireland have shown a 70% drop in TB in these areas. Feelings are running extremely high on both sides. On one side there are the farmers, who are desperate to try and eradicate the disease, and on the other there are people and well-known celebrities (Brian May and Bill Oddie) and NGO's, (RSPCA, Wildlife Trust, Badger Groups, etc), who are totally against killing any badgers.

Farmers involved in the trial and those who are licensed to shoot the badgers are frightened of the threats of violence to them and their families. The police know it is a huge operation and want extra funding from government to police the area's and protect those involved. Adam Henson tried to explain fairly how TB had affected his farm and put both sides of the argument on 'Countryfile' recently on the BBC. He got death threats to himself and his family.

Warburtons Farms was very fortunate to be awarded 'Family Business of the Year' in the National Food & Farming Awards at a ceremony at the House of Commons in December, and would like to thank their friends, customers, suppliers and associates for their good wishes.



The children have been learning about the issues surrounding Fairtrade this month. Class 4 are studying fair trade in depth and have been sharing their knowledge with the rest of the school.

Class 4 organised a fun day for everyone where the children had the opportunity to buy fairtrade products and to compare the taste of fair trade and non-fair trade products. The children were able to bake cakes with fair trade products and these were on sale. Groups of children organised activities for the rest of the school to find out about fair trade.

Our football teams have played against several local teams (Helsby Hillside and Frodsham Weaver Vale) and have represented the school with great skill - well done!

Building works begin in school this month. We are making major changes to improve the accommodation in both buildings: part of the main building is being refurbished so that we will have a new school kitchen and canteen; two new classrooms are being created within the main buildings and we are changing some of our accommodation to bring Wizzies into the school buildings. As a result, the old canteen and the two mobile buildings on the school site will be removed which will really improve the environment for the children and our neighbours.

We are also having a new entrance built on Middle Lane which will enable delivery lorries to come onto the school premises and for cars and pedestrians to use separate entrances.

FRODSHAM - A HIVE OF ACTIVITY THIS SUMMER

FRODSHAM will be a hive of activity this summer – with speakers visiting the town to talk about the UK's bee population, food and drink festivals celebrating local producers and Music in the Park.

The Grassroots Conference will mark the birth of William Charles Cotton 200 years ago, who was a vicar in the town and founding member and President of the British Bee Keeping Association. Frodsham Foundation, which promotes and supports business and community innovation and enterprise, has been buzz-y preparing for the event.

Director Kate Dodgson said: "... We have speakers from a range of organisations and across the country attending. Frodsham has a rich heritage of bees and bee keeping and part of the conference will focus on the Local Bee Action Plan and what communities can do at a local level to support and promote, not just the bee, but a whole range of pollinators."

Speakers will include TED (Technology, Entertainment & Design) speaker Pam Warhurst of Incredible Edible, Reasehealth College and Cheshire Bee Keeping Association. The conference will take place on Friday, May 10 at Frodsham's BEST WESTERN Forest Hills Hotel.

A Food and Drink Festival will then take place over the weekend to celebrate the quality and diversity of the region's local food and drink producers. The event, from May 11 to 12, will also include special commemorative beers from the award winning microbrewery Frod-sham Brewery, food demonstrations and bee friendly planting. There will also be a junior football tournament, BMX and skateboard coaching and It's a Knockout. Local bands Undecided, Retro and Jack the Lad will perform with a special music festival on Saturday afternoon.

- 1. We have again had numerous calls about generators and tools being offered for sale from the back of a variety of vehicles. We would advise strong caution against purchasing anything in such circumstances, as the purchaser has no come-back, should the item turn out to be faulty or stolen.




