NO ECLIPSE JUST LIGHT, PASSION, ENERGY AND 'GOOD NEIGHBOURLINESS' AT FRODSHAM TRANSITION INITIATIVE'S (FTI) 3^{RD} ANNIVERSARY EVENT 18^{TH} MARCH 2015

90 people met at Frodsham Community centre on Wednesday 18th March to hear 'Frodsham Sings' Community choir, 2 professors and Peel Energy speak with passion and of 'good neighbourliness'. Event Chair Graham Wood welcomed all participants.

Mark Warren, Chair of Frodsham Town Council opened proceedings by welcoming the opportunity for the people of Frodsham to be an 'informed' community. He referred to the launch of the Frodsham Neighbourhood plan on 28th March and the challenges of land use for building 250 houses and parking for cars.

Professor Joe Howe, Director of Thornton Energy Institute, explained the ongoing global demand for energy and his passion for sustainable energy. There will be growth in carbon emissions, he explained, so we shall need greater carbon capture and storage. Equally important are reduced energy consumption, more low carbon technologies, better regulation, more innovation and interaction with local communities.

Professor Roy Alexander, Professor of Environmental Sustainabiliy, University of Chester, warned that, given increased energy demand, there were dangers of exceeding 2 degrees energy global warming, the agreed threshold for dangerous climate change. He called for changing the 'energy mix': reducing consumption – 60% reduction is regarded as possible! – and better use of technology. 'Centralised energy has reached its end' he said and help is now available with the process of developing local energy supply.

Muir Miller, MD of Peel Energy, then spoke of the work done by Peel since consent was given for the installation of 19 wind turbines on Frodsham marshes, the blades being expected to turn 80% of the time for the next 25 years. Between April - September 2015, the turbine foundations will be built, the turbines themselves will be manufactured this year, installed in 2016 and ready to go before March 2017.

Stephen Snowdon, also of Peel Energy, referred to the Community Benefit fund which will provide in excess of £100k pa for 25 years irrespective of wind conditions and or ownership of the wind farm. 9 local councils have expressed interest but foremost community involvement in needed to provide community vision, short and long term objectives linked to proper governance. He welcomed the formation of local neighbourhood planning groups. "We will be good neighbours" was the promise from Peel Energy to the community.

Councillor Andrew Dawson also asked for community involvement and asked individuals to contact him with their say.

The event ended with thanks to the speakers, Questions and answers, and the display of stalls of those projects supported by FTI.

Please note that the local police station 0845 telephone numbers are not staffed 24 hours a day and that there may be some delay in responding to any messages left.

On Tuesday, a vehicle parked in Frodsham town centre was broken into and a laptop was stolen from inside. It takes less than 5 seconds to smash a vehicle window, reach inside and take an item of value which is on display! Please do not leave valuables in your vehicle, or if you must, ensure that they are out of sight and that no one can see what and where you are hiding things!

An attempt was made to force the locks on two sheds in Alvanley last weekend. Fortunately the good security prevented anything from being stolen. Most sheds are made of soft pine. Short screws can easily be prised out of such wood. Please use good quality, long screws or preferably, bolts to secure hinges and padlocks.

A shed in Frodsham was also broken into on Monday and an expensive mountain bike was stolen. On Wednesday, a bike was stolen from an unlocked garage in Christleton. I have previously reported that there is a current spate of similar thefts in the Christleton area. I make no excuses for repeating my message that owners of expensive bikes should be very careful about posting pictures on social media which may help criminals to identify where expensive bikes are kept. Also to take care not to be followed home when bikes are mounted on the back of their car. Bikes should also be locked to a solid object within the shed, to prevent easy removal.

A broken down motorcycle was left locked to a gate on the A41 between Chester and Ellesmere Port last week. Unfortunately, when the owner returned a few days later to collect it, it had been stolen. If your vehicle breaks down away from home, it is very important to arrange its recovery as soon as possible. If it is in an isolated or unusual location, it will doubtless attract unwanted attention and theft of or from it.

On Wednesday afternoon, a male was seen walking up the driveway of an address in Tattenhall. When the occupier made their presence known, the male turned and walked away without saying anything. This behaviour is

clearly suspicious, the intentions of the male being unclear. Police attended the area but could not find the male. Please continue to report any suspicious activity to the police as soon as possible.

Another incident occurred in Frodsham on Saturday, but on this occasion, a white van approached an address which had two bikes visible in the front garden. When the occupier made their presence known, the two male occupants immediately drove away. These two incidents clearly indicate that offenders are out and about, looking for easy opportunities to steal property. Everyone has a part to play in deterring and preventing such opportunistic criminals by taking simple security precautions and by reporting any suspicious activity as soon as possible.
