<u>Playing Field.</u> The new play equipment has now been installed in the playing field and once a few snagging issues have been dealt with the fence will be removed and the equipment will be ready for use. Work will commence on cutting back trees and saplings as soon as possible, though care will be taken with regard to bird nesting.

Dog Survey. KPC Dog Control Survey – so far 130 responses have been received. A full report will be heard at the April Council meeting. Councillor Jones thanked those working on the Kingsley News for allowing the Dog Survey leaflets to be sent out with the March magazine.

<u>Higher Heyes.</u> The KPC Working Group is working on the Barristers Advice. An Extraordinary Council meeting may be held during April to discuss whether KPC would direct the Barrister to send a formal letter to Cheshire West & Chester Council asking them to reconsider the planning application.

<u>War Memorial.</u> Tenders have now been received with regard to landscaping the War Memorial to improve access and as part of a

celebration to mark the end of the 1st World War. Work is to begin shortly. <u>Town Farm Quarry.</u> The Cheshire West and Chester Planning Committee have rejected most of the variations to conditions which had formed the latest planning application, this means that unless an appeal is made most of the quarrying should eventually cease. This result was mainly down to the perseverance of the work done by the 3 Council Town Farm Quarry Working Group, and an especial vote of thanks was given to Dr Chris Pownall for his hard work on this matter over the last several years.

<u>KTI Donation</u> the Kingsley Transition Initiative (KTI) donation is at present in suspense awaiting its reallocation. The previous members of KTI have decided that the best way forward will be to register as a charitable trust and they will then be able to decide on where to allocate the money.

<u>Kingsley News</u>. Kingsley Parish Council have decided to contribute the sum of £143 per annum to cover the cost of the KPC articles produced each month in the magazine. The Council is very conscious of the useful tool that the magazine provides in order to let the Parishioners know of their work and thank Elizabeth Wilson and her team for this considerable service to both the Council and the Parish.

The Annual Parish Meeting. This meeting was held immediately after the main March Council meeting. Councillors read out their various reports detailing all the work that has been carried out during the year. One member of the public attended the meeting and thanked the councillors for their continuing hard work. The Report will be available on the village website after the April Council meeting.

PLEASE NOTE that the Minutes of the Parish Council's meetings are placed on the village website each month.

Mid Cheshire 5K

The Mid-Cheshire 5k returns to Kingsley on Friday 27th April starting at 7.15pm.

This staging of the race will again incorporate the England Athletics 5k Road Running Championships with some of the country's best athletes returning to the village. There will be some disruption from 7.00pm until approximately 8.00pm in the Ball Lane, Mill Lane and Crewood Common Road areas due to the course being closed to traffic.

Spectators are invited to Kingsley Cricket club to see the start of the race or down towards Gibson's Mill Café which is the 1km point as well as being close to the finish area. The organisers have asked that locals coming to watch attend on foot.

Race Director Mike Harrington said "Last year the race was responsible for some of the fastest 5k times in the country and many of the athletes praised the local community for coming out and creating such an amazing atmosphere as they approached the finish on Mill Lane.

Next Meeting 7.30 on the 12th April at the Hurst Chapel

Last month we talked about "The Words in my Hand" by Guinevere Glasford". On the whole, we enjoyed this book very much. It was an "imagined" biography of Descartes a philosopher whose work was considered to be quite controversial in the 17th century. We had a sense of how difficult life was for people whose lives crossed acceptable boundaries (different classes) and how vulnerable a single mother could be.

This was an excellent book for a book club because there was plenty to discuss, including the history and the disadvantages faced by the working classes. We were surprised to find out that a maid was discouraged from reading and writing and would have no access to writing materials. It was easy to read and we scored it 3.9 out of 5.

We are now reading "The Heart goes Last" by Margaret Atwood, a well established author. This promises to keep us talking. It is set in the near future where the lawful are locked up and the lawless roam free. Although well known, it turns out that a few of our members have never read a Margaret Atwood book, so it's bound to be an interesting evening.

We have now booked tickets for Weaver Words in Frodsham. The programme has something for everyone. Our next outing will by to Chester to see one or more of the Mystery plays.

Our meetings are open to everyone and we are delighted to welcome someone new most months. There is no need to have read the book (but it helps!) and everyone's views are heard. 

Kingsley Playing Field New Play Equipment

We are pleased to report that the new play equipment has been installed at the playing field in time for the Easter holidays! Kingsley Parish Council would like to say a special thank you to The Veolia Environmental Trust and Tesco Bags of Help for their generous donations towards the project. Veolia gave us £13,324 and we were awarded £1,000 from Tesco following the public vote at their Helsby store. We also received £4,266 in developer contributions (known as Section 106 payments) in respect of some of the new houses that have been built in the village.

We'd like to thank those of you who responded to our various posts on Facebook about the project and those who wrote letters of support for us – your contributions really helped us to secure the grant funding. And finally, we'd like to thank our suppliers, Wicksteed, for their quick and efficient installation of the equipment. We hope that you will enjoy using the zip wire, swings and climbing frame for many years to come.

About the funders:

The Landfill Communities Fund (LCF) is a tax credit scheme enabling Landfill Operators (LOs) to contribute money to organisations enrolled with ENTRUST as Environmental Bodies (EBs). Kingsley Walking Group



The February short walk started from Acton Bridge on an extremely cold day. Eight hardy walkers turned up and the route took them through Onslow, Ruloe and across the fields towards Cuddington. The ground was frozen solid, but the sun shone and on our return we went in the Hazel Pear to warm up and had a delicious lunch.

In March we had an 8.5 mile walk from Sale, which was surprisingly rural, despite being only a few miles from the centre of Manchester. Ten of us enjoyed a dry and reasonably warm day as we walked around Sale and Chorlton water parks and nature reserves, and along the River Mersey and Bridgewater Canal. We walked through Manchester Southern Cemetery, the largest in the country and the final resting place of, amongst countless others, Sir Matt Busby and L S Lowry, and later through Chorltonville, an attractive Arts and Crafts village dating from 1910.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.
