An Office for the Parish Council

"The Boardroom" is the small building at the entrance to Kingsley Cemetery, constructed in traditional "Cheshire brick" style in 1896 most likely from materials originating from Kingsley and used at one time as a place to hold Parish Council meetings.

Under guidance from Councillor Sue Billows work has been ongoing over the last few months to reinstate the building to its former use and as an official office of Kingsley Parish Council. Councillor Sue Billows stated: "The Parish Council is delighted to announce that we now have an office in the village".

This is the first step forward in providing the village with a point of contact and improving access to YOUR Parish Council Services and a mailbox has been installed for any letters or communications to the Parish Council.

Our village PCSO will be holding Surgeries at the Boardroom with dates to be advised in due course. It is hoped that we will be able to set up Parish Councillor & Borough Councillor Surgeries where you can meet and discuss your issues and concerns.

The facility will also enable us to manage the Cemetery Regulations under The Local Authorities Cemeteries Order. In 2018 we had the Cemetery digitally mapped and electronic access to that resource will be installed in the Boardroom. More information will follow soon.

Len has since retired to Southern Ireland but returns to talk passionately about Daffodils. The farm is now run by his daughter Gail who opens it for charity in the spring. Our next speaker in April is the keynote speaker of this season; John Rippin the Head Gardener at the National Trust's Bodnant Gardens. This promises to be an amazing presentation, so come early as we have limited space available.

Gardening Tips and Jobs to be done....

It is time now to roll up your sleeves and get out into your garden...

- 1) Give you greenhouse a spring clean, wash down with soapy water and disinfect.
- 2) Lift and divide perennials to improve vigour and create new plants or even exchange them.
- 3) Divide hostas as they come into leaf, and primroses once they have finished flowering.
- 4) Last chance to move evergreen shrubs and trees as long as the ground is not frozen.
- 5) Feed trees and shrubs with slow release fertiliser, lightly forking them into the soil.
- 6) Feed your roses with blood, fish and bone or similar, and tie in climbing and rambling roses.
- 7) Tie in new honeysuckle and clematis shoots and train them along supports.
- 8) Deadhead daffodils and tulips as the flowers finish, but leave foliage intact, allowing it to die back naturally.
- 9) Protect fruit blossoms from late frosts
- 10) Time to do that awful job no one likes weed the beds! The weeds are now growing as the days warm up and lengthen. Try and leave some nettles and dandelions for the bees and butterflies.
- 11) Order your summer bedding plants from the Scouts, or better still, get a packet of seeds and have a go yourself you will be amazed how easy it is.
- 12) If you have any spare plants once you have divided them, why not bring them along to the Community Centre for a table top sale on Saturday 27th April, and pick up something different in exchange.

If you want to know more, come along and see us and do not be afraid to ask, we are all amateurs, we have all made mistakes and continue to do so, and we all ask each other for help or advice. There is no single correct answer!

CRTA offers a range of work each season that covers theatre, music, dance, literature and family shows. They aim to programme the very best quality work for small scale venues and are committed to programming a diverse programme in terms of content, artists and subject matter. They have an open submission policy so companies can approach them with work at any time during the year. At our March meeting we talked about "In the Days of Rain" by Rebecca Stott. This is the author's account of life in the Exclusive Brethren. The book was made up of a historical account researched by the author from a variety of sources and a personal history of her father.

Our discussion was wide ranging, moving from the impact of religion on society to women's roles in a variety of religions to family life in a "closed" community. Many of our group had come across the Brethren in the course of their work as teachers. The book was well received although we would have preferred more information about family life. We scored the book 3.5 out of 5.

The next book is "Lullaby" by Leila Slimani - a chilling triller translated from French. One reviewer described it as "So twisted and creepy, but absolutely captivating". The discussion is sure to be lively.

Kingsley St John's C.E. Primary School

Enriching the curriculum is a top priority at Kingsley St John's CE Aided. 2019 is proving to be a busy year for the pupils at our local school as they enjoy a plethora of activities designed to enrich their curriculum learning.

All the children visited Warrington Parr Hall to see "Babes in the Wood", and the youngest and oldest buddied up to share the experience.

Years 3-6 shared a STEM workshop day with David Evans, looking at electricity and cogs.

The school Eco-group visited Winsford Recycling Centre to find out about composting, and since returning to school have set up composting locations in school.

Years 5 and 6 visited Warrington Safety Central to find out about keeping ourselves safe in the community.

The Fire Service have been welcomed into school to support Years 5 and 6 in their fire safety awareness in the home.

The NSPCC have visited all classes to support our children in staying safe and knowing how to find help if anything worries them.

The whole school was treated to an Eco-day. We welcomed Phil Hutton into school to work with each class to support our planet and make it more sustainable.

The School Choir have visited Young Voices at the Manchester Arena. Joining other schools in our community, brings a concert performance to life.

The School joined in a fund-raising day for The Powered Wheelchair Association, who have supported our pupil, Zac Owen by presenting him with a modern chair to support his access to the curriculum. The Powered Wheelchair Appeal have helped almost 400 children in our local community over almost 20 years. It is a privilege to support them.

Kingsley Players premiere new play 'Peterloo', 11-13 April 2019 at Kingsley Community Centre

Award-winning Kingsley Players return with their popular theatre and supper shows this April and the premiere of an exciting new one act play 'Peterloo'.

Written and directed by Lynn Pegler, the show tells the story of real and imaginary people caught up in one of England's greatest political events staged in Manchester 200 years ago.

On a sunny August day in 1819, a peaceful rally at St Petersfield (near the present day Bridgewater Hall) turned into a bloody massacre after troops were ordered to attack a crowd of around 60,000 men, women and children. 17 people died and over 600 were injured.

A talented cast of 14 actors, who are drawn from as far afield as Stockport, Wirral and North Wales, will perform a dramatic stage representation of this tumultuous event.

Lynn said: "This year marks the bicentenary of an important milestone in our history, which took place just down the road in Manchester. I was fascinated by the story and I have tried to answer the big question 'why' by portraying the intriguing stories of a range of characters, rich and poor."

The evening will start at 7pm with a two course meal, a tasty Lancashire hotpot supper and dessert (vegetarian option available), followed by the *Peterloo* play.

There will be three performances at Kingsley Community Centre, Thursday 11 – Saturday 13 April, 2019, 7pm.

Tickets cost £12 (including meal and show) and should be reserved in advance through the website www.kingsleyplayers.co.uk or by ringing the box office on 07724 892154.





Peach and Pear Tarts

Ingredients:

- 1 sheet frozen puff pastry (thawed)
- 40g apricot jam (warmed)
- 400g can of pear slices in natural juice (drained)
- 400g can of peach slices in natural juice (drained)

Method:

- Preheat oven to 200°C/gas mark 6. Lightly grease and line a baking tray.
- 2. Cut pastry sheet into 4 equal squares. Fold in edges to form a 1cm border. Press down firmly.
- 3. Brush each square with a little jam. Prick bases with a fork.
- Divide fruit evenly between squares. Brush fruit with remaining jam. Bake for 15-20 minutes or until pastry is puffed and golden. Cool slightly.
- 5. Serve warm with a sprinkle of icing sugar and a dollop of ice cream or cream.
- 6. Enjoy!
