#### WHAT TO SEE IN MAY

Unfortunately we did not receive details of Davenham Players' **Dark Moments** by K C Finn until too late for our April entry. The cast included KP's **Sue Elliott** (**The Mouse's Tale**) on  $27^{th} - 30^{th}$  April

## Kingsley Bookworms Next meeting 11th May 2017 at the Red Bull at 8.00

At our April meeting we talked about "Birds without Wings" by Louis de Bernieres, an author that we have read before. There were two distinct camps – one group loved the book and felt that it had a lasting impact, while the other group didn't like it and didn't get much further than page 50. Louis de Berniers also wrote Captain Corelli's Mandolin which had a similar response. The book is long, has a lot of characters and goes into quite a bit of historical detail. Even the enthusiasts felt it was "quite wordy". We noted an interesting pattern which is that books that have mixed reactions result in good discussions. The average score was 3.2.

In May we will be talking about The Vance Legacy by R Haywood Glen. The book is set in the southern United States, against a backdrop of slavery and life on a tobacco plantation. We accidentally chose a book only available on Kindle. We have managed to make sure that everyone that wants to has access to Kindle. Is this a sign of things to come?

Our June book is "Experience" by Martin Amis. It's a prize winning memoir about his father Kingsley Amis which was published in 2000. A full list of our books for 2017 is on our Facebook page.

From our next meeting on May 11th we will be meeting on the **SECOND Thursday** of every month starting at 8pm. This is because of a clash with the Open Mic night and the increased level of activity at the Red Bull. 

Nine of us enjoyed a splendid 8.5 mile walk in picture-perfect Derbyshire countryside on 11 April, in sunny but cool conditions. Starting from Hulme End car park, we headed south along the Manifold Valley, the river eventually disappearing underground. We climbed steeply to Thor's Cave, for a picnic lunch on the cliff top. We returned via higher fields full of newborn lambs, stopping to explore a disused copper mine head. Back at Hulme End we enjoyed tea and cakes, before setting off for home.

#### Kingsley Parish Council Meeting 18 April 2017

#### **Members of the Public**

One member of the public attended the meeting.

#### Planning applications.

One planning applications was received. 17/000829/S73 & 000575/S73 Variations Town Farm Quarry

#### Playing Field.

The Council has received a number of complaints over the last few months regarding dogs approaching children on the playing field and this has prompted us to investigate a number of potential solutions. During our research, it has come to our attention that a number of byelaws are already in place on the playing field in relation to dog control. Dogs are banned from the enclosed children's play area and we will shortly be erecting signs in this respect. We have also learnt that Vale Royal Borough Council created a byelaw in relation to dogs being kept on leads on the rest of the field. Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council took on these orders from the old Vale Royal Borough Council and in the next 12 months, they may decide to introduce Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO's) on the field which would enable them to legally enforce these byelaws. Before this takes place, the Parish Council intends to carry out a consultation in relation to dog control on the playing field so we can fully represent the views of the community in any PSPO consultation carried out by CW&C. In the meantime, we would politely ask all dog owners to please make sure their dogs are under control and not liable to run up to other members of the public, which can be scary, especially for children.'

#### Cemetery.

The Boardroom (the building inside the entrance to the cemetery) is to have a new floor during the first week of May 2017 and will be painted both inside and outside with heating installed. Two plans for creating a new cremation area for plots in the Extension of the Cemetery and also improving the area around the War Memorial were discussed at the meeting and prices will now be sought for the work regarding the cremation plots and funding will be investigated regarding improvements to the War Memorial area.

#### **Community Fund Applications**

At the April council meeting, Kingsley Parish Council were pleased to present cheques to four groups from the village who had been successful in being awarded funding in Kingsley's first ever Community Fund. Those who were successful were; 1st Kingsley & Newton Scout Group, Kingsley Players Youth Theatre, Kingsley Youth Group and Kingsley Garden & Produce Club. The Chairman of the Council stated 'We look forward to working with and supporting the work of other local groups in future years'. Councillor Danny Moores presented the cheques to Andy McGovern, Max Topping and Daniel McGovern of the Scouts, Colin Smith of the Youth Theatre Group, Anne Kavanagh of the Youth Group and Ruth Wooles and Chris Woulds of the Gardening Club.




