Yoga and Fitness Classes with Janet

I began teaching yoga and fitness in my mid- 30's over 17 years ago. I started out teaching a few evening classes in Frodsham and Helsby when my children were young. Once they were all in school, I went to work for the Health Improvement Team, part of NHS/ Halton Borough Council and gained lots of experience working there for 11 years. I have now returned to being self-employed and am setting up new classes once more locally.

My big passion is helping people to become fitter, healthier and happier. My key strength lies in the care and attention I take to deliver classes which are simple, safe, effective and manageable for people of all ages, abilities and at varying stages of "wellness". I am compassionate, caring, down-to-earth and light-hearted in my approach to fitness but serious about bringing a little more joy into the world.

Yoga - Mondays 6.15-7.30pm - Kingsley Community Centre

I teach a gentle style of yoga, called "Dru Yoga". It is ideal for beginners and also for people who enjoy a more relaxing style of yoga. Joints are kept soft and movements are flowing. It is wonderfully relaxing and will leave you feeling calm and peaceful. This style of yoga also helps build strength safely and can be both empowering and uplifting. It will keep you strong and flexible, both mentally and physically.

Keep Fit – Wednesdays 11.00-12.00pm- Kingsley Community Centre

I teach a Gentle Keep Fit Class aimed primarily at older adults. Easy lowimpact aerobics and simple exercises to keep joints supple, muscles and bones strong and improve balance and co-ordination. Set to music, this class is fun, social and uplifting.

I am also starting classes in **Frodsham Community Centre on Monday mornings.**

Kingsley Garden Club - May 2021

Well what a wonderful April we have had, the ground is bone dry, next to no rain, so don't know what happened to those "April showers". The gardens are starting to burst into life with spring blossoms and all the bulbs coming into life. We have planted our early potatoes, the tomato seeds are coming along a treat and we have had a couple of crops of forced rhubarb so not to bad really.

The Committee met virtually early in April and it has been agreed that subject to infection rates and government guidance at the time, the Club will resume its monthly meetings at 8.00pm on 13th September 2021. We will be using the large hall at the Community Centre with socially distanced seating and the doors open to allow adequate ventilation. The KCA have given the Garden Club a financial incentive to resume our meetings at the earliest possible time.

It is proposed that membership renewal in September will be reduced to £12 to cover the cost of the forthcoming speakers for 2021/22. The per meeting attendance rate for those who do not wish tp take out annual membership will remain at £4.00 per meeting. Details on our September speaker will be made available nearer to the time.

The Garden Club will have a "Swaps Table" outside our Treasurers house on Well Lane from May, this is open to the whole village not just club members. This operates on the basis on leaving any unwanted or surplus garden items that are still usable and in good condition, and if you find something you like why not take it away with you. The only condition is - if you leave anything to be swapped and it is not taken within a week, you MUST remove it and take it back home, this is NOT a junk yard or an excuse not to go to the tip!

Top tips for this month.....

Start planting out summer bedding plants towards the end of May

Remember not to cut back all that growth on your bulbs, let it die back and feed the bulbs

Thin out hardy annuals, and harden off half hardy plants during the day but put them back under cover in the evening.

Continue to divide herbaceous border perennials to create new plants and help reinvigorate the old plants

Take cuttings of fuchsia, pelargoniums and herbs.

Tie in rambling roses and sweet pea plants

And start to cut your lawns and give your lawns a spring feed.
