More of Cliff's historic stroll around Kingsley

Going slightly further afield, at the corner of Pike Lane, which runs behind the Parish Church, was The Sexton's cottage, where the local gravedigger lived. Further into Pike Lane was the market-garden premises of the family Kearns, who I believe originated from Southport or The Wirral. Moving further along this narrow lane was the workshop of the village wheelwright, Henry Stanley. The workshop was a green-painted corrugated iron building which stood up above the lane. It may be there still. Henry was a very rotund man with his head sunk into his shoulders. He was quite a character and had a distinctive laugh. He attended Blakelees chapel and resided at Wiggins Lake, on the main road between Newton cross-roads and the top of Dark Lane. I recall that he had a pre-war two-door Riley saloon car, which he had completely painted in red lead preservative. In the 1940s and 1950s, to have a car was a rarity and what cars were seen were mainly hang-overs from the pre-war period, as all post-war car production went for export to pay our war debts. His car registration mark is not readily to hand, but I have it in my records.

Mention of Dark Lane reminds me of two businesses in that narrow thoroughfare. At the top was Bill Oultram, small-holder and later Haulage Contractor. He operated rather ancient Dodge flatbed lorries and I believe contracted to I.C.I.

Bill's wife was aunt to my pal Barry Harvey and he was thus able to get rides in the lorries, on one occasion travelling as far as Aberdeen. Bill's brother Harold Oultram was a mischievous likeable character with a strong sense of fun. The other business in Dark Lane, slightly below Oultram's yard, was Bob Gleave, another carpenter and joiner.

I recall a few businesses in Top Road during my boyhood (other than Fred Dutton's shop mentioned last time). At the lower end of Top Road (Top Lane as it was then known) was another green-painted corrugated iron building which may have at one time been a motor garage-workshop, operated by Jack Lewis, but this never operated during my boyhood. Jack lived in the house in the V-angle between 'Top Lane' and 'Dark Lane', and I have mentioned how he was one of the first to show external lights when the war-time blackout was lifted. The Fred Moores' archive has a photograph of a motor garage somewhere in Top Road but I was told that the one pictured was nearer The Institute, but it may have been the one I recall. The garage building I remember (Jack Lewis's) stood empty for many years and was at one time considered as a venue for a youth club, but none of the attempts to form a youth club came to fruition in my days.

Another well-known family in Top Road were the Wildings, and one of the elder Wildings, Sam, was another 'produce merchant'. I recall that he used to drive a small Fordson pick-up truck, when pick-ups were unusual, and his model was extra-unusual in having the accelerator pedal in the centre of the three!

Sam was agile despite his years and seemed always to be calling at the local shops, gasping for 'a Woodbine a Woodbine' (cigarettes). The Wilding's ran a successful building business, I believe, doing jobs for several other local businesses.

In a slightly later period two businesses spring to mind in Top Road - Arthur Walton was an electrician who married Bill Oultram's daughter Phyllis, and they lived in a bungalow some way below The Institute. The other business was Llly Lewis's music-teaching school, which she operated from her home on the roadside slightly opposite The Institute. She seemed to have a fair amount of success in obtaining music grade certificates for her pupils. She was also regular organist at Brookside Methodist Chapel, although the instrument there was somewhat inferior to that at 'The Hurst'.

One could go further afield, and mention Wilfred Fryer of Waterloo, Newton, who was yet another Potato Merchant in addition to farming. Wilfred was of short stature but very lively, always on the go, and a good friend to everyone. He was totally dedicated to Vauxhall cars and usually Bedford lorries, but I recall him purchasing a Seddon lorry as his business expanded. His lorries were always rich red with gold lettering and scroll work. His son John, well-known to present-day villagers, carried on the business after Wilfred's untimely death. Now even John has retired but continues with good work amongst the community.

One trade which I have not mentioned was that of 'painter and decorator'. The only 'firm' I can recall is that of 'Painter Sam' Lewis, at Town Well, mentioned in the previous article. Mr. Pimblott employed the brothers Ken and Bill Jones of Norley to paint the exterior of his housing stock in the 1950s. I believe Arthur ('Bunny') Harvey was a good interior decorator and no doubt there were many other individuals offering that service.

So ends our brief tour of the village tradesmen. I haven't mentioned any 'tradeswomen' other than Lily Lewis, the only other lady tradesperson I can think of was the hair-dressing saloon in Mr. Amos's former shop near The Cross. I have probably inadvertently left out some important tradesman and I apologise if so.

One category I have not yet mentioned is the farmers, of which there were scores in my boyhood. Perhaps we will recall a few of them at a future time, along with the sporting clubs..

Kingsley Walkers

On 22nd March the Kingsley Walkers met again for the monthly long walk, firstly at the community centre to sort out car shares and then again at a layby in the little village of Rhualt in North Wales. It was sunny but a bit chilly at first with quite a breeze. The walk took us up a quiet lane before heading up a steep wooded footpath before coming into open farmland. A few miles in we stopped for a break on some very convenient tree stumps which made for excellent seating.

It is always interesting how conversations ebb and flow on a walk, how a stile sometimes ends one conversation and is the beginning of another, how new acquaintances are made, new friendships develop and old ones are renewed. Well, there were certainly plenty of stiles on this walk, including some really high ones but generally it was a very pleasant mix of grass fields, woodland, small country roads and open moorland.

Packed lunches were taken near the summit of Marian Ffrith at an elevation of about 240 metres. There were fabulous views out over Rhyl onto Liverpool Bay and with many of the peaks of North Wales visible. After more moorland paths and fields there was a gentle descent back to the start on forest paths, skirting the peak of Mynydd y Cwm (apologies for any attempts at pronunciation of that one) and views over the Clwyd valley.

One carload then headed to Bodfari for a well earnt pint, others headed into St Asaph where we found the Translators' Tearoom at the cathedral was still open



(just) and we delighted in (what had become) warm sunshine, the gardens and some teas and cakes.

On April 12th we were less lucky with the weather for the short walk. It was a case of waterproof trousers and a waterlogged dog but it was a good walk around Budworth and Marbury Country park for those hardy enough to persevere. A break was planned for us by our leader and taken on picnic benches in the dry under some wooden shelters. There was a lunch at the George and Dragon pub for those who chose.

The walking group has two walks in most months. A short one of around 4-5 miles on the second Tuesday normally with the option of a pub lunch at the end. Kingsley Parish Council April 2022

The Parish Council met in the Green Room at Kingsley Community Centre for the April meeting, were four Councillors and one member of the public were present.

The Parish Council noted with sadness, the resignation on health grounds of Cllr Chris Pownall. The Council would like to extend to Chris and his family, its best wishes and thank him for his many years of service on the council, and to the community. This now leaves yet another vacancy, in addition to the four already existing, and we once again appeal to all eligible members of the community to come forward and be part of the administration of your village. Please look at the Parish Council website for eligibility criteria and an application form.

The wildflower mix has now been scattered on the prepared area at the top of the Playing Field, we would kindly ask members of the public not to walk on this area, and to keep children and pets away from the area until the plants have had time to establish. It is proposed that this area be designated the Platinum Jubilee Meadow, and that the village schools will provide information signs informing the public about the meadow.

Towards the end of May, Platinum Jubilee signs will be going up around the village and a Platinum Jubilee flag will be flown from the flagpole over the jubilee holiday period.

Cheshire West & Chester Council have advised that monies from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) have been earmarked for Kingsley, and the Parish Council is looking at a number of potential projects for the benefit of the community at large and will advise in the future of possible schemes.

Kingsley Parish Council will be holding its Annual Parish Meeting in May, please check website for date, time and venue. More information nearer the time, but we would encourage members of the public to attend and see what your Council has been doing in the last 12 months.


