Footpaths & Playing fields

Over the past year there have been few complaints about the footpaths in the village and the Council continues to fund the cutting back of overgrowth to keep the footpaths open to all. The new Footpath leaflets have now been printed and are available for sale.

Any feedback on the footpaths is welcome.

One of our highlights of 2009 is the completion of the new play area which is being well used and cared for. We hope this will continue. By working with near residents the position and number of car parking spaces was amended and a gate installed at the entrance to the field. This will be opened and closed by the near residents once all arrangements are in place. Weekly inspection of the equipment is carried out by a member of the Council.

Thanks to the Kingsley Litter pickers, the field is kept remarkably clear of rubbish.

Traffic & Transport

The headmistress at the Kingsley County Primary School has agreed to work with the Council in trying to alleviate the parking problems that still arises around the school at various times.

New signs have been installed at top of Dark Lane to alert drivers as to the unsuitability of this route into the village.

The old black and white sign located at the junction of Middle Lane and Kingsley Road which was in poor condition has been replaced.

Some issues in relation to parking at Kingsley St.John's Primary School have been raised and we are contacting the school to discuss possible options.

The County Speed Limit Review on the County's A & B Roads is currently in place. The review phase by external consultants has been completed and discussion on their proposals is now underway with each Area Office. The phase 1 roads outlined in a recent CCC Newsletter have been discussed with the CCC area offices and detailed design work for these roads have now been completed. The next step will be the consultation phase for the phase 1 proposals. Assuming no major issues arise from the consultation it is envisaged that implementation will commence in the next financial year 2009/2010 – subject to funds being available.

We are still awaiting proposals regarding the B5153/5152.

Cemetery

It was sad to learn that the cemetery main gates were stolen in October 2008 and Council will strive to get them replaced.

A grit bin has been purchased to aid with entry during frosty weather.

KU 17S Group

There have been many changes at KU17S during the past year but the club continues to meet its aim, which is to provide a safe and secure meeting place for the young people of Kingsley.

There is still a consistently good turnout for the younger sessions and for the trips and it is hoped that with new ideas being presented the older age group will also continue to flourish.

Youth Issues

It was pleasing to note that issues in relation to problems with young people have been absent during the last year. It is felt that credit to the KU 17 and Scout and Guide organisations have assisted in this reduction.

Web Site

This has been an extremely successful year for the Website and it is truly becoming a key village resource. Simon Sherlock continues to do a hugely important job in maintaining the site for the benefit of the village. Simon is keen to see the site be improved still further with local groups and societies sending in their information.

Kingsley News Monthly Magazine

It is pleasing to report that the Council now has a regular page in the newsletter and tries to keep residents informed of all important issues.

Community Liason

It is heartening to note that in this village there is little need to foster any spirit of community liaison since it is happening daily all around us.

Clearly the major event of which we should all be proud is the continuing success of the Community Pride Initiative which has brought the village still closer.

Community Pride/Carnival/Orchards

Carnival 2008 was held on the 12th July and in total £1200 profit was distributed to St.Johns School, Kingsley Community Primary School, KU 17s and the newly re-formed Parent and Toddlers group

This event was well received with over 2000 people attending. Appreciation should be made to the organising committee for all their hard work.

In relation to the Village Pride – Kingsley came 4th but we did score very low marks at the time for the play area which unfortunately was inspected by the judges before the re-development. We are sure they will be impressed with the 2009 visit.

Kingsley were very proud to win the Community Spirit award being introduced as 'the village that likes to party'. We were particularly praised for the outreach work by The Hurst and St.Johns Church and for the success of the Kingsley players.

Winning this award qualified Kingsley for the Calor National Community Spirit award which was judged oh March 27th. To date we do not know the result.

CHAIRMAN'S OVERVIEW

This year has been an extremely successful year for the parish council and the village. The efforts of the council have paid huge dividends, and my sincere thanks go to all Councillors for their effort, tenacity and commitment to improving life in the village.

There are many achievements this year, but I would like to single out starting with one of the most enjoyable carnivals I have been to. Councillor Gwillim did a fantastic job in organising and running the carnival and by the looks on the faces of the participants I personally think it was worth all the hard work. We need to start planning for the 2011 carnival now and any offers of help are more than welcome.

Staying with Councillor Gwillim, it is with immense pride that I recognise all the efforts that have gone into the winning of the community spirit competition, and I am looking forward to the result of the next phase. I see no reason why we should not do as well at the national level as we did at the regional level. It is great to see that the award is so well deserved given the amount of participation we were getting in the organising and running of the event. It constantly reminds me of how lucky we are to live in such a community aware village.

Another event that is worth noting as extremely significant was the opening of the new play park. Councillor Fletcher is at the end of a long line of Councillors who have wrestled with this issue and his hard work has resulted in an excellent village play park. My thanks go to him, those who preceded him and Groundworks for managing the project, as well as the National lottery for providing the majority of the funding. I have heard nothing but good reports of this since it has been built and it looks like something that will bring pleasure to all groups of the community for many years to come.

One other area that has been in discussion for many years is the provision of affordable housing within the village. The council has been proactive on this issue and commissioned a survey that concluded there was a significant need to provide this type of housing within the village. Following on from that survey villagers were asked to come forward if they were aware of any land suitable for provision of this type of housing. We are now progressing this and will look to work closely with the departments responsible to ensure that the correct benefits to the village are achieved.

Kingsley Parish Council Are pleased to be awarded Quality Council status and to be one of only 18 Councils in the Cheshire Area to achieve this status. We will continue to strive to live up to this title.

Kingsley Gardening Club - Ideas for June

'June is busting out all over' or so the song says.

The planning over the winter, the seeds you have nurtured and the plants you have bought should all now be blooming and filling your garden with masses of colour and scents, let us hope that the summer is going to be good for us.

Tips for June – tackle weeds, hoe regularly on dry summer days so the seedlings shrivel and die.

Keep watering - At the height of summer this is a must, give priority to containers and hanging baskets as they dry out more quickly than border soil, and anything that you have just planted.

Watering is best in the evening, directly into the soil or compost rather than over the leaves (Note a good soaking once a week is better than a light sprinkling everyday). Borders – Fill in gaps when earlier flowers like delphiniums, lupins and oriental poppies have finished with annuals or pots filled with dahlias or geranium's which can be moved around as things come and go.

Support your tall top heavy plants with canes or stakes. If you have trimmed tree's some of the small branches make ideal supports and will melt into the garden foliage better than anything else.

Dead heading - This encourages more flowers instead of the plant making seed – the plants most in need are Azaleas, Iris, lilacs, pansies, rhododendrons and roses, foxgloves die after flowering so remove them before they self-seed everywhere. As flower spikes fade on delphiniums and lupins just cut off the heads and new side shoots will grow and flower.

Get plants for free - take cuttings now, it's easy and costs almost nothing – try buddleja, dianthus, broom, honeysuckle and hydrangea – cut 10cm pieces of stem just below a leaf joint, remove the lower leaves and just push the stems into a pot of multi-purpose compost mixed with course grit or sharp sand and cover the pot with a plastic bag, the cuttings should have rooted by the autumn, plant out now or leave until next spring.

Remember to plant autumn flowering bulbs i.e.: autumn flowering crocuses, cyclamen and autumn snowdrops.

In the greenhouse - sow stocks, wall flowers, polyanthus and winter flowering pansies ready for next year's borders.

The monthly meeting of Kingsley W.I. was held in the Community Centre on Wednesday 6 May. The President, Mrs Joan Barker welcomed everyone to the meeting including one new member. She reminded members of the Kingsley W.I.'s 90th Birthday Party which will be held at the home of Mrs Joan Booth on Wednesday 3 June, 7 for 7.30 p.m. Future events include an invitation from Crowton W.I. to lunch on 19 May, our own Luncheon Club meeting at the Holly Bush on 29 May and a walk around Crowton for the Walking Group on 11 May. Members voted that the delegate attending the national A.G.M. should request that money from the government for the plight of honey bees should be used for research into the problem.

The speaker, Sue Tatman from the Cheshire Wildlife Trust, told us that there are 45 nature reserves in Cheshire, and that if we have our own garden we have a huge resource centre for attracting wildlife. What is considered a pest can be a food supply for other species; dead wood provides a good habitat for fungi and many insects; ponds, which should have shallow sides and be sited with cover nearby, attract frogs, newts, water beetles, dragon flies and damsel flies; flowers provide a good nectar source, and different types of bird food attract a wide variety to our gardens.

The after-dinner speaker on 3 June will be Mrs Pat Hayes talking about the History of Newton Hall.




