Kingsley Carnival – News Release

Roll Up, Roll Up for Kingsley Carnival

Roll up, roll up for an afternoon of fun and games at Kingsley Carnival on Saturday 26th June.

This year the village carnival is based on a circus theme, with jugglers, dog agility displays, a samba band and circus skills performers.

The event starts with a procession leaving Top Road at 1pm and will then meander through the village until it arrives on the carnival field about 2pm. Traditional circus-themed floats will feature pupils from both village primary schools, local brownies, guides and youth club, accompanied by around 30 classic cars – all dressed up for the occasion. Everyone is welcome to join in the procession, whether in fancy dress or not.

Youngsters will be invited to enter a car quiz and vote for their favourite classic car. There will also be a scarecrow trail around the village, with a prize for the best-dressed, scariest scarecrow.

On the carnival field, there will be dozens of games, activities and stalls to enjoy, from the Kingsley Transition farmers market, hog roast and WI tea tent to a samba workshop, school dance performances and a display from the Delamere Dog agility team.

And in the evening, the festivities continue with a village barbecue organised by the 1st Newton and Kingsley Scouts and Kingsley Cricket Club. 

"HIGHFIELD HAPPILY RETURNS" Friday 19th July 2010

This highly popular Male Voice Choir makes a welcome return as a precursor to next year's Centenary Celebrations. Formed in February 1911 by sixteen tannery workers the choir presently numbers over fifty members, its connection with Kingsley goes back over fifty years. It draws its members from within a twenty miles radius of Halton, with at present 5 singers from the village. The choir's repertoire covers Josh Grogan to fourteenth century motet, grand opera to Les Miserables, German drinking songs to Welsh hymns (with wonderful amens).

Approximately fifty choral pieces are memorised by the choir at any one time but, with a valuable library of 650 titles, and new material available every year, they will be able to keep audiences entertained for maybe another 100years!

Kingsley's tradition for singing and musicianship will be continued in this concert and combines with Highfield's promotion of young performers from their area, with guest artists "Kingsley St John's Primary School Choir" and the talented guitarist, Samantha Lythgoe.

Kingsley Transition Initiative

Kingsley Transition Initiative aim to save 150t/CO₂ from Kingsley homes

Kingsley Transition Initiative has been working with the Energy Saving Trust for over a year now. In that time we have held a sustainability event and 4 successful Local Produce Markets.

It is now time to turn our attention to our homes.

As a result of the household survey's filled in by villagers last year we can tell you that:

- By insulating all the empty cavity walls in Kingsley would we would save over 50t/CO₂ (the equivalent saving of taking 156 cars off the roads in Kingsley).
- If we insulated all of Kingsley's lofts up to the recommended depth of 270mm we
 would reduce Kingsley's carbon footprint by over 100t/CO₂ each year (the equivalent
 of taking 333 cars off the roads in Kingsley or for those of you who prefer an alternative
 mode of transport 555 hot air balloons full of CO₂ floating above Kingsley!)


You will shortly be receiving a letter from the Energy Saving Trust promoting the virtues of insulation. We hope you take this opportunity to find out how much money you could save (around £300 a year off your fuel bills for a typical 3 bed semi).



.Kingsley Short Walk 28th of April

14 Walkers and a Greyhound set out from the "Carriers" at Hatchmere to walk through Delamere Forest. having already pre-ordered their lunch. After leaving the Hostelry they turned right into Ashton Road and then through White Gate, eventually reaching open fields and a stile, but ignoring this they turned left passed two ponds and "Walkers Worizit", on their way to Barnsbridge Gate North. Crossing the road and continuing the path they turned left to arrive at a suitable place, with a table and seats, for a mid morning snack.

After snacking they turned left to walk some way round Blakemere Moss, then crossed the road via Cauleys Gate, continuing along a track, ignoring the loop because time was running short. Over the hill and down a short valley they came across the gate and the path leading them to Post Office Lane and from there to the "Carriers", where an excellent meal was awaiting us all.

Nine of us enjoyed a seven miler from Daresbury church on 11 May. This was nearly not the case, as our leader, having arrived first and seen 'loitering' in the car park, was questioned by the police, who were on the look out for a reported suspicious character. Fortunately, having had his camera examined, he was 'released' in time to lead the walk. We followed field paths to Preston-on-the-Hill, then dropped down to Preston Brook and the junction of the Trent & Mersey and Bridgewater canals. We followed the later to the salubrious village of Moore, before circling back to Daresbury. The police had moved on!

The walk on 8 June will be from Erddig. As there will be an opportunity to visit the gardens after the walk, NT members should bring their membership cards.
