Western Rural Round-up-Week commencing 7th May 2012

- An unoccupied house in Wrexham Road, Pulford has had a brick thrown through the rear ground floor window. The property was not entered and it is unclear whether this was the intention. The incident was reported to police on Wednesday 2nd May and I would appreciate any reports of suspicious persons or vehicles in the general area in the preceding days
- 2. An outbuilding on Cliff Road, Acton Bridge has been entered sometime during the day on Thursday 3rd May. The offender(s) forced a padlock off the door and stole saddles and bridles from inside. Any sightings of suspicious activity in the area would be welcome. The incident acts as a reminder to us all that outbuilding security is well worth a review to ensure the measures are effective especially when valuable items are stored within.
- 3. Scams are never far away as you will appreciate. They take various guises through numerous medium such as letter, telephone, computer contact and personal visit. I would like to remind you to be vigilant if something does not appear right and always double check the information presented to you. If the 'approach' is genuine the caller will not mind. If it looks too good to be true it almost certainly will be the case!
- 4. A property in Chapel Lane, Bruera has had a shed damaged and property strewn over the garden on two separate occasions last week. It is distinctly possible this is the result of local youths. Any reports of youths displaying anti social behaviour in the area will assist officers to 'nip' such activity in the bud.
- 5. There has been an increase in the number of reports of theft of horses in the Kingsley, Cuddington, Crowton and Norley Area. Some of the animals were thankfully returned to their owner but the incidents are worthy of note for all horse owners across the Rural Area and I would encourage a review of any security measures that are in place. A white van (no further details) was seen acting suspiciously near one of the incidents.

FARM UPDATE MAY 2012

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

May has continued where April left off: cold and wet. After the warmest March on record when everybody thought Spring had come early,

we've had the wettest April for 250 years. April was only the 4th month in the last 3 years, when we have had more than average rainfall. That is why there is still a drought order in force in some parts of the country. And now we have had the coldest, wettest May for many years. I hope the old saying "Rain in May for corn and hay" comes true and we have bumper crops later in the year. Those old enough to remember, tell me that the weather patterns are the same this year as in 1976, when we had the hottest summer on record and brilliant potato prices – fingers crossed!

We still have about 8 acres of potatoes to plant. We haven't been able to plant anything for over a month now. Nationally, potato planting is running way behind the last few years with only 76,000 ha planted by the 20th May against 125,000 ha last year. Potatoes that were planted in March have struggled to emerge. Cold and wet soils have slowed development and night frosts have killed any leaves that were showing, at least three times. On the plus side, I hope that potatoes might be a better price this year, after the glut of last year, when prices were very poor all season.

We started lifting our early potatoes on 2nd May. This is a record early start for us, following a warm March. They are only ready now because they were covered with fleece to keep them protected from the cold winds and frosts. We are selling them from our Hatley Farm shop at Frodsham freshly picked, and trade is going very well.

Our winter wheat has withstood the cold and wet quite well and should still yield well, but the barley is a different story. The Spring barley, sown in warm seedbeds in March is looking sick, stunted and pale. A good dose of nitrogen and some warm sunshine should bring it on, we hope. The winter barley is now shooting into ear. It is only about a foot tall and struggling.

May is usually the month when the trees and hedgerows burst into flower, and they are trying to this year, albeit slightly later. Hawthorn and cow parsley along the roadside, brilliant horse chestnut trees, lilac and clematis and wisteria are all at their best, and still the Spring flowers are hanging on in there. We still have magnolia and camellias and tulips in flower in our garden.

As I mentioned last month, one of our cats had kittens, most of which are now spoken for, but we have two left. Ring Liz if you are interested. One male, one female, black and very fluffy.


