

We had a good attendance at our meeting on 7.5.2013, with some visitors attending from Norley. The speakers were Rev's Thia and John Hughes who gave us a fascinating insight into their time spent in northeast Congo last year. They went as part of the ABC link, a partnership of friendship and prayer between the Dioceses of Aru, Boga and Chester. The country is huge and one parish is as big as the United Kingdom! There is one Bishop to cover the whole of the northeast and he is assisted by a very hardworking ministry team. The Congolese population are devout Christians and Bishop Keith, who went with the Mission team, confirmed over 200 candidates whilst he was there. The country has poor communication systems, poor roads and transport systems and many political problems, however, the people were very welcoming and hospitable and looked after their visitors well. Thia and John had many slides to illustrate the talk and maps to show how vast the areas were. Thia mentioned that they are knitting baby clothes for the Congo and we may be able to help them with this.

We are looking forward to our Celebration of Marriage and Baptism to be held in St John's Church on Friday 28th and Saturday 29th June and preparations are underway.

FARM UPDATE JUNE 2013

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

After a brief warm spell over May Day weekend, the cold windy weather returned. Our Camellias finally started flowering beginning of May instead of end Feb and our Magnolia soon after. The magnolia was an absolute picture for 2 days, until the gales blew it to pieces.

Despite the cold, there has been very little rain. Land has finally dried out and the potato planting was finished in excellent conditions. In fact, it is now so dry that we could do with some rain!!! I never thought I would say that after 12 months of non-stop rain. Farmers are never happy eh!

Last year we started selling New Cheshires on 3rd May, but this year, potatoes, like all crops are about a month behind. So for the first time since we started using fleece, I don't think there will be any potatoes lifted in May.

You may have read in the papers or heard on the news about a ban on pesticides called Neonicotinoids. Yes, I know, why do these chemicals have such unpronounceable names? The chemical has been banned by the EU because they say it is damaging bees and causing their numbers to decline. This is not a chemical that is applied by spraying crops, but a seed treatment put on oilseed rape seeds to protect the emerging seedling from fungal diseases. There is great controversy over this issue at present.

It is vitally important that we help pollinators on our farms. Everyone understands how important bees are for pollinating plants. In the UK, there are around 267 species of bee, including one honeybee species and 24 bumblebee species, the rest are solitary bees. Their diversity, coupled with their exclusive diet of pollen and nectar, means bees are regarded as the main pollinators of most of our wildflowers and insect-pollinated crops. Pollination is also vital to the production of many horticultural and agricultural crops in the UK. This pollination is valued at £510m per year. Crops differ in their dependency on insect pollination, from horticultural crops like apples and runner beans, to the less dependent combinable crops like oil seed rape.

Our new potatoes should be ready for sale from beginning of June at our Hatley Farm, Frodsham. Look out for the signs along the A56

COUNCIL TAX PARISH PRECEPT FOR KINGSLEY

Each year, Parish Councils are required to set a budget for the new financial year. The 'precept' is the specific term for the money requested by the Parish Council and collected from residents as part of your Council Tax payment. The precept is for local parish use, to maintain local services and to support the local community.

You may have noticed that your recent Council Tax bill for 2013/14 showed a 5% increase against the Parish Council precept. This is mainly due to a standard formula used by Cheshire West and Chester Council, rather than due to the Parish Council requesting more funds. We wrote to the Council recently for clarification and this is what they said:

"The parish charges are calculated each year taking account of the following factors:

1. How much money is required from the parish

2. How many band D equivalent properties there are in the parish

In 2012/13, your parish requirement/precept was £21,609 and the number of band D equivalent properties was calculated at 957 (to calculate the number of band D equivalent properties we take the actual number of properties in each band, less any exemptions and discounts. A formula is then applied to each of the bands to work out the band D equivalent). The charge for a band D property was calculated by dividing your precept by the number of properties i.e. 21,609/957 giving a charge of £22.58

In 2013/14 your parish requirement was £22,000 and the number of Band D equivalent properties was calculated at 926. The lower figure this year as well as the factors listed above takes account of people who are receiving the new Council Tax Reduction Scheme which replaced Council Tax benefit on 1 April 2013. You have been awarded an additional grant this year of £949 to offset these cases. The charge for a band D property was calculated by dividing your precept by the number of properties i.e. 22000/926 giving a charge of £23.76.

The percentage that appears on the bill is the percentage increase in the charge when comparing $\pounds 22.58$ to $\pounds 23.76$ and not the percentage increase in the precept you have requested"

KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

There was an enjoyable walk of approximately 8 miles on 14 May, from Chirk Castle, led by Jim Newey. We headed north through the parkland to join the Offa's Dyke Path, and over fields to join the Shropshire Union Canal. Following the canal we passed through the 170m Whitehurst tunnel (torches required), past Chirk Marina, then the 421m Chirk tunnel. Unlike the British economy there was light at the end of this tunnel! Next we crossed the spectacular Chirk Aqueduct, with splendid views, then down into the Ceiriog Valley for a stretch along the riverside, before returning to the Chirk estate, with the castle looming above. The weather was dullish, with a prolonged light sprinkling of rain, but not enough to detract from our enjoyment of the spring countryside




