
Our meetings follow a pattern, starting with a discussion about last month's book and then a chat about books we enjoy and recommend. Then we decide what to read next which is always great fun.

George Killip

At the end of January Kingsley said goodbye to one its oldest and best known residents. George Killip who would have celebrated his hundredth birthday on the 17th May, died on the 29th January and was buried in Kingsley cemetery on Friday, 6th February after a funeral service at the Hurst Chapel.

George was born the seventh in a family of 7 boys and 3 girls, on the Isle of Man, of which he was very proud. He and Myra visited the island often, their last visit being in September last year when their grandson, Peter, took them over for a week. At 15, responding to an advertisement for the army, he 'Joined the Army to see the World', adding 2 years on to his age in order to do so, and served for 7 years. He did travel, stationed at different places in India and then in the Khyber Pass, before being put through a teacher training course after which he taught in the Regimental School for 18 months. In 1938 he was presented with the famous 50shilling Hepworth suit and £1 for every year of service i.e. £8 in his case.

In September, 1939 he was called up again from his job in Liverpool to join the 87th Field Regiment and mobilised at the Abbey Arms in Delamere. At this point his long connection with Kingsley began, when he and a friend stopped to ask a young Myra Eaton from Hind Cottage in Top Lane the way to the pub. They were married in 1941, shortly before George's embarkation for India and Burma via Cape Town & Madagascar. He returned 4 years later, having survived movements to and fro to Persia, Baghdad, Damascus, Cairo, Algiers, Sicily. He went from Irag to Palestine to take up his commission as Captain. George and Myra then got to know each other. He returned to the Civil Service in Chester and, after gaining a diploma in Vocational Training, was appointed as Youth Employment Officer with Cheshire Education Department in 1948. He remained in this job till 1965, when he was seconded to the Overseas Development and assigned to the Windward Islands (they had to look them up in the atlas!) to make recommendations about the employment of young people. They were based in St Lucia and a new, very different phase in the life of the family, which now included their daughter, Deborah, began.

. George found very few resources available and youth unemployment was between 70 and 80%. With the help of Rotarians worldwide he managed to get things going and two years later a vocational training college was set up in St Lucia. He founded the first Rotary Club there where there are now three. Myra decided to provide some work for the girls by starting up a perfumery, creating local perfumes and toiletries. They loved the life on the island so George decided against going back to his job in Cheshire, and joined Myra at the perfumery. They stayed in St Lucia till they retired back to Hind Cottage in Kingsley in the seventies. Since then he and Myra have led very active lives, playing golf at Sandiway, travelling, gardening, entertaining friends, playing bridge, watching their two grandsons grow up and of course George continued as an active member of Runcorn Rotary Club, which, just before he died, had decided to name a new cup The George Killip Trophy in recognition of his 68 years membership. Now it will be known as The George Killip Memorial Trophy.

George was also SAAFA's Appeals Director in the area for some time and Chairman of the Lewis Carroll Society in Daresbury. He continued to be active , always replying to any enquiry as to how he was with the words 'First Class', till last December when he fell and broke his collar-bone – very nearly '100 and Not Out'!

We all miss you, George.

Kingsley Walking Group



The short walk, on 29 April was a five miler starting from the Plough at Whitegate. A novel route took us through Foxtwist Green, past the back of Petty pool, returning along the Whitegate Way. A dozen or so of us enjoyed the walk and the meal afterwards.

The Long Walk, on 12 May, was from Tegg's Nose Country Park, to the east of Macclesfield. In elevated, rolling countryside we followed a route eastward to Chapel House Farm, then northward towards Lamaload reservoir, returning finally along a section of the Gritstone Way. After dropping off our rucksacks at the cars, we explored Teggs Nose, with its historic quarry and distant views. Returning we passed through a field full of wild pansies. 8.5 miles in all. After a short shower the rest of the day was blustery, which helped to keep us cool on the hill climbs

'We came across this curious signpost, indicating 'This Way', 'That Way', and 'The Other Way'.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the




