## On Stage Near You

### Not already enjoying local shows? You really ought to get out more.

Thanks everybody for the feedback and in particular it was good to see the unanimously positive response to the three Kingsley Players' actors who performed Alan Bennett's '*Talking Heads'* at Kingsley Community Centre just in time for this issue. Whereas it seems Bennett is not everyone's taste, most people enjoyed the pieces selected and hearty congratulations are due to Kingsley Players.

From the other plays featured last month the response we received for Altrincham Garrick's production of '*Two into One*' was that it was disappointing and Altrincham's Little Theatre's '*Move Over Mrs Markham*' was not as good as expected. Better feedback fortunately for Nantwich Players' *Gods of Carnage* with particular praise Charlie Gobbett. We did miss mentioning TipTop's '*Abigail's Party* ' which was liked by everyone.

In June Kingsley Players' *Ian Baines, James Partington* and *Jake Powell* are appearing elsewhere. *Ian* and *James* are at Harlequin Theatre Northwich in Agatha Christie's *And Then There Were None*. This is directed by *Yvette Owen*, an experienced director normally seen at Ashton Heyes but making her Harlequin debut. This should really be worth seeing. The same applies to *Jake*, who played *Bottom* in their 'Bite Sized Shakespeare' last October, and this time is taking on the full role with Frodsham Players' *Midsummer Night's Dream* from 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> at St Lawrence Church, Frodsham. To quote our correspondence it's a chance to see *Jake's* full *Bottom*.

## Kingsley Bookworms – Next meeting 2nd June 2016

Despite holidays, 9 people came to the May meeting. We were happy to welcome two new members to the group. The May book was "Ted Hughes: The Unauthorised Life" by Jonathon Bate. We agreed that the book was quite difficult for some people and that it seemed to cross over between an academic piece of work and a biography. The book included some of Ted Hughes' work and insights into his personal life although it turned out that the family had blocked access to some personal information (which we thought was a shame). The most popular parts of the book were about Hughes' relationships. We scored the book 3.7 and although some people hadn't finished the book we had a particularly interesting discussion.

We decided to mark the 400 years since Shakespeare's death by reading or seeing a play. To help us along, are planning to go to Grosvenor Park on July 15th to see "As You Like It". If anyone would like to join us, we'd be delighted to welcome you. We will talk about the play at our July meeting in preparation for the performance.

Our next book is "The Lie Tree" by Frances Hardinge, described as "a deliciously creepy novel". We will talk about it at our meeting on June 2nd. We will also be choosing our books leading up to the end of the year.

For July we plan to read "Life after Life" by Karen Atkinson (and a short discussion about As You Like IT).

In August we will be reading Villette by Charlotte Bronte.

## KINGSLEY PARISH COUCIL UPATE

Kingsley Parish Council would formally like to place on record its thanks to the outgoing Chairman, Mrs Claire Jones for presiding over a very busy and exceptionally successful year as Chairman. A year which has had many highlights but in particular the recruitment of a new Clerk and two new Parish Councillors, a review of our own structures and processes, the resurgence of the Kingsley and Newton Village Institute (and helped recruit a new and active team of volunteers), and the delivery of a fantastic new scheme at the Playing Fields and personally and successfully negotiated funding from an external body of over £50,000. Claire has been involved in all and led many of these initiatives and has given over many, many hours of her own time to make a positive difference for those living in the village.

Deputy Cllr Danny Moores is stepping up as Chair for the forthcoming year, with Cllr Chris Pownall taking over as Deputy.

#### Tree Planting

With the help of various groups and organisations around the village, the Parish Council have now successfully planted 100 trees, obtained from the Woodland Trust, at the playing field. It was important to plant the small 'whips' immediately in order to ensure they would survive, so they have been planted in various locations around the edge of the field. From Autumn onwards, and once the 'whips' have grown on, we will be looking to thin out and relocate some of these new trees to other more appropriate locations around the village. Later in the year, the Parish Council will look to commission work that will help to develop a management plan for the ongoing management of the existing trees and shrubs on the playing field.

## FRIENDS' 2016-2017 RENEWAL NOTICE

The first Financial Year for Kingsley & Newton Village Institute under the new Management Committee is now drawing to a close. The support that we have received from those of you who have become a Friend of the Institute has been invaluable : quite simply, we could not have done what we have done, without you.

If you have not yet become a Friend of Kingsley & Newton Village Institute, please read on!

#### Our payment structure for the Financial Year 2016/17 is as follows :

Those who wish to use the facilities of the Institute shall become Friends of the Institute by virtue of making a donation of £15. This payment is asked for as a contribution to the Institute for consolidation of the financial position whilst the Management Committee seeks to improve the facilities and the fabric of the building. We stress that the Committee will use its discretion for any known cases of hardship.

#### Tennis & Bowls : to be an Adult/Adult Family member of the KNVI Bowls and Tennis sections you must be a Friend of KNVI.

<u>Membership of Bowls and Tennis</u>: the following list of charges applies to both Bowls and Tennis, which is to say that one payment will enable you to play either tennis or bowls **or both**. This is a significant change in the membership structure. Persons becoming members must register their interest for either bowls or tennis or both and must agree to abide by the rules and playing etiquette of both disciplines. Each section will be managed by a working committee which will be responsible to the KNVI Management Committee.

#### Fees :

- a. Adult membership £20 annually
- b. Junior membership (under 18 yrs) £10 annually
- c. Family membership £45 annually
- d. Pay to Play : £2.50 per time for both tennis and bowls
- e. Student membership (for all those in full time education) : £10

**Guests** : Bowls and tennis members will be entitled to take a guest with them free of charge to use the sports facilities but this will be limited to three occasions annually for the same guest after which time the guest will be asked to comply with one of the above memberships.

**Tuition :** Any Friend of KNVI will be permitted to use the bowling green and tennis courts for tuition arranged by the bowling and tennis sections for a limited time to establish whether they wish to pursue the activity.

**Friends' Children :** Any child whose parent/s is /are Friends of KNVI may join in any activity of KNVI. **With respect to bowls and tennis,** Friends must be members of one of these sections for their child(ren) to qualify. This is designed to allow children to play the sport **with their parents.** If the child wishes to use the facilities otherwise then he/she must become a Junior member of the relevant section.

**Kingsley & Newton Village Institute** is a registered charity (no. 517740) providing a Village Hall and other facilities primarily for the people of Kingsley but also for others.

The support scheme "Friends of KNVI" that was launched by the KNVI Management Committee in 2015 has helped restore the financial viability of the Village Institute and it has generated new interest in the Institute's facilities. You, as a Friend of KNVI, would play a vital role in conserving what is a wonderful asset for the community. An added bonus is that, as a registered charity, additional income is available for the Institute through Gift Aid if you are a taxpayer. In 2015-2016 we have been able to reclaim over £800 through this scheme. We sincerely hope that you will support us in this way as we move forward.

#### FINAL OUTDOOR DEVELOPMENTS

The outdoor developments have finally been completed at Kingsley St John's.

Using the £10,000 National Lottery grant and additional funds contributing from the school budget there have been some wonderful developments within the school grounds. The tyre park was an exciting installation earlier in the year, and there has been very positive feedback from the children about the impact of this on their playtimes.

Additionally, the school council opted for a scramble net and zig-zag balance beam to complete the trim trail. There have been completed with a safety, all-weather surfacing that creates a loop around the equipment.

The perimeter path has also been developed so that the children can complete their daily circuits around the school field. This has been a task that has been eagerly awaited by parents and children to escape the muddy field. In an effort to combine these projects with the curriculum and the aging aspects of other parts of the outdoor provision, the school held a volunteer day. We were overwhelmed by the generosity and hard work of those involved. As a result we now have:-

An accessible pond, hopscotch, willow sculptures, a mosaic reflection area, a new quiet reading area, decorative, bright plant area, overgrown shrubs removed and an enormous willow crocodile.

What an amazing achievement!



## Kingsley Walking Group

15 people joined the Short Walk on 27 April. Starting from Norley Village Hall and entering Delamere Forest via the Delamere Way. The route skirted the edge of the forest to the east of the main road, 'climbing' Hart Hill



The Long Walk, on 10 May, was from Bunbury. Starting by the village church we skirted the cemetery to head north towards Tilstone Bank to reach the Shropshire Union canal. Following the tow-path eastward we arrived at the double Bunbury Locks, where volunteers were on hand to assist barges through the locks. We took an early lunch there as light drizzle started to fall. Subsequently, we continued further along the canal-side before returning to Bunbury village by a circuitous route over fields and finally past Bunbury's old watermill. Rani had set in for the afternoon, but we avoided the worst of it. Eight of us walked the 8.5 miles

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.


