Kingsley Parish Council Meeting 16 May 2017

Members of the Public Five members of the public attended the meeting, as well as two PCSOs.

Planning applications. Five planning applications were received. Hillfield Meeting House 17/01476/FUL demolition of ground floor extension, 2 Westbrook Rd 17/01739/FUL single storey extension, Smithy House 17/01939/FUL demolition of rear extension, Linden Cottage 17/01939/CAT fell willow tree, The Firs Newton Hollows 17/01439/FUL demolition of existing building & erection of 5 dwellings.

Playing Field. Freedom of Information Request received re dog complaints and this was responded to within the 20 day time scale. Signs will be placed on the railings of the enclosed childrens play area stating dogs not allowed entrance. A dog control survey will be sent out to the community during the summer asking for views on dog control. It is hoped that funding may be found later this year for the 3 final pieces of play equipment. Quotations are to be sought with regard to further tree maintenance within the playing field.

Cemetery. The Boardroom has now been decorated both inside and out, the new floor has been laid and a heater installed to help prevent damp. Funding is being sought to improve the war memorial and also planning is continuing on the proposed new cremation area in the Extension.

Middle Lane. Council voted against the proposal of a One Way System in Middle Lane.

PCSO Neil Flanagan reported that a Community Speed Watch Group has been set up in Kingsley. He is looking for more volunteers and can be contacted on neil.flanagan@cheshire.pnn.police.uk

Neighbourhood Plan A working party is to be set up in order to gauge the interest within the parish as to whether a Neighbourhood Plan would be wanted for Kingsley. A community event will be arranged for those interested to attend. A Neighbourhood Plan would be a community led framework for guiding the future development and growth of the parish. Further information will become available in due course.

Defibrillator Training Now the 2 defibs are in place within the village a free training session will take place on Tuesday 13 June at 7.30pm in the Community Centre in order for us to learn how to use the defibs. Posters will be placed around the village and it will be advertised on the village website and facebook. Everyone is very welcome so please come along just in case that occasion arrives when we have to use the defibrillators.

PLEASE NOTE that the Minutes of the Parish Council's meetings are placed on the village website each month.

Kingsley Walking Group



The short walk on 26 April was along the river Dee estuary and nearby wooded areas, starting from Flint castle, with views across the water and sightings of birdlife. Conditions were dry and bright, but with a biting cold wind. Eighteen of us enjoyed the walk, and afterwards lunch at 'The Mill' tavern in Flint.

For our long walk, on 9 May, we took the Llangollen steam train from Berwyn station to Carrog. From the station we crossed the Dee at Pont Carrog and climbed steeply to join the Clwydian Way. At around 1000', we were then able to enjoy the stunning views over the Dee Valley and, later, to the north of the ridge. The walk was then mainly level along a broad path, before dropping down to the car park at Berwyn, over-looking the Horseshoe Falls. 9 miles. Highly recommended to anyone contemplating a reasonably strenuous walk. Ten of us enjoyed the walk and the sunny weather.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.

Gooseberry Slice

350g Self Raising Flour
175g Margarine
175g Caster Sugar
2 Eggs
225g Gooseberries
One crushed Weetabix biscuit

Line the base of a greased Swiss Roll tin with crushed Weetabix, make a soft pastry mix by rubbing flour and margarine together to form bread-crumbs, add caster sugar and eggs and mix to a dough. Roll out the pastry on a floured surface and lay in strips over the crushed Weetabix covering the base of the tin. Cover with uncooked gooseberries and bake in 160C oven / Gas Mk 3 oven for 45mins to 1 hour until firm and golden. Cut into slices to serve. Can be eaten as a tray bake or as a dessert with cream.

Kingsley Bookworms

Next meeting 8th June 2017 at the Red Bull at 8.00

At our April meeting we talked about "The Vance Legacy by R Haywood Glen". The book is set in the southern United States, against a backdrop of slavery and life on a tobacco plantation. We accidentally chose a book only available on Kindle. We have managed to make sure that everyone that wants to has access to Kindle. Is this a sign of things to come?

This book led to an interesting discussion. We found it to be full of typos, inconsistencies and poor grammar. On discovering that the book was self published, we decided to focus our discussion on the merits (and otherwise) of self publishing, using some research showing that about 30% of books added by Amazon are self published – but it is difficult to distinguish these books from others. Overall, we decided that editors "earn their keep" and protect us from books like this one. The statistics show that only a tiny minority of self published books achieve significant sales or recognition. For the first time ever, we didn't score the book as no one was willing to give it more than 1.

Our June book is "The Outrun" by Amy Liptrot This book is set in Orkney. The book was nominated for the Ondaatje prize "for a distinguished work of fiction evoking the spirit of a place". A full list of our books for 2017 is on our Facebook page.
