

There are still a few to see and no doubt some will be looking for nominations for the upcoming Cheshire Theatre Guild Awards in July in which Kingsley Players triumphed last year. At the time of writing we are looking forward to Kingsley Players Youth production, *James and the Giant Peach*. We hear, however, that Kingsley Players are also in preparation for their October play. Alan Ayckbourn's popular comedy *How The Other Half Loves* and they are pleased to welcome back *Malcolm Barker* as director who was last directing with them for *A Bunch of Amateurs* and from the cast of that play he is joined by Jo Oultram, Neil Silcock and Phil Murray. Players are also delighted to welcome back Simon Heatherington (*Peterloo*) and Lesley Silcock after a break from treading the boards at Kingsley together with experienced newcomer Pollie Shorthouse.

For July we have:

The raffle was the biggest single contributor to the financial success of the day, and raised just short of £500. We had approximately 60 prizes, which was amazing. Kingsley Garden Club - June 2019

The May meeting saw an attendance of 26 people, who came to be part of our AGM and to listen to Jacqueline Iddon's talk entitled "Location, Location, Location". Jacqueline runs a nursery in Lancashire and also opens her gardens under the NGS scheme twice a year, she filled three tables full of perennial plants which she used as part of her presentation, and then later sold them on to members. Jacqueline is passionate about the use of perennials and the location and mixing of various species to give the desired effects including the wide use of planting in pots which can be moved around the garden and taken into a cold greenhouse or frame over winter.

The meeting began with our annual AGM, this year focusing mainly on the finances of the club, and the fact that we had, over the last three years, to dip into reserves to the tune of over £250 a year to meet the running cost, which in the main part is the cost of speakers. In the 2018/19 season our costs were £807, whilst our income was £565. Our current annual subscription has stood at £8 for members and £2 for visitors for a considerable number of years, this clearly does not cover the cost of running the club. In the current year the average cost of speaker and hall hire has amounted to £115.Carrying on at this expenditure would see the club wound up in three years. It was agreed by members present, that this was not an option they wished to consider. A vote was taken, and a majority (18 to 7) voted for a significant increase in costs.

The committee has met subsequent to the AGM and can now advise the following, for the 2019/20 season:

- Annual membership will increase to £15. This will be held at this value for 2 years.
- Visitors will be charged at £4 per meeting
- The raffle would stand at 50p per ticket

The committee will review, prior to the 2020 AGM, the costs to date and will advise at the meeting of any changes that may be required. It is hoped that the increased income this year, will allow us to invite higher quality speakers for 2020/21. The 2019/20 season will see an additional speaker for a June meeting, which will also be our AGM. We will be introducing a members and visitors register to be signed at each meeting to assist in our accountancy and auditing at the year end.

Gardening Tips and Jobs to be done

- Provide supports for herbaceous perennials, especially for heavy flowering plants.
- Ensure you water newly planted trees and shrubs to prevent drought stress.
- Harden off seedlings and bedding plants for around a week before planting out.
- Keep containers well watered even after it has rained.
- Hoe borders regularly to keep weeds down.
- Pinch out side shoots on tomatoes
- Mow lawns at least once a week to a height of 15mm (half an inch)
- Plant out summer bedding
- Prune spring flowering shrubs that have finished flowering (Chelsea Chop)

We look forward to seeing new and old members alike for the new season of meetings in September, more details next month.

SURVEY QUESTIONNAIRE

Kingsley Community Centre is run by Kingsley Community Association (KCA), a charity established in 1976. The Centre consists of a large hall, a function room, a kitchen and a bar. The Hall turns into a pop up theatre with tiered seating for 120 people.

The Community Centre was built by members of the local community 40 years ago. It is used for many different functions, ranging from ceilidhs, birthday parties, christenings, dinner dance events, black-tie events and many more. The Centre is also used for various groups including Yoga, Youth Group, Women's Institute, Gardening Club, Karate, Pilates, Zumba and Tai Chi.

The Community Centre is also used by the local drama group, "The Kingsley Players" which is a multi-award winning group and one of the leading amateur groups in Cheshire. The Kingsley Youth Theatre was formed in 2016 for those aged 7 to 18 yrs.

Since the Co-op moved to occupy the former Horseshoe pub, (in front of the Community Centre), the Centre is now more obviously at the heart of the village, and KCA's Management Committee is now seeking to build on the Centre's existing contribution to community activities.

We are interested in the improvements that you would most like to see to enhance the services that the Centre can provide.

In particular, the Management Committee considers that an extension to the Centre, providing an additional meeting room, would be desirable to increase the services that the Centre could provide. It would also allow for more efficient theatre productions. Whilst this would not increase the maximum volume of traffic/usage (which is a function of the size of the Hall, which would not change), it would allow for greater booking flexibility, and therefore increase the uses to which the Centre's facilities could be put.

An important factor in securing grant funding is to provide evidence of community support for the project. Even if you have not already had the opportunity to use the Community Centre facilities, please consider that your support will help us to develop an improved facility for the community.




