SAVES ENERGY COSTI



KCA is a community charity – we're not funded by the Council and we pay our way through hiring out the Community Centre's facilities and hopefully providing services that the community wants. It's important to us to manage our operating costs carefully and look to run our Centre as efficiently as possible.

KCA was an early investor in solar panels, installing them in late 2011. The panels generate around 5700 kwh of electricity each year and, because we were an early investor, the panels earn a feed in tariff (income paid to us by the electricity company) of over £3000 each year. This income goes a long way to keeping down the costs of running the Community Centre and will be paid to us for a further fourteen years.

However.... We don't use much of this renewable energy ourselves!

Because most of our electricity consumption is used for lighting, obviously in the evenings, whereas solar panels work during the day, we only use around 15% of our solar power generation, with the rest going into the National system, to be used elsewhere. The same is true of most domestic solar panel installations.

Good for the country, but not so good for our Community Centre.

So now, KCA has invested in a storage battery. It doesn't take up much room – it's around 100 cm high by 70 cm wide and only 15 cm deep.


Each day, this will allow the electricity generated through our solar panels to be stored and used later in the evening for lighting. This still won't use all our solar power generation – we generate more power than we can use in the summer, and not enough power in the winter to meet our electricity consumption.

It should though, mean that we increase our use of our solar power generation from the current 15% up to between 60% to 70%.

This should cut our electricity bills by around two-thirds! The storage battery comes with a 10 year performance guarantee which should mean that the battery should work together with the solar panels for most, and hopefully all, of the panels' remaining life.

Storage batteries come at a cost, however, so does this make sense financially? We think so, not least because we already have the solar panels which are paying for themselves through the feed in tariff that we signed up to eleven years ago. It would be more difficult to start from scratch today, investing in both panels and battery storage and looking to recover that investment cost in both, rather than just the battery storage.

You may not see the battery operating when you visit the Centre, but it's doing its job and keeping down the cost of operating your Community Centre!

UPDATE

It's now been 10 months since our new coach Jane Wright started at Kingsley Tennis Club, based at the Kingsley & Newton Village Institute. During this time, coaching has taken place for various age groups and abilities, from complete beginners to more advanced players. We have seen the start of new classes including Cardio Tennis, a fitness tennis session. We have also held our first intraclub doubles competitions, taken part in friendly matches against Helsby Tennis Club and competed in the Cheshire Winter League against tennis clubs across Cheshire. All in all, a lot has been going on since Jane started as our coach.

Jane is currently introducing tennis to pupils at both Kingsley St John's C.E. Primary School and Crowton Christ Church C of E Primary School. Jane is also due to go into Kingsley Community Primary and Nursery School to provide tennis coaching to the lower age groups with a view to encouraging players to come and play at Kingsley Tennis Club. If you notice your children asking about tennis and they have never been to the courts in Kingsley, then come along and have a look at the fantastic facility we have on our doorstep.

Jane is a LTA Level 4 Senior Coach and has experience of coaching and developing players of all ages and abilities. Tennis is a fantastic way to keep fit and active and it can be enjoyed at whatever level you play. To widen access to tennis for all age groups, Jane is keen to run a new starter class for both those who have never played before and those who haven't picked up a racket for many years.
