### HELP ME TO TRACE MY ANCESTORS

I have received the following email from Australia and was wondering if anybody had any of the information he is asking for.

I have some questions about Kinglsey, based on my Great Grandfather who died in November 1944 and is buried at the Kingsley Cemetery.

His name was Captain John Thomas Ball MC, of the Manchester Regiment. He moved his family to Kingsley at some stage in the 1930's, and he passed away at 'Nursery Cottage, Kingsley' as stated on his death certificate on16th November 1944. His funeral was held at the Kingsley Church and was buried in the cemetery. The grave is in section E number 79, which I have found in the Cheshire Archives (via email of course!)

I am wondering if there is a good local contact to find more information, particularly about where 'Nursery Cottage' may be, and any records of their (John Thomas and Mary Elizabeth Ball)residence. I would also love a copy of any newspaper clippings that may exist from the time as an obituary or death notice, as he was a soldier of some repute during the Boer and First World Wars.

Although I would dearly love to go on a fact finding mission myself, I am in Australia so it is a bit out of the question!

#### **GARDEN CLUB NEWS**

Our last garden was 1000 feet above sea level on the edge of moorland and the drifted snow lay around for weeks sometimes, so I really looked forward to returning to Cheshire and easier gardening.

A house we fell in love with, a lovely view and for me, a blank canvas garden totally beguiled us. The summer breezes were softly welcoming, the sun shone and I couldn't wait to start on our new garden now that I was back in these gentler climes.

Cold though the area may have been, our last garden had been part of a Gentlmen's Bowling Club, and so had a perfectly flat, professionally drained lawn - whereas a large part of our new one had been a marl pit with the obvious steep gradient. Just how steep it was I soon realised after traversing the length of the garden once or twice, even without the weight of a wheelbarrow! The welcoming gentle breezes were more often good strong winds which rushed at speed into the garden through the gateway in the high wall, down the slope, ripping straight across my embryonic vegetable plot with nothing to stop them on their way to the Cheshire plain. The first hanging basket I put up swung and whirled so madly with such disastrous consequences that I was forced to invest in wall baskets instead at the first opportunity. The priorities in my garden design had to change rapidly with windbreaks to the fore.

The flat area I had chosen for my vegetables and fruit proved to be the best area in Cheshire for slugs of every different colour and size imaginable (or even unimaginable), and where they obviously bred extremely well. They are of a particularly voracious nature and can wipe out overnight any row of seedlings, any unprotected new plants, and, so it seems, almost anything green and tasty as long as it isn't a weed. More than once I have collected and dunked in strong salt water over a hundred and fifty slugs of varying sorts in one small area on a mild damp evening! Additionally, my attempt at growing sweetcorn just resulted in total devastation of the area after a couple of visits by hungry badgers.

Easy gardening? Well.....is it ever? And twenty three years on, easy, winding steps have tamed the gradient, mature shrubs, hedges and conifers have lessened the wind damage, the slugs and I quietly continue our battle and I can now enjoy growing a vast range of things impossible before. Would I like to move to somewhere flat and perhaps less windy? Absolutely not.

After taking apologies for absence, the President opened the meeting with an account of the last Group meeting, at which the speaker gave an interesting talk on her "open " farm in Market Drayton; Acton Bridge won the Group bursary. She also drew our attention to a leaflet from the County. The Cheshire Federation would like members to oppose the plan to split Cheshire into three areas. Not only would it be expensive to set up, it could financially affect local W.I.s.

The rest of the meeting was taken up by the members viewing all the exhibits and voting for the best in each class and the best overall. This last was won by the President with an arrangement featuring a single white lily. The raffle was held and the President closed the meeting with a request for ideas for a Christmas event.

#### FARM UPDATEJULY 2007

June started off very warm and dry. The early potatoes have grown very quickly, despite the dry weather, proving again the old saying 'early potatoes need a wet head and a dry bed'. Meaning they like dry sunny weather and can survive on morning dew and light showers. Yields have been very good but demand has been slow causing the price to come down. We are waiting for the chip shops to start buying new crop. This will increase demand and hopefully steady the price.

The wheat and barley have had all their feeds and sprays and we are waiting for them to ripen. We just need some sunny weather now.

About half our 44 bird boxes were put up in time for spring, and quite a number have been occupied by various birds which are rearing plenty of young. The rest will go up in the autumn. Our RSPB advisor has confirmed we have a colony of tree sparrows already.

The new pond is establishing well and a brood of ducklings has taken residence and are thriving. We have had only two lambs born this year so far. This is poor show out of eight ewes. Rambo mustn't have fancied the other ones!!! I'll have to have a quiet word in his ear. If he doesn't perform better next year, its – MINT SAUCE!

Harry our pup is now a young dog. 12 months old. Still as mad as a March hare, but loveable just the same. I can't imagine life without him now. He is a good companion, but is still driving Liz mad with his 'chewing habit'. So far this week, he has devoured one of the kids roller blades, a plastic hen feeder , a 6' x 2' plant trellis and one of George's working boots!!!

We still have two little kittens left if anyone is interested, phone Liz.

Finally, our FARM OPEN DAY. Well – what can I say! Over 500 people through the farm gates on 10<sup>th</sup> June. We were absolutely flabbergasted. A regular scam that we come across is the purchasing of items via internet sites and foreign buyer promising to send a banker's draft to purchase the item. The item may cost £2000 and the draft will be made out for £4000. The buyer then will ask for the remaining money to be sent back to them. This is a scam and a very regular one. The banker's draft will invariably be bogus and in the time it takes to clear the seller may well have sent the money back to them. We get lots of these scams especially from Asia, but they are becoming prevalent in Europe.
