

Thanks to everyone who made it possible for us to take Jack to the Autism Treatment of America. Jack now has a Son Rise intensive home based programme specifically designed for him by the Autism Treatment Centre and gave us the knowledge and skills to develop and supervise the running of the programme.

He enjoyed his time in the Son–Rise room so much that the only time he wanted to leave was at bed time, when tiredness completely got the better of him. Jack worked his socks off, so much was learnt and achieved, we were so proud of him. It was so encouraging to hear from Son-Rise that Jack has the potential to be a "little talker" and then be informed that there is "possibility that Jack maybe able to read and comprehend words that he is not at the moment verbally using".

Only one week back from America and we can already see improvements in Jacks speech and interaction. He even now sits at every meal at the table without wandering around with food that he did previously which is a shame for Nell the Dog who misses cleaning up after him!

We now have more direction and the skills but we are falling below the target hours that we need to help Jack so we are anxious to find help from new volunteers. Any persons interested and would like more information please contact Natalie.

We also need to make some changes to Jacks play room. Soft lino is a definite we would like after working with this surface at the Treatment Centre. It is so much cleaner, safer and easier to work and play on. The way Jack ran, bounced, spun and played on the surface convinced us this was an important quest when we got back, also a more sturdy table and chairs so that Jack can begin to eat his meals in his room so he is not going to and from the room during the day so his program is continuously running

With all Jack's developments we wish to go back to the treatment Centre. Hopefully within the next 12months, so there will be a few more fund raising events between now and then. Jack's next fundraiser is a disco and the bar at Kingsley Community Centre on Friday 9th July tickets are £7 each and starts at 7.30pm.


