A community based art installation of clay objects, made by Dee Rollinson and local people brought together to form one huge cross of thanks. The written inspiration behind individual pieces will also be on show.



#### Kingsley, Crowton & Norley Mothers' Union

The career of Mrs Pam Lee, one of our own members, has been in midwifery. She was the speaker at our June meeting and spoke, with great concern and sensitivity, about Cultural Issues for African Women. For thousands of years, many countries have followed the tradition of female circumcision and genital mutilation (FGM) and in Africa an estimated 92 million girls from 10 years of age and above have undergone FGM. Long term consequences can include an increased risk of childbirth complications and newborn deaths. The World Health Organisation is generating knowledge about the causes and consequences of the practice, how to eliminate it and how to care for those who have experienced FGM.

Jane Knight will talk about the Diocesan Counselling Service at our next meeting on July 5<sup>th</sup> and on Tuesday August 2<sup>nd</sup> there will be a coffee evening at Cook's Hill, Kingswood at 7.30 p.m. in aid of the work of the Mothers' Union.

We meet on the first Tuesday in the month at 7.30 p.m. in the Church Room, Kingsley, and anyone is welcome to join us.



#### Big news this month: **KINGSLEY ALLOTMENT SOCIETY**

The society, which is one of the groups set-up by KTI, has now achieved full planning permission for 17 allotments and its bid for £9,700 of funding from the Lottery fund has also been accepted. The society comprises 21 plot holders and a short waiting list.

The plot for the allotments is close to Chapel Lane, and changes to the land will start to occur during the next few months albeit with little visual impact. Work carried out will be in accordance with the conditions agreed with CW&C council and society members will seek to cause minimal disturbance.


#### What is the Kingsley Transition Initiative?

#### Wheel-4-Wheels

On 7<sup>th</sup> April 2012, two local men will set out to cycle over 3500 miles from Los Angeles California to Boston Massachusetts. Pacific to Antlantic - the US coast to coast. They are aiming to ride across the mountains and deserts of the US in around 35 days, ie around 100 miles a day – every day. That is some target, even for the fit and healthy! By doing so they will raise money to provide powered wheelchairs for disabled children in our area, a truly worthy cause that will bring immense change to those children we can help, (of which there are an estimated 70,000 in the UK.)

#### FARM UPDATE JUNE 2011

#### **NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM**

As a farmer, I find that people are generally very interested in what I do. It amazes me that most people have an opinion on farming, whether or not they have driven a tractor or milked a cow. Some of these views range from the good to bad to the downright ridiculous. This interest can work both ways. It is encouraging that a school can ring up to ask if they can visit our farm. On the other hand it is not so good to open our daily paper to find farmers accused of a host of sins.

As farmers we are involved in two fundamental issues - food production and countryside management. Everyone eats food and most care for the British Countryside. 80% of farms are run by family businesses with modest turnovers. In Britain we have lost nearly half of these family farms in the last forty years. As food has become cheaper, farms have had to get larger. By supporting British farmers with your custom you will be doing your bit to reverse this regrettable decline. You will also be encouraging high animal welfare standards. British Farmers have some of the highest animal welfare standards in the world. There are more free-range hens in the UK than anywhere else in Europe. UK pig farmers do not us tethers and stalls, in contrast to their foreign competitors. Beef farmers do not use veal crates, or hormones to boost growth, found abroad. UK arable farmers do not use GM technology ie: we do not grow crops from plants that have been Genetically Modified to either increase yields or make them immune to certain diseases. But genetically modified foods are still imported into this country. The GM industry is massive worldwide, and a huge majority of crops grown abroad are GM, particularly maize (sweetcorn) and rice. You will see it on the list of ingredients of food packets as: 'modified maize starch'. As food prices climb higher I think the GM steamroller is unstoppable, and will soon burst into Europe and this country.

Some of you may have seen the Red Tractor logo on food in supermarkets. This only appears on food of British origin, and Warburtons Farms has been Red Tractor Assured for over 10 years. With this assurance you can be sure your food has been produced to stringent standards that are independently inspected. These standards cover all aspects of farm production from looking after the countryside

to food hygiene, from how animals are cared for to what they are fed. The best reason to buy British farm produce, is of course because it tastes good, very very good!

There has been a lot in the news recently about the severe drought in the Southeast of the country. The Government has announced a Drought Order. This means that anyone who uses water has to get extra permission from Defra. The main users of water are: agriculture, industry and leisure. All will be monitored to try and ensure that no rivers or sources of water dry up completely. There will be huge pressure put on Defra as to who has priority of the available supply. Agriculture needs it to try to grow bigger crops to keep a lid on food prices and inflation. Industry will say that it needs the water to safeguard its jobs, and conservationists will say they need the water leaving in the rivers to keep the fish and wildlife surviving. Who will win? From past experience: as soon as a Drought Order is announced, it rains incessantly. We shall see. It is already too late for a large amount of crops.

We still have a few beautiful little kittens for sale, well socialised, dog friendly, wormed and litter trained, ready early July.

Carrier bags and egg boxes are needed for re-use at our Hatley Farm Shop. Many thanks to all our customers who are recycling them. Please drop them in if you are passing.

With the recent warm and humid weather, we have had to keep an eye on our ewes, as they have not been sheared yet. Liz noticed that with all the rich fresh grass, some had very dirty bottoms. We needed to check for 'fly strike'. This is when blue bottle flies lay their eggs in dirt on the ewes fleece. The eggs soon hatch into maggots, which then try to burrow into the skin. This can be fatal if not caught and treated early. We needed to trim their dirty bottoms. Liz was despatched to find clippers and rubber gloves (she gets all the best jobs!). In turn they were all neatly trimmed, me at one end, Liz at the other, sprayed with an insecticide and turned out to the lovely fresh grass again. Thankfully, we only have 6 pet ewes!
