#### Parish Plan

The implementation phase of the plan is now well underway with a number of exciting new projects being considered for the village. These include the following:

**Bulb planting** – a group has been set up to help with the planting of 1000's of new bulbs and flowers around the village. Cheshire West and Chester Council have offered their support to the scheme and will possibly make a financial contribution along with the Parish Council.

**Ashworth Time Bank** – are looking at holding a number of new activities in the village such as yoga and creative writing. They are currently looking for new trustees. **Kingsley Institute** – are holding an Open Day in August where children will be offered tennis coaching. Further information will be available in due course but if you have any questions in the meantime, please contact Councillor Crane on 01928 787629

**Film Club** – The Management of Kingsley Community Centre are currently exploring the potential for a film club at the centre. Further details are available from the centre Chairman, Mike Butler, on 01928 788125.

**Theatre Group** – Councillor Wilson is setting up a theatre group for people in the village who are interested in attending shows at various theatres around the region. Please contact him for further details (tel: 01928 787678).

**Traffic and Transport Group** – met in June to discuss a number of traffic issues around the village that were raised as part of the parish plan consultation. One of the first actions is to speak to the police about ways to tackle local speeding problems.

#### **Traffic and Transport**

Cllr Moores met with officers from Cheshire West and Chester Council's highways department to discuss a number of issues. The Council have agreed to: rectify damage caused to pavements by tree roots in Westbrook Road; edge the grass verge on the pavement along Brookside and the Brow as it is encroaching on the pavement; look into the drainage issues along Hollow Lane

and Mill Lane; and investigate hedges which are overhanging pavements on Mill Lane and Well Lane.

Discussions were also held with the Council about the narrow road and pavement on the main road by St.John's Church. A number of options are being currently considered by the Parish Council, including moving the lamppost on this stretch of pavement and providing an alternative footpath route through the cemetery. Cheshire West and Chester Council have currently ruled out the possibility of narrowing the road at this location with a chicane system due to inadequate sightlines. Any other thoughts or ideas on how to tackle traffic problems in this area would be gratefully received (Cllr Moores - 01928 787199).

#### Village Enhancement

Cllr Jones is looking into replacing a number of the village noticeboards as several of them have fallen into a state of disrepair. The Council is also looking into providing some Christmas lights and decorations around the village this year and discussions are being held with the Co-op and pharmacy about a number of options.

Cllr Cliff is exploring the possibility of a new Jubilee commemorative bench to replace the current broken one next to the recently-restored Cheshire Railings on Top Road. The Council has also requested a number of new Jubilee trees which will be planted at various locations around the village.



Carol Ann Duffy will be appearing at Frodsham Community Centre on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> September and Dr Who writer Eddie Robson escapes from the Tardis to launch a special science fiction weekend on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> September, complete with Daleks.

Marking Charles Dickens' 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary will be talks by academic Juliet John and a dramatised version of *A Christmas* Carol performed by Gerald Dickens at the Heathercliffe Hotel, in aid of Claire House Children's Hospice on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> September

Marvel comics, crime writing, poetry events, an open mic night, a Daphne du Maurier afternoon tea at the Old Hall Hotel and numerous workshops in drama, cartoons, book-making and creative-writing will provide a wide range of fun events for both adults and children to enjoy.

## KINGSLEY PARISH PLAN Spring bulb-planting update

In May the Kingsley Parish Council gave the go-ahead for the spring bulb-planting venture. This is excellent news and we would like to thank the Council for agreeing to this. The idea is to enhance the existing spring flowers in some areas and in others to bring colour and vibrancy to an otherwise green verge. The choice of areas has been mostly self-selecting as the emphasis is to plant in the approaches to Kingsley and in two central areas. The flowers will be mostly a mix of shades of yellow, large trumpet daffodils, and in appropriate areas some English bluebells and fritillarias. The planting of these bulbs will enhance the environment of the village.

The aim is to have the bulbs available for planting at the weekends around the end of September/beginning of October. It will greatly depend on what sort of summer we have, as the ground will need to be reasonably soft. We have thousands of bulbs to plant and we hope many of you will come and join us! We will keep you informed via the Kingsley News in September (there is no publication in August), but please aim to keep some time free to help us.


