KINGSLEY PARISH COUNCIL June 2013

Superfast Broadband

Andrew Arditti from the Connecting Cheshire Partnership (the four Cheshire Councils and BT) attended this month's Parish Council meeting to outline the details of a £28.5m project to bring superfast broadband to rural parts of Cheshire. He explained that by 2016 over 96% of Cheshire will be able to access high-speed fibre broadband (up to 80Mbps). Andrew described Kingsley as a 'slow area' for broadband within the county, with 54% of the village receiving less than 2Mbps. He assured us that the village will be upgraded but that at this stage he was unable to tell us exactly when the work will take place. Those communities that will be included in the first phase of the roll-out will be announced in December.

You can register your demand for faster and more reliable broadband at www.connectingcheshire.org.uk. So far, 98 people have responded to the campaign in Kingsley. If more people register, it may mean that our upgrade will be carried out sooner.

Connecting Cheshire is also looking for 'Digital Champions' to help to raise awareness of poor speeds and to promote digital literacy across Cheshire. So far they have no volunteers in our area. FARM UPDATE JUNE 2013

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

June finally seems to have realised that it is summer, and the weather has warmed up. With long hot days, land has dried out and crops are growing vigorously to catch up. All our crops: wheat, pots and oil seeds are approx 3 weeks behind normal. Potato harvesting started on 29 May, the latest for years and our new potatoes are still available at Hatley Farm, Frodsham.

There was a big summit this week, when all the big-wigs and professors who work in weather forecasting (and think they know what they are talking about) met to decide on what they think Britain's weather is going to do over the next few years/decades. And guess what, they couldn't decide what was going to happen!!! They covered their backs by announcing that it would remain 'changeable'. The press called it 'soggy summers' which, in reality is what we have always had. People say they want a hot summer, but don't say when they call 'summer'. Is it May, June, July, August or September? If it was hot and dry all these months, we would have desert conditions in the countryside, huge water restrictions, decimated wildlife, forest fires and massive leaps in food prices.

As you may have realised, I am a huge 'Climate Change' sceptic. We have always had mild wet winters, with occasionally cold spells and warm wet summers with occasional hot, dry spells. The Press report we have had the wettest, coldest or hottest months/year on record, but these records only go back 100 years at the most. What happened in the thousands of years prior we will never know.

The Environment Secretary has again raised the issue of GM foods, saying we should be allowed to grow trial plots of GM wheat, oilseeds etc in the UK, to evaluate how they would suit our growing conditions. The EU has a blanket ban on the growing or importing of GM produce, but most of the rest of the world is pressing ahead with trials and growing millions of acres of GM rice, wheat, maize and oilseeds. Our press predictably calls them "Frankenstein Foods" and other scare stories emerge. Until we conduct proper trials, we will never know if these GM crops will be any advantage to us. There is an old saying:

"Never criticise farmers with your mouth full", and with a booming population growth we will have to look at all options to increase food production.



What is happening at Kingsley Community Primary & Nursery School?

We have had a very busy month in school since we last wrote:

Our **brass band** has been out in the community performing to different groups of people. They began at the Kingsley local produce market and subsequently took part in a band tour around the local area. The children were proud to perform to the toddlers at Homestead Day Nursery; to the local community at the Frodsham market and to the wider community at the bandstand by the river in Chester.

Year 3 has taken part in it's first residential visit. The class

had a fantastic time at Burwardsley, an outdoor education centre run by Cheshire West and Chester Council. The children particularly enjoyed tasting the ice-creams at the Cheshire Farm Ice-cream factory, climbing up to Beeston castle, walking along the Sandstone trail, sketching the local church, learning about life for the Celts in the past by exploring the round house and making a candle at the Candle workshop.

Year I have visited the Cathedral in Chester to find out about churches in the past. The children enjoyed a range of activities including dressing up as monks, making gingerbread monks and taking part in a maths trail.

We were however extremely pleased to reach the finish and to take advantage of the local geo thermal baths.

My little boy - JACK

One night in Oct 2008 my husband Mark went to hear someone talking in Manchester. We didn't know anything about him but he went along. That man was Raun Kaufman and he was talking about the Son-Rise programme. Something inside Mark felt that what he was saying was about Jack and that maybe this programme could help our son. We started some basics of the programme and then transformed a room at home into a non-distracting environment. Where we started to learn to 'JOIN' Jack in his repetitive behaviours and we really got involved by wholeheartedly "joining" him in his activity. Joining in the "ism" gives us a common bridge of communication with Jack. At first we noticed some encouraging signs of improvement, eye contact had slightly improved and there were days when Jack said over 5 words, maybe not always in context but speech alone was a fantastic heart warming move in the right direction.

The programme will take years and the number of hours spent with Jack each week applying the strategies and techniques is influential towards his development towards a better quality of life. It is important that we achieve at least 45+ hours per week in the Son-Rise room. To achieve the numbers of hours we asked for volunteers.

Jack progress to date has really been amazing and impressed everyone who comes into contact with him he now

- Increased eye-contact and looks to maintain our attention
- Starting to copy some simple facial movements
- Spontaneously points at what he wants and shakes his head for No
- His speech is starting to become clearer and is learning to speak when requested
- Jack speaks to get his needs met.
- Jack has an average attention span of 10-20mins
- Jack is also working on imagination play.
- Jack now participates in interactions
- Jack's interest in other people's activities has greatly increased

He has the most amazing sense of humour and fun and has a greater interest in his brother and his brother's friends and world around him.

Volunteers

Three important factors that a Son –Rise volunteer must have is Enthusiasm, Excitement and Energy otherwise known as the 3 E's

The Volunteers are such a major importance, not only with the hours they contribute to the programme but also the relationship they build with Jack. It is evident with Jack the more hours he spends in the room with mum, dad and his best friends (volunteers) the more relaxed, happier and improved he is with his eye contact, speech and interaction.

We are very fortunate to have a great team of volunteers helping Jack who we value very much but with 45 hours a week to achieve we are always looking for extra help

I personally would like to thank you all for you kindness and support in Jack and your continued interest in his development. Although I don't write in the Kingsley news as often as I like it is so nice to be stopped and asked about Jack's progress. When I was first given Jack's diagnosis I felt so alone and I didn't tell anyone but thanks to everyone's support I need not of been so alone. I have Jack's facebook page and appear in the press and of course Granada Reports to not only help Jack but others so they not feel alone like I did.

Please can you help us at present we are fundraising to send Jack to America where the Son-Rise programme is based for intensive Therapy, and for more training for his parents and volunteers. To fundraise for this trip we are hosting a Dirty Dancing tribute night at the Best Western Forest Hills on the 12th July 2013. Tickets are £20 each including a hot pot supper or vegetarian option. KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

The short walk at the end of May started from The Boot at Kelsall. Five walkers and a dog walked up Castle Hill towards the site of the ancient Kelborrow Castle, then onwards to Kings Gate where they entered Primrose Hill Wood. They left the Wood at Tirley Hollow following the road for a short while and then taking the path down the side of Tirley Garth. A little further on they joined the Sandstone Trail leading back towards The Boot, where an excellent lunch was enjoyed by all.

The weather at our intended start point for the long walk on 11 June, above the Horseshoe Pass, was unpleasant with low cloud and a brisk wind, so we drove down into Llangollen to start our walk. We took the stiff climb to Castell Dinas Bran, then continued eastward then north, crossing the Offa's Dyke Path, to gain the upper slopes of the escarpment. After continuing north we descended into the steep-sided Eglwyseg Valley, where we had our lunch. We then continued our descent, returning to Llangollen along the lower slopes with views across to the ruins of Valle Crucis Abbey. Despite the heavy cloud in the morning the rain held off, and the sun came out in the afternoon to round off a good day out.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approx. 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am (Note however an earlier start of 9.00am for the long walks from May to September). 
