#### Playing fields

The highlight of the year was the holding of a bonfire on the playing field. The bonfire and firework display was organised and paid for by the charity Medcare and was well attended.

The play areas continue to be well used. The surface where the "swing see-saw" hits the soft pour, has been replaced. No other equipment has required any major maintenance. Northwich, the contractor selected for the cutting of the playing field, has performed well throughout the year and carried out the repairs to the play equipment surface.

For insurance purposes the play equipment continues to be inspected on a weekly basis by the Parish Council and an annual inspection is carried out by an independent body. This annual inspection of the play equipment was completed with no action needing to be undertaken.

The Kingsley Litter Pick continue to help keep the playing field clear of litter, as do the dog walkers.

I would also like to thank the team who open and close the gate leading into the playing field.

### Highways/Traffic & Transport

The Parish Council has extremely limited powers to address many of the specific traffic and highway problems raised by local residents but we will continue to work with and lobby officers and Councillors at CWAC to resolve as many as we can. Some of the key areas where we have been working in 2014/15 are set out below:

### Highway signage:

We are still waiting to have the 'old' sign (sent away for refurbishment) back and installed on The Brow – a prominent Kingsley landmark.

We have also worked with CWAC to replace several other signs around the village that are either badly damaged or no longer required (Community Centre, The Nab etc) We have recently lobbied CWAC to repair and consider relocation of the existing school signs on Hollow lane and Middle Lane close to Kingsley Community Primary School.

#### Parking:

The key issue raised by residents relates to on-street parking around the village, but in particular along Hollow Lane / Mill Lane (by the Post Office, School and Horseshoe Garage). We have received regular reports of dangerous and unsafe parking in this location, and do relay those concerns to the appropriate authorities (both CWAC and the Police).

Shortly after taking up his post, we met the new PCSO for the area and reinforced this was a key issue. Subsequently the PCSO has been proactive in setting up speeding awareness signs and also arranging time to speak with drivers of badly parked vehicles when he can.

KPC have made several enquiries with the owners of the Telephone Exchange with a view to leasing space for additional car parking or at least informally sharing space. Unfortunately, this is against company policy at this present time. KPC will continue to monitor this and try to persuade them to change their stance.

#### Footpaths:

We continue to respond to issued raised by residents and liaise closely with CWAC where appropriate. We have responded to recent requests for information from CWAC on proposed changes to the Definitive Map and will be looking to make a claim for a PROW between the Community Centre and St Johns school in the coming months.

The Parish Council has extremely limited powers to address many of the specific traffic and highway problems raised by local residents but we will continue to work with and lobby officers and Councillors at CWAC to resolve as many as we can.

#### Kingsley & Newton Village Institute

During the year the Charity Commission has been in discussion with the Parish Council about the governance of the Kingsley and Newton Village Institute which is a registered charity. In October 2014 the Charity Commission made an order requiring the Parish Council to hold an AGM for the Kingsley and Newton Village Institute to elect a new Management Committee.

After holding two public meetings the Parish Council called an AGM on 11<sup>th</sup> February and a new Management Committee has been in place since 11<sup>th</sup> February 2015. It is progressing with a significant list of tasks and reviewing how the Institute operates. The

Parish Council is continuing to support the Institute as needed.

#### Village Enhancement

In 2014/5, KPC used some of its budget to deliver a number of projects to `improve the appearance of the village.

One of these was to clear and improve the raised planted area by the village noticeboard, outside St Johns Primary School. The area had become very overgrown and we decided that given its location in the centre of the village and being so close to many of the village services, it was an important focal area which needed to be

improved. Working with the school, a local landscape architect prepared a scheme for the site and we carried out extensive clearance works in autumn 2014. This clearance will enable some of the existing plants and shrubs to develop further, but we also intend to undertake some additional planting soon to create a more attractive planting scheme across this whole area. We expect that this will be completed by late spring 2015. KPC also undertook, with a local contractor, to replace the post and rail fencing at the top of Top Road. Some of the distinctive white fencing had been damaged during the winter storms (2014), and when it became clear that CWAC were not interested in repairing it, we decided to do it ourselves. We have tried to keep the design and construction similar to the original fence and we are very pleased with the result. It is a huge improvement compared to what was there previously and hopefully will not require any further repair work for many years to come

In August, a sub-committee was formed to explore a number of potential investment projects to enhance the village, based largely upon the proposed actions in the 2012 parish plan. The group has met on a number of occasions and we expect discussions to continue over the coming months.

In the meantime, we were given an opportunity to apply for some Member Budget funding from our local CWAC Ward Councillor. As a result, we decided to explore the potential to move forward one of the ideas that had been suggested by the sub-committee - a path and outdoor gym project on the playing field. In November, we circulated a survey to every household in the village and we received a return of 252 responses, most of which were supportive of the scheme. KPC have had confirmation of a £3000 grant from the Member Budget fund towards the project and have commissioned Groundwork to help us with the design and further consultation. A series of community engagement events will be held in March.

In December, we carried out some electrical upgrading work to our Christmas lights at the tree on The Brow. A switch-on ceremony was held with festive refreshments and we had a good turnout of local residents and children/parents from the Methodist Church. We would like to thank the management of the Red Bull for allowing us to use their facilities again. It was agreed that we would host a similar event this year and will purchase some additional sets of lights to further enhance the display.

In last year's report, we outlined that the heritage 'Main Road' sign had been sent to a specialist company for a complete renovation. This work has proved to be a little more extensive than originally anticipated but we are pleased to report that the sign should be fully restored and back in its location on The Brow in April

#### <u>K.U. 17s</u>

KU17s Youth Club operates in Kingsley Community Centre on Thursdays, 7pm to 9pm, for members aged 10-17 yrs. Attendance currently stands at about 12-19 young people each week. This is an increase in numbers relative to 2014.

The major change this year has been to recruit Year 6 school age range (10 years old). Whilst this has probably not attracted the majority of new recruits, nevertheless we expect the numbers to grow in this age range. Current observations from the older age ranges suggest that greater numbers encourage greater numbers (they hunt in packs). A notable success from 2014 were the day long summer sessions, of which 2 were run as a trial by our ever enthusiastic youth workers. Feedback suggests these sessions were received well by the young people, and were well attended (10-13 attendees). We

will organise more this year, and ensure that a suitable fee is charged. Outings and trips continue at about 2-3 per year.

Our thanks to KPC for continuing financial support during the last financial year. We continue to receive significant financial support from the community; notably donations from the collections organised by Kingsley Players and the Kingsley Co-Op. Further fundraising effort over the coming year will be made, most likely through bag packing and table top sales.

Our primary objective remains to ensure the KU17s club remains a fun, social and safe hub for young people aged 10 - 17.

#### **Kingsley Web**

The website continues to be an extremely useful village resource and once again I would like to offer heartfelt thanks to Simon Sherlock for the management of the service, as he continues to provide his time for free.

As many will have noticed the website has been upgraded so that access from tablets and phones is far better than previously, again thanks to Simon for the effort put in to doing this upgrade.

Access to the website from tablets and phones continues to increase, hence, the requirement to make access from these devices better, the following page shows the statistics from last year – Feb 14 to Jan 15 and show the increase in non-computer access to the site.

Future developments to the site will include:

Creation of a Latest Events module for the front page (similar to the previous site) Addition of the ability to show slide-shows etc with pictures from local events etc Addition of the ability for people to submit their own articles.

It is also worth a reminder that there is the ability to enter events into the calendar on the site which can then be synchronized with people's individual calendars.

#### Chairman's Overview

Firstly, I would like to thank all my fellow Councillors for their support and attendance during the past year.

It has been a very busy year, with several major projects all happening together. The first project was the renovation of the war memorial in the cemetery, to coincide with the centenary of the start of WW1. The second project was the repairs and modernising of the clock at St. John's Church, Kingsley which the PC paid for.

I must thank Fiona and Claire, for the very professional way they both organised the AGM for the KNVI. A new committee has been elected and I am sure they will take the Institute forward to become the vibrant club it once was.

There have been additions also to the Christmas lights display and the bulb planting in the village this year.

A Committee has been set up to look at the possibility of major projects around the village in the near future.

Discussions are well underway for the PC to take over the management of the Playing Field off Middle Lane, from CWAC. This would be a major addition to the amenities available to the people of Kingsley.

Parking around the village was again discussed regularly, but so far no permanent solutions have been found.

A big thank you must go to Claire for being my vice chair this year, but mostly for taking forward the playing field project with the perimeter path and outside gym. Once completed, this will be a huge asset to the village.

Finally, I must thank Doreen for her assistance and guidance throughout the year.

We saw the home changing rooms, the grand stand, a tennis court and a large room, which looked like a space-ship with huge white screens, where the Skye TV presenters sit to commentate on the matches. We were given cakes to eat in the kitchen that had been baked with secret ingredients. We had to guess the ingredients! They turned out to be vegetables - beetroot, sweet potato and parsnip!! We then decorated cakes to take home later!

As well as this, we were allowed to play cricket on the grounds and were given special coaching to improve our game. It was an amazing opportunity and it made us appreciate the incredible sport that cricket is and how lucky we are to be able to learn it. Also, just to add to the excitement, we all got our T-shirts signed by a few of the England women's cricket team! We had a fantastic and thoroughly enjoyable day!

### Scout Leadership

I never thought that when I agreed to stand in as a scout leader I would be doing it 14 years later. Although I retired from scouts 2 years ago I now look back on those first steps that I took to scout leadership. I had no experience at scouts having never been one myself and only agreed to stand in because the then scout leader had to resign because of work commitments. Fortunately I was an experienced coach at badminton and cricket and had helped run a junior football team so I had a pretty good idea how to organise a group of young people and motivate them to give of their best. My knowledge of scouting was near to zero but there were people around to advise and a good training programme to help develop the skills and provide ideas. For a time I muddled through but started to bring structure to the programme and then was joined by other leaders who were highly motivated and helped take forward an interesting and meaningful programme.

We instructed the scouts in a range of skills and challenges and in doing so had lots of fun. All 3 of my own lads were going through the scouting movement at that time but when the last one left it never crossed my mind to give up. Basically I was enjoying what I was doing and getting a buzz out of seeing the scouts develop skills and confidence. Kingsley Scout Group as a whole was going through a renaissance during this period with a very active committee that organised many events and raised a lot of money to take on some big projects such as replacing one of our buildings. Other leaders also joined in beavers and cubs and the group went from strength to strength.

Although no longer a leader I am still involved as Quartermaster that means I organise our camping equipment and maintain other resources crucial to the group. I recently heard that we have at least two new leaders joining scouts and possibly another joining the group and I only hope they get as much enjoyment and fulfilment out of scouting as I did. New leaders and parent helpers are crucial to our group so that we can replace those that leave. They bring energy and new ideas to scouting and if like me they are short on scouting skills there is a very supportive group of leaders and a well worked out training programme to help them develop.

#### FRODSHAM WIND FARM AND ITS COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND (CBF)

#### £3m WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR COMMUNITY BENEFIT. HAVE YOUR SAY !!

Peel Energy report that good progress is being made with access tracks to the 19 turbine wind farm now being constructed on Frodsham Marshes. A 'wildlife' area has been created and Cheetham Hill Construction Ltd are operating a 'local employment scheme'. Delivery of the turbines is due February 2016 and the completion date is September 2016.

In July 2015 Peel Energy will provide more information about construction of the wind farm and will seek opinions about who should run the CBF and how the £120K available per annum for 25 years should be spent.

Significantly local CW&C councillors Lynn Riley, Andrew Dawson and Ralph Oultram, who support Frodsham Transition Initiative (FTI) and Kingsley Transition Initiative (KTI), want the people of Frodsham and surrounding communities to be involved in how the CBF money should be spent.

Following the FTI Energy debate in March 2015, the interest of FTI and KTI in being included in plans to establish a community panel for the purpose of discussing, governing and administering the CBF has been registered with Peel Energy.

Therefore, at forthcoming meetings, it will be proposed that both FTI and KTI encourage Frodsham Community Association and Kingsley Community Association to link with other local community associations to offer themselves as a key partner is helping to decide how the CBF should be managed. Frodsham Foundation is also considering the role it wishes to adopt in this process.

### **Kingsley Walking Group**



On 24<sup>th</sup> June 12 of us walked from Styal along the Bollin Valley through beautiful woodlands and then across the fields before re-entering the woods. The weather was hot and sunny and we were glad of the shade from the trees.. The path took us past Quarry Bank Mill and then back to Styal village where we had an excellent lunch at The Ship Inn.

On 9 June ten of us enjoyed a delightful eight mile walk from Trefriw in the Conway valley. We climbed along the Crafnant gorge with its cascading stream, then through deciduous woodland with drifts of bluebells, to emerge on higher ground with a tremendous panoramic view across to Snowdon and its surrounding peaks. After stopping to inspect the reputedly oldest church in Wales, we descended to the shore of Llyn Geirionydd, where lunch was taken. Afterwards we followed the shore path to the west of the lake and passed the ruins of the 'Klondyke Mine' before descending back into the Craftnant gorge. We rounded off the day with afternoon tea at Trefriw Mill. Once again we enjoyed bright and sunny weather, though with a cold breeze.

May's short walk was from the Olde Barbridge pub alongside the Shropshire Union Canal. Eight walkers set out on a blustery, but dry and sunny, day across fields and past farms, until returning to the canal. After branching up a path by the Llangollen branch of the canal. and passing the Hurleston locks and reservoir, we returned to the pub for a welcome drink and good value lunch

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. 
