#### Kingsley Bookworms – Next meeting 7th July 2016

At our last meeting at the beginning of June, a group of 11 met to talk about is "The Lie Tree" by Frances Hardinge. This proved to be a really interesting discussion because the book was written for children and it was the Costa book of the year for 2015 (not in the children's category). Some people also thought it was also a "fantasy" book, not a genre that we had tried before. The discussion was very interesting with scores ranging from 1 to 4.5. Those who enjoyed the book liked the insights into Victorian England and attitudes towards women, scientists and suicide at that time. Our group score was 3.9 (out of 5).

In July we will be discussing "Life after Life" by Karen Atkinson. A group of 17 of us are going to Grosvenor Park on July 15th to see "As You Like It". If anyone would like to join us, we'd be delighted to welcome you. We will talk about the play at our July meeting in preparation for the performance.

We had a lovely time choosing books for the next few months. So far we have decided on:

August - Villette by Charlotte Bronte to celebrate 200 years since her birth. September - A Man called Ove by Fredrick Backman. It's about a "grumpy, yet loveable man".

October - Memory Man by David Baldacci. This is a thriller with an offbeat hero. It's said to keep you guessing until the very end.

We also decided that we'd like to read and discuss an anthology by Roger McGough to remind us of our visit to Weaver Words. Our Christmas titles will be decided at the July meeting.

Our next meetings are on **Thursday 7th of July** and **August 4th** at the Red Bull. Meetings start at 7.30pm and everyone is welcome. We were delighted to welcome new members at each of our last two meetings.

#### KU 17s Youth Club News Bulletin June 2016



**New Members Welcome** 

KU17s Youth Club meets at the Kingsley Community Centre in Kingsley every Thursday night. KU17s aims to provide a fun and safe social hub in Kingsley for the 11-18 age range.

Facilities are available for ball and other games; there is a pool table, WII games system and music; a tuck shop is open to sell food, sweets and drinks. We also have access to Kingsley St. John's school field. The attendance fee is £1 per person.

A lot has happened in the last 6 months. Following challenge by the Kingsley Parish Council in January 2016 to increase KU17s membership and increase other 3rd party funding, various strategic initiatives have been made. We hope that these will increase a sense of adventure and vibrancy, and appeal to a wide range of young people, and their parents.

Firstly, the club has extended its age range. We now offer an early session for school years 4-6 from 5.30pm to 7.30pm, as well as the school years 7-13, running from 7.30pm to 9.30pm. The great news is that the early doors session is proving to be really popular, now attracting 15 young people at last count. The other great news is that we are being ably supported for this early session by volunteers from the older age group, notably Ella, Toby and Patrick. Our hope is that the older age group, many of whom are currently heads down for exams, will continue with the same enthusiasm, and that the younger ones will feed through to the older age group over the next few years.

Secondly, the club has been fortunate to be able to employ Darrell Tinsley as Youth Club Manager. He is an experienced youth club worker from Frodsham Youth Club, and also works during the day for the Youth Federation, and is passionate and experienced in best practice and operation of youth clubs.

Thirdly, we are now attracting other adult volunteers. We do need more, maybe not on a regular basis, but so that we have enough cover, for both the early doors and later sessions. If any readers can volunteer a few hours each month, we'd love to hear from you.

Fourthly, we are now organising regular sessions of internal and external activities. Art sessions with juniors, and a trip to Jump Nation have now been arranged.

The club is currently in the process of applying for Charitable Incorporated Organisation status, which will help us to apply for a greater range of sports, music and equipment grants, for example. We welcome help from anybody experienced in CIO applications.

#### **Kingsley Walking Group**



A five mile walk on 25 May from Great Budworth took the fifteen walkers along lanes and across field paths past the site of the Cheshire Show to the car park for Stockley Farm, where a coffee break was taken at the picnic tables. The return to Great Budworth carefully avoided a field of cows and a path disputed by a farmer! Lunch was enjoyed at The George and Dragon. Some light drizzle.

A forecast for thunderstorms in Snowdonia on the 14 June caused us to cancel the planned climb of Moel Siabod, and instead seven of us enjoyed an impromptu 8 mile walk from Delamere to Willington following a route we took in January. Starting from Frith Avenue off Staion Road, we climbed Eddisbury Hill to Pale Heights, then across The Yeld to Langley Farm. Dropping into Kelsall, then up the 39 Steps off Quarry Lane took us up to the top of Waste Lane. We dropped down into Boothsdale before following the road up to Summertrees. Turning for home we followed the Sandstone Trail until we reached the Roman road which leads to Stoney Lane, Delamere and back to our cars. The weather here was dry and increasingly bright!

We had an additional walk to climb Moel Siabod (2861') on 22 June. The weather was good, and our long climb was rewarded with magnificent clear views of Snowdon, Tryfan and the Carneddau as well as Cadair Idris far to the south. After descending we had tea at the Siabod Café where some of us shared enormous scones whilst the others looked on in wonder.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. We meet at the Community Centre at 9.30am for the short walks and for the long walks in January and February. Note however an earlier start time of 9.00am for the long walks from March to November.


