Several members of the public attended the meeting.

Open Meeting

The Council are holding an Open Meeting for everyone to attend, if interested, regarding the proposed development of 15 properties off Higher Heyes Drive in Kingsley. The meeting will be held on Wednesday 12 July at 7.30pm in Kingsley Community Centre. The developers will be in attendance along with the planning consultants and hopefully a member of the Cheshire West and Chester Planning Department.

Planning applications.

Five planning applications were received. 17/01943/CAT Linden Cottage The Hurst Felling of Tree; 17/01439/FUL The Firs Newton Hollows Demolition of existing building and erection of 5 dwellings; 17/02103/FUL Fir Tree House Norley Rd Conversion of existing outbuilding into dwelling; 17/02336/FUL Church Cottage :Pike Lane New 2 storey building; 17/02356/FUL Land off Higher Heyes Drive development of 15 dwellings.

Playing Field.

Signs have been placed around the children's play area stating no dogs allowed within the play area. A broken rocker will be repaired or replaced as soon as possible. A new Noticeboard is now in place for the public to use for notices of interest. Please contact the Clerk or Councillor Vickers for access to the Noticeboard. A Playing Field Survey will shortly be made available via the village website, facebook and will be leafletted around the village; the Survey asks for opinions on the general use of the playing field and thoughts about dogs using the field. The Council are investigating the complicated matter of the bylaws concerning dogs in the playing field and how bylaws can be enforced.

he Boardroom (the building inside the entrance to the cemetery) has been renovated. A Noticeboard is in place showing the Cemetery Policy/ Useful Contact Numbers and is available for the public to use for notices. Please contact the Clerk for access to the Noticeboard. The cost of improving the railings on the southern side of the Cemetery are being investigated.

Neighbourhood Plan


The Council have set up a small working party to consider whether Kingsley would benefit from a Neighbourhood Plan. This is a community led framework for guiding the future development and growth of an area. Such a plan could assist with regard to the future development of Kingsley. If such a plan is put in place it would involve the whole community and the working party would represent those from within Kingsley, not just the Council.

Kingsley Walking Group



On 31 May, there was a 5.5 mile walk, starting from 'The Bells of Peover'. After viewing the ancient church, we left Lower Peover via Free Green Lane and Broom Lane, passing the fascinating 'Tree of Imagination', carved in an old oak tree. We followed a track to 'The Whipping Stocks', then through the grounds of Peover Hall, which was General Patton's HQ during WWII. Re-crossing the A50, we followed the line of he Peover Eye to return to the pub for an enjoyable lunch. 13 participated.

The Long Walk, on 13 June, was to the Bosley Cloud. Parking in the centre of Bosley village, ten of us took a field track to Tunstall Road, then climbed steeply to the top of The Cloud (343 metres), which afforded extensive views over the surrounding countyside. Following the edge to the south, we then dropped down to cross to the Macclesfield canal. I Heading north, we reached the Aqueduct. After a slight negotiating error, we crossed the canal to return to Bosley. 8.5 miles, plus detour! Weather bright with sunny interludes

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month: on the second Tuesday there is a long walk of 7 - 8.5 miles (bring a packed lunch); on the last Wednesday a short walk of approximately 5 miles with a coffee break and pub lunch. Kingsley Bookworms – Next Meeting 13th July at The Red Bull

At our June meeting we talked about "The Outrun" by Amy Liptrot. The book is autobiographical, set in the Orkneys. The author grew up on the Orkneys but once she'd finished her education she moved to London to enjoy the excitement and opportunities not available in a small community. She became alcoholic and, eventually decided to come home.

The book combines descriptions of the island's natural features and her observations about the stars, weather and life on the islands with her experience of giving up alcohol. While there was little reference to other characters, we found that we really wanted to find out how she dealt with her alcoholism.

The score for the book was just over 4 out of 5. The conversation that followed centred on our increased awareness of how destructive alcoholism can be. The descriptions of Orkney led many of us to have an urge to visit.

A KINGSLEY RESIDENT IS INVITED TO A GARDEN PARTY AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE

The diminutive figure of Margaret Livingstone and her much loved dog Molly are well known, loved and admired by many people within the Kingsley community. Her devotion to Kingsley and its residents goes far beyond imagination as she has devoted her time to helping others for over thirty years, even at times when her personal life has been in despair.

However, all of this had not gone unnoticed and in 2015, five of her neighbours in Beechview Road proposed through our local MP that Margaret's name be submitted for a National Award in recognition of her services to the people of Kingsley. Never sure, but her proposers always hopeful that she would be successful, her recognition came in January 2017 in the form of a letter from the Lord Lieutenant of Cheshire inviting Margaret to a Garden Party at Buckingham Palace on 1st June 2017.

Margaret's reaction, not knowing her name had been put forward for an honour was "Why me ?" but with real pleasure at what lay ahead. Now she had to buy a hat, but after trying on several, she realized that big hats did nothing for her small frame, so a"fascinator" was decided upon.

Margaret now faced a big decision ie to choose a travelling companion as discreetly as possible, without contravening Royal protocol and making details of the Garden Party common knowledge. She needed a travelling companion who was reliable, confident, a good organiser and good company. These attributes were all satisfied by inviting Roz Pilgrim to accompany her to London and who proved to be perfect for the task ahead. Roz, totally organised from the beginning, She booked trains, the hotel and even determined distances and travelling times between the Railway Station, their Hotel and Buckingham Palace so nothing was left to chance in making Margaret's visit, a trip of a lifetime.

Margaret and Roz arrived promptly at the venue of the Garden Party to be two of many thousands of people. Slight thou she may be Margaret managed to squeeze through the crowd to inch her way to within yards of seeing the Queen and feeling overwhelmed to be in this position. However time went by and afternoon tea was served at 4-30pm. By 6-00pm they started to make their way back to the hotel to collect their suitcases and proceed on their journey home and reflect on the wonderful memories they had shared during their stay in London.

Unknown to Margaret, Roz was transporting her to another surprise on their arrival back in Kingsley at 9pm. Arrangements had been made by the five male proposers to welcome Margaret home at the Red Bull Pub. The

numbers of people waiting to greet her had been swelled after it was learned that news of her recognition had been posted on Facebook. All, young and old wanted to show love and respect to a true Kingsley Villager. Long may Margaret

and Molly continue to walk amongst us and we wish her better luck with her health.

Finally, thank you Roz, for a job well done in assisting our local celebrity during a trip she will never forget.



Chocolate Fudge Pudding (Serves 4)

Pudding

75g Margarine
50g Self Raising Flour + 25g Cocoa (sieved together)
75g Caster Sugar
1 egg beaten
Sauce
50g Brown sugar
15g Cocoa powder
300ml hot black coffee
50g Sugar

Method

Cream the sugar and margarine together in a bowl and then add the egg and sieved floor and cocoa gradually to prevent curdling. Place in a prepared greased pudding basin. Mix the brown sugar and cocoa powder for the sauce together and sprinkle over the top of the pudding. Pour the sweetened coffee slowly over the top of the pudding mix. Bake in an oven at 160C (fan) for 50 minutes. Serve hot with cream.

This is a delicious pudding and is a real firm family favourite in our household!
