Local historian, David Keogh, has researched a number of sites of local interest and he has kindly allowed us to reproduce the articles here in the Kingsley News.

### The Mills of Kingsley

The Domesday Survey (1086) was the first to gather a record of the people, property and, importantly, the value of the Norman conquest in Cheshire. Part of this valuation were the mills remaining after the land was plundered. Of the pre-Norman Saxon mills, only 18 are recorded of which 8 were on the R.Gowy. If there were others, they were destroyed, not working or lost to the past. Introduced by the Romans, water mills harnessed the power of streams and rivers to initiate the first industrial revolution in Britain. A technology used by the Saxons and extended with the arrival of the Normans. From Domesday to the 1850's, some 700 water and windmills are known based on tithes and an epic survey of the 1970's. Again, many others have dissolved through time to leave no trace. A 1000 mills has

Early water mills were constructed of timber. Many were little more than huts nestled on a small stream, their existence barely recorded in written documents. Maps offered some evidence, but the most useful maps came mostly after the 16<sup>th</sup> century when many mills had gone. As with modifications and extensions to homes, there were phases of mill building. Some disappeared, others were rebuilt on the same site and, yet others were new build, New designs and materials, improved

technology, introducing wind power, encouraged the spread of mills across the county.

Recorded in old manuscripts, estate maps and many other sources, our knowledge of



part of the Kingsley Tithe 1845

mills and the fields they occupied, was greatly increased in the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century by the Tithe Survey. Rather like Domesday, it produced a wealth of information about every Cheshire parish. Every field was mapped with its name, owner and occupier. Lots of other material is contained in the written Award accompanying each map.

In going through every parish tithe in

Cheshire, the variety of field names was fascinating, but one was paramount, mill field. Often a field name continued in use for generations and none more so than mill field. Despite hundreds of such fields on tithe maps, only a small number show a mill. Present or not, the name points to the importance of a mill in the community. Through the centuries it meant a watermill, windmill or both, was there in the past and only serious research can resurrect it; the 1970's survey did just that.

This week at Kingsley Community Primary School all of our classes have been taking part in our 'Project Week'. Our Key Stage 2 classes have taken on a project each while Key Stage 1 have worked together and Early Years have worked together to develop areas across our school.

Oak Class (Year 6) have revamped our entrance area to school by making some beautiful planters out of tyres that have been kindly donated to us!

Chestnut Class (Year 5) have spruced up their outdoor area to create a calming quiet area for children who want to escape the hustle and bustle of the playground, complete with a sensory garden.

Sycamore Class (Year 4) have cleared and cleaned the pond area, making new signs to display based on their research about pond wildlife. They are also maintaining our allotment area and looking after those fruits and vegetables that are already starting to grow.

Maple Class (Year 3) have been working in our wild area, 'Nature's Nook' to clear and tidy some areas to make the space a fantastic learning environment for all classes in school to visit and use. They've built some climbing equipment and will be hanging up the bird houses that children across the school have created as part of a competition. Key Stage 1 (Pine Class, Year 2 & Willow Class, Year 1) have worked together to section their playground into areas for the children including a stage, a reading nook, a water play area and a construction area.)







Early Years (Acorn Class, Reception & Seedling & Sapling Class, Nursery) started their project last Saturday with a working party of staff and parent helpers to create a Community Garden in an area of school that was unused. They have created and prepared planting areas for the children to plant this week and ended the week with parents bringing in a sensory plant to plant with their child to embrace that real sense of community.

We have had numerous parent helpers and donations from our families and local businesses, whom none of this would have been possible without. So a huge thank you to our amazing Kingsley Community for your continued support, we truly are grateful!



This year marks the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of *Alice's Adventures Through* the Looking Glass by Lewis Carroll, born Charles Lutwidge Dodgson at Daresbury rectory in 1832.

To mark this special year, award-winning Cheshire writer Lynn Pegler is shining a spotlight on the author's intriguing double life with the premiere of her new play 'Alice's Quest for Wonderland: *Down the Rabbit Hole with Lewis Carroll'* on stage for three nights in a production by Kingsley Players, **Friday 23 – Sunday 25 July.** 

This entertaining, new drama explores the fact behind the fiction of the enigmatic author, who spent his first 11 years in the county. Audiences are invited to discover more about the writer's complex life as an Oxford University maths tutor and world famous children's author, and his relationship with the real Alice, who inspired one of the most popular characters in English Literature.

Lynn said: "Lewis Carroll is a fascinating man and it has been a labour of love to delve in depth into his life. The English language is so much richer thanks to his clever, witty creations. In the play, I take on the role of an adult Alice, looking back on her life, and I'm joined on stage by actors James Partington and Simon Hetherington, who between them play more than 20 characters, including her two sons, husband, White Rabbit, Queen of Hearts, Cheshire Cat and of course, Lewis Carroll himself.

"The play features favourite poems, such as the 'Walrus and the Carpenter' and 'Jabberwocky', and I've tried to tell the story of Lewis Carroll and Alice with a surreal, light touch, in keeping with his original fantasy stories.

"Hopefully no-one will lose their heads and the audience will appreciate an enjoyable trip down the rabbit hole to get under the skin of the real Alice and her relationship with this complex, much-loved author.

"Our play has now been cancelled six times at various venues due to covid, so we are desperately keeping our fingers crossed for the end of July!"

Tickets cost £10 each, including a drink. Each performance at Kingsley Community Centre starts at 7.30pm, lasts about an hour, with no interval.



## THE HURST METHODIST CHAPEL.....the third on this site..... .....is 150 years old this year 1871 –2021

In January 1868 a meeting was held, presumably in the 1818 chapel (the second chapel on the Hurst site) to discuss the building of a new chapel. Mr Samuel Woodward, who at the time was living in Norley attended and, according to his wife Mary in a letter to their son Samuel, promised £25 pounds towards its construction. Mary went on to say 'that the others (probably all men!) thought this was too little so he promised a further sum if he came to live in Kingsley'. A few years later he did when he bought 'Mount Pleasant' Top Road, and became one of 18 Trustees of The Hurst Methodist Chapel.

The first recorded Trustees meeting was held at Frodsham on October 5<sup>th</sup> 1868 and a second meeting at Kingsley on November 9<sup>th</sup> in the same year. At this second meeting it was formally moved 'that there be a new chapel at Kingsley'. A Mr Baker was requested to design and oversee the construction and tenders were to be put out and a public meeting was proposed to promote interest and no doubt for the subscription of funds.



We have very little reliable evidence of what


happened after that other than an extract from the Treasurer's accounts of 1870 – 1871 where it is recorded 'Balance in hands of Steward for the New Chapel £18-5-9' and 'Balance in hands of the Treasurer £4-3-10'.(£1in 1870 is worth about £120 today). What we do know, albeit a statement of the obvious, it was built! Who were the builders? Having regard to the size of the premises was it really built in a little over a year? Was the 1818 chapel demolished or are some parts of it hidden in the 1871 chapel? It is recorded that memorial stones were laid on September 8<sup>th</sup> 1870 and the likely dedication of the new chapel was late in July 1871, but where are these stones?

There are more unanswered questions, some speculative answers and information in Peter Robinson's excellent booklet compiled for the 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the chapel. (There are a few copies of the booklet available FoC).





At the recent Parish Council meeting the accounts for the 2020/21 financial year were agreed and the AGAR signed, the accounts will now be sent off to the independent financial auditor for scrutiny and signing off. The accounts will shortly be available to view on the Kingsley Parish Council website.

The Parish Council are going to be working with St Johns School and a local, village based artist to create a new mural on the concrete wall that runs along the passage between the school and the community centre. This exciting community art project will brighten up the entrance to the school and be seen by all those who pass by. If anyone has any half opened or unused tins of exterior paints that they no longer need, our local artist would love to use them in creating this piece of public art.

There is going to be a "drive - around" the village by our Ward Councillor Hugo Deynem with Andrew Lewis the CEO of CWaC on the 30<sup>th</sup> of June. We have been asked to raise two issues that are of concern to the Council. We have therefore asked that Hugo to raise the issues of the condition of both the highway network, pavements within residential area and the state of the PROW network , the number of issues with the general condition of the network, the way people use it, its accessibility / availability to all users and how it might be improved to increase greater, responsible use all need addressing urgently. We have also asked that the issue with respect to Norley Road around Pear Tree and Rose Cottages be looked at with respect to Planning and Highways.

Higher Heyes Update: At the last Parish Council meeting, Torus Housing reported that they had paused extending tier allocations temporarily as they wished to improve options for local Kingsley residents. There is an issue with only a limited number of mortgage suppliers for affordable homes . They are in discussions with CWaC and will revert to the Parish Council with possible new proposals in the near future.

### **Top Tips for the month**

- Check you clematis for signs of Clematis Wilt
- Don't forget to water your tubs and planters and any new plants with recycled water. Save water you run off to get hot water, use lightly soiled washing up water, reuse as much water as you can. And water at the end of the day.
- Dead head bedding plants, roses indeed any flowering plant to ensure repeated flowering
- Cut back any perennial plants that are past their best
- Continue to tie in climbing plants as they grow
- Start feeding your tomatoes as the flowing trusses appear
- Divide clumps of bearded iris once they have finished flowering.

Hi, my name is Anne - otherwise known as the Norley Veg Lady.

I live at Fingerpost Farm, in Norley, which has been run by the same family for 2 generations.

We grow vegetables in the fields and have many outbuildings which are home to our tractors, and wildlife such as Swallows, Blackbirds and Robins, who nest in them. They have even nested in one of the tractors!

You might have paid a visit to my stall outside the farm gate, especially in the Autumn for Halloween pumpkins! I started selling produce as a hobby, and thoroughly enjoy it. Its farm to fork at its best. All of the vegetables and plants I sell are either





home grown or locally sourced, which reduces the "food miles" which contribute towards climate

change. During the summer I have sweet corn, various beans, tender stem broccoli and sometimes tomatoes and

peppers. In the winter we harvest carrots,
Jerusalem Artichokes, butternut and edible
squash varieties, however, Halloween is our
busiest time, selling pumpkins and ornamental
squash that my customers use for

Halloween displays and Jack o'lanterns for the children.
