

Kingsley Walkers

Long Walk

There were 9 of us on this most spectacular walk in the White Peak area of Derbyshire. We met in the village of Monyash and began by covering 3 1/2 miles of the magnificent limestone Lathkill Dale. It was a delight to see a clutch of 9 newly hatched ducklings confidently swimming with their mother in the river that runs through the dale. From here we crossed the river Lathkill and headed to Meadow Place Grange Farm for our packed lunch.

The afternoon's walk followed the Limestone Way and descended some steep steps to Cales Dale. From here we passed One Ash Grange Farm where 2 peacocks afforded us a welcome rest whilst listening to their distinctive cry. Finally we crossed pasture land full of spring lambs before returning to Monyash for refreshments in the tea shop.

The walk was 9 miles and despite sometimes threatening clouds there was no rain. We all agreed the weather was perfect for a most enjoyable long walk. Very many thanks to our leader for sharing one of her favourite walks in the Peak District.

Short walk

The regular short walk on the second Tuesday of the month took place on a lovely sunny morning and was again very well attended. From the Whitegate Station Cafe we went for a short distance along the Whitegate Way path before heading off on lovely tracks through woodland and countryside, then by the Petty Pool and New Pool lakes near Whitegate Village. Then we headed back through wheat and barely fields and down a covered lane before coming back to our start point. Most people then went on to lunch at the Fishpool Inn.

The Kingsley walking group is always looking to welcome new members. There are two walks a month, a short one of around 4-5 miles on the second Tuesday normally with the option of a pub lunch at the end. SCHOOL NOTES

Mrs. M.B. Macquiban and Mr. R. Armitage were appointed to the permanent teaching staff from September 1st; Mrs. Macquiban to teaching General Subjects, and Mr. Armitage Science and Rural Studies.

Puring the year Mr. J.B. Garland, B.Sc., Mr. D. Faulkner and Mr. G.N.S. Garner, B.A. held temporary teaching appointments.

Miss K. Hardwick left the school at the end of the Easter Term for an appointment at Weaverham County Primary School.

In July eighty-two pupils visited London by train and coach, accompanied by members of the teaching staff.

In November 3rd and 4th year pupils visited the Library Theatre, Manchester, to see a production of "As you Like It".

In February the Music Club members visited the Liverpool Philharmonic Hall for a concert by the Vienna Boys Choir.

In April a public performance of three One-Act Plays was given to a large audience in the School Hall

2nd year pupils and parents were interviewed in July re Alternative Course selection.

On July 11th new pupils from Crowton, Norley and Kingsley C.E. Schools were entertained.

The Annual Sports Day was held on July 14th.

Speech Day and Prizegiving was held on September 21st, when Alderman J.H.I. Radcliffe, Chairman of the County Education Committee, was the distinguished guest. The Chairman of the meeting was Councillor James Hunt.

Along with other County Schools, the school has been equipped with paper towels.

During the summer holidays the school was decorated internally and later, four new floors were fitted to classrooms. The new playing field in Depmore Lane has been levelled and re-seeded, and a concrete wicket has been provided. The Grounds Staff have started the re-instatement of the area bordering the southern entrance gates.

New equipment provided in 1960 has included:-

woodworkers lathe, P.E. lockers, new furniture for History and Art/Craft rooms; two library trolleys; staff room furniture; greenhouse heater; refrigerator; drying cabinet; four electric cookers; Hoovermatic washing machine; electric floor polisher; new lights in School Hall; climbing ropes in Gym; set of soccer strips; formica tops to six tables; notice boards; P.E. mats; commercial equipment.

Inter-school games have been played at Football and Netball. Swimming instruction for boys and girls has continued at the Runcorn Baths, and very creditable results have been gained in the tests. The Badminton Club has continued its activities. Boxing was introduced in February. A P.E. Club was formed in September. The Film Society has met regularly throughout the year.

The School Choir performed at Speech Day, and will lead the Service of Lessons and Carols again. The Recorder Band has been extended and plays regularly for Morning Assembly:

Inter-House competitions have been held in a variety of sports, and the Marks Competition started last year has become well est-ablished.

The Parent-Teacher Association has held a Jumble Sale and a Whist Drive. At the Annual Meeting the P.T.A. was addressed by Mr. E. Leigh-Smith, County Inspector of Secondary Schools. The Committee has decided to help raise funds for a School library.

A new summer uniform for girls was introduced this year.

In September Christine Wilkes was appointed Head Girl, and P. Carter, Head Boy.

Christmas activities have included the annual Children's Service of Lessons and Carols, Senior and Junior Parties, Christmas Dinner, and an exhibition of cakes made by the senior girls. In accordance with last year's tradition, the school Christmas Tree has been presented to the N.C.H. & O. Hospital.



'Did You Know'?

On Sunday May 22nd, our visiting preacher reminded the Hurst congregation of the foundation of the Methodist Church in 1738 by John Wesley, an Anglican priest who became disillusioned with the Church of England, breaking away from the established Church and founding a new group called Methodists (because they were known for their "methodical study and devotion"). He had revolutionary ideas, which included visiting prisoners and teaching them to read, paying their debts and finding them employment, and then visiting workhouses and distributing food, clothes, medicine and books and opening schools for the poor. One of his main principles was that the church was "FOR ALL". We, at the Hurst, follow this ethos and welcome anyone at any time. Please join us.

'Sweet the rain's new fall, sunlit from heaven Like the first dewfall on the first grass.'

Are you a lark or an owl? If you're an owl, it's worth setting an alarm once in a while for sunrise and getting up, whether the day promises sun or rain, to appreciate the freshness of the early morning and the cacophony of the dawn chorus. Like the song-writer, you may well be filled with praise for God's creation. Witnessing that 'freshly washed' character of the natural world at dawn has been proved to recast, positively, our attitude to the day ahead.

There are apparently far fewer photographs of sunrises than of sunsets. While the colour spectrum may be similar, the view does change. Try taking a photo of the natural world – garden, lane, field - from the same spot one day, at dawn and at dusk, then compare the two. In essence nothing is any different, yet the quality of the light gives a different perspective on the scene.

It's the light that helps us see things differently. Jesus Christ said, 'I am the light of the world' (John 8:12). Looking, listening, reaching out in love he shed light into the darkest corners of God's creation. He saw from a different perspective - *sub specie aeternitas*: in the perspective of the light of eternity. We can choose to follow his example and see how it changes our perspective.

Writer Tomas Halik recorded this story:

'Rabbi Pinchas asked his students how one recognises the moment when night ends and day begins. "Is it the moment that it's light enough to tell a dog from a sheep?" asked one student. "No" answered the rabbi. "Is it when we can tell a date palm from a fig tree?" asked another. "No, that's not it either," said the rabbi. "So when does morning come, then?" they asked. "It's the moment when we look into the face of any other person and recognise them as our brother or sister", Rabbi Pinchas said. "Until we can do that it's still night."
