- Following several burglaries that occurred at Overton Village Hall that I circulated information about several weeks ago, we have now arrested and charged a 19yr old local man who will be appearing at Northwich Magistrates Court next month.

We are aware of increased incidents of anti social behaviour in Castle Park Frodsham recently and I want to assure residents that this area does form part of our ongoing commitment to dealing with ASB in our area. We have dealt with a number of local youths and are processing them through our interaction with outside agencies and schools.
- 5. The subject of Police Volunteers is very heavily covered in the news lately, but it's not a new concept and we have had volunteers working with us for some 2 years now. I have two 17yr old students who give us their spare time and if you are interested in joining our scheme please contact our Human Resources Department at Police HQ Winsford.

He retires in 4 weeks time and his temporary replacement will be Pc Graeme Morrison who is coming onto our area following 3 years as a Tutor Constable. 


KINGSLEY WALKING GROUP

On 13 July, eight walkers set out from the station at Whitegate along the Whitegate Way, then uphill through a field of sweetcorn to the end of Beauty Bank and down a long track flanked by trees on either side. After a refreshment break we continued along wooded lanes and by flowing streams to arrive at a fine church opposite Vale Royal. This led to Petty Pool, which was being enjoyed by a solitary fisherman. We walked on through the wood alongside a stream which after the dry weather was comfortably negotiated, then along a permissive path to the spot where we had lunch. This walk turned out to be a masterpiece of circular routes put together without the walkers being aware until we realised that we had passed places twice. The walk finished up on the other side of Whitegate Way, giving the walkers a straight path back to the cars. The participants enjoyed the company and the exercise.

On 28 July, 11 walkers set out on a five mile walk from Beeston Castle, their ranks having been swollen by 3 new members and a "maybe". Proceeding along the Sandstone Trail they climbed Bulkley Hill and carried on to Peckforton, where, after taking a downward trail and turning left they came across a monument in a garden, of the Elephant and Castle. After this a walk along the Sandstone Trail back to Beeston and then to the Shady Oak for sustenance.

On 10 August, ten of us drove to the Bickerton Poacher, astonished at the warm sunshine after all that rain. We then walked to the southerly Bickerton Hill to pick up the Sandstone Trail, up the steep steps to the Iron Age hill fort Maiden Castle. We had lunch on the ramparts and enjoyed the spectacular views over the Dee valley and the highly profiled Welsh mountains beyond. We followed the Trail down and then back up to the steps to the sandstone outcrop, Raw Head, the highest part of the Trail (Trig. point at 227m-746') and down to the Poacher for a rest. The map said 7 miles but after all this exertion we all agreed to call it 9 miles, if anyone asks.

Kingsley Walking Group have two walks each month, meeting at the Community Centre at 9.30am. On the second Tuesday there is a long walk, bring a packed lunch. 
