As there was no official meeting in August, we met instead at the home of Geoff and Janet Brundrett for a friendly chatting evening with a bit of fund raising thrown in. The money raised will go towards the world-wide work of the Mothers' Union, in particular the Relief and Wheels for Workers Funds.

#### KINGSLEY PARISH COUNCIL (KPC)

#### Traffic, Transport and Footpath Update (July / August 2011)

- 1. Cllrs Moores and Griffiths have now met with the relevant Greenspace Officer at CWAC to discuss several Public Right of Way issues and what we might be able to do in partnership with them in the future. Watch this space for more news on a footpath survey and possible volunteer work group. In the meantime, if there are any issues you wish to raise with us then please contact us using the detail below.
- 2. Hopefully most of you will have seen the repair and improvement works along Brookside and at the bottom of Chapel Lane which were completed in early August. The works were undertaken to repair the road edge and footpath which had been crumbling into the brook for some time. KPC were involved in selecting the new kerb edgings (recycled York stone blocks previously used in Chester City Centre) and ensuring that the original stones (surplus to requirements) have been stored locally so that we can use them in any other future projects. We also worked closely with the contractors and soon after they were on site, obtained their agreement to help us replace and improve the fencing (at the bottom of The Hurst) which is more in keeping with the style that had been in place there for many decades previously. KPC would like to take the opportunity to thank all those involved in the work – CWAC Cllr R. Oultram; the site contractors – Bam Nuttall (polite and generous with their 'extra' help); Steve at the Red Bull for his hospitality and allowing storage of materials; Brian Moores and Dave Mort for installing some of the railings; Nick Mort - who kindly donated the replacement fence posts and finally the residents of Brookside for 'putting up' with the disruption.
- 3. Other possible projects we are considering whilst we await the results from the Parish Plan Survey: wildflower planting on selected grass verges and re-opening 'The Spout' at the bottom of Dark Lane (the original source of water for many Kingsley residents).....does anyone have any thoughts on these?

## Parish Plan – Update

The Parish Plan group has been working throughout the summer. Nearly 50% of the surveys were completed and returned, so the next step is to process the data and produce a report summarising the results. We can then identify projects for the future. Report writing has now started and is planned to be complete in October.

#### **Next Steps**

The next stage in the project is to form a working group to decide on areas for future development. The "hot topics" are likely to include traffic and transport, housing and development, the environment, social facilities etc. They will be chosen once the data has been completely analysed.

Finally, we will set up implementation groups for each work area. They will have strong links back to the Parish Council and will run for an extended period.

#### **Tapping into Kingsley's Volunteer Force**

So far, the Parish Plan Project has had the support of more than 40 people across the project. People have made varying contributions, ranging from attending a single brainstorming meeting, developing a

database to store the survey data through to drafting the final report. As ever, Kingsley people have come up trumps.

We now need volunteers to help work on the implementation phase. As ever, we need people to attend meetings, lead groups and provide practical support. Why not come along and see how you can help? The date of the next meeting is **Monday the 7<sup>th</sup> of November at 7.30**. All are welcome.
