Kingsley Players storm to success in 2018 Cheshire Theatre Guild Awards

Kingsley Players stormed to success in the 2018 Cheshire Theatre Guild awards by winning the county's Best Overall Production for *Goodnight Mr Tom*, plus four other awards.

The Kingsley Players Youth Theatre production of *Arabian Nights* was presented with a special Adjudicator's Award and Eleanor Roberts, who played Shahrazad, was named Most Promising Young Female Actor.

Matthew Betteridge and Ben Mather Dodd, who played the young boys William and Zach in *Goodnight Mr Tom*, were jointly awarded Best Young Actor in a Senior Production, and *Cinderella* was given the Best Costume Award and named Best Panto runner-up.

The prizes were presented at a special ceremony in Macclesfield to a packed house, despite clashing with England's World Cup semi-final bid.

Kingsley Players chairman Colin Smith said: "Many congratulations to everyone connected with the group's four productions over the last year. Our record number of awards and nominations, spread across all aspects of the theatre, are a fantastic recognition of everyone's hard work, skill and creativity."

The 16 nominations also included *Goodnight Mr Tom* for Best Director (Malcolm Barker & Laura Williams), Best Actor (Dylan White), Best Supporting Female Actor (Holly Bolland), Best Supporting Male Actor (Carlo Marson) and Best Properties.

The pantomime *Cinderella* was also nominated for Best Lighting and Sound, and Phil Murray for Best Supporting Actor in *A Bunch of Amateurs*. The Youth Theatre production of *Arabian Nights* in March was recognised with nominations for Best Director (Jake Powell & Alex Dedman), Best Young Female Actor (Maddison Withey), Most Promising Young Female Actor (Ruby Taylor), Most Promising Male Actor (Max Houghton) and Best Costume.

Kingsley Players will next be on stage in October (17-20) with an adaptation of the classic Jane Austen novel, *Pride and Prejudice* and in January 2019 with a production of the popular musical *Dr Doolittle*.

FARM UPDATE SUMMER 2018

NEWS & VIEWS FROM YOUR LOCAL FAMILY FARM

What a year the last twelve months has been!! The extreme weather has knocked Brexit from the main topic of discussion for farmers. Twelve months ago it started raining and kept on raining until May this year. The wheat harvest 2017 was not completed until October, and the potato harvest never did get finished. We have approximately 7 acres of our wettest fields that we had to leave. The rain kept coming, making fieldwork impossible. Just when Spring was around the corner, the Beast from the East parts one and two, came with a vengeance, bringing snow and ice well into March. Our early potatoes that should have been planted during February, were pushed on into mid March and were not completed until May.

Our heavy land that should have been drilled with winter wheat in the Autumn, had to be drilled the following Spring, but the incessant rain made this very late, causing the crop to be very poor.

When May came in, the rain stopped and the sun came out and stayed out. The old saying 'Rain in May for corn and hay' did not come to pass. The land eventually dried out and crops started to grow away. Then the weather got hotter and hotter and Spring sown crops soon wilted. Hay was easy to make but potatoes did not grow. Potato harvest started three weeks later than usual. The price stayed quite high because the crops were so small. Potato yields have been disastrous across all sectors, both crisping and chipping potato yields were so low as to be uneconomic.

Livestock and dairy farmers are affected even worse. There has been no grass growing anywhere for months. Farmers are having to feed their cows and beef cattle now with the silage and hay they have made for the winter months. Some are buying silage and straw when they can find it, but it is very expensive. There has not only been a long hot drought in the UK, but also across Europe, the US and Russia. Wheat yields are forecast to be down across the world, and this has pushed the price of wheat up which has helped compensate for the drop in yields.

We are now attempting to sow next year's Oil Seed Rape, and although the really hot weather has past for now, the soil is as hard as concrete and has to be subsoiled first to loosen it up before we can plant the seeds.

Restrictions on how much water can be used, combined with the exceptionally hot weather has made growing field scale vegetables near impossible this year. Supermarkets demand a steady supply of cheap vegetables all year round. They have now started to use second quality veg marketed as 'wonky veg'.





We are now only half way through August and with 100 days until the cattle come in from the field, with little silage in store, it is going to be a long winter!.

How can two years be so different?

NEW KINGSLEY STORE AND POST OFFICE SERVED-UP BY CO-OP

The Co-op has served-up a new food store and Post Office in Kingsley, following a £650,000 investment creating up to five new jobs. The store has relocated from The Cross, to Hollow Lane, more than doubling in size to enhance the service to the community.

In addition to the retention of Post Office services, a range of services will also be available over the counter outside of the Post Office's usual hours – making a selection of Post Office services available for an additional 64 hours each week.

The store will open between 7am-10pm daily, offering customer car parking, an instore bakery, hot food, and a Costa coffee dispenser, alongside its focus on fresh healthy foods, meal ideas, award winning wines and essentials.

A funding boost is also on the "cards" at the store for local causes through the Coop's Membership scheme - Members receive a 5% reward on the purchase of ownbrand products and services, with the community retailer donating a further 1% to local causes. Causes in the area currently benefitting include: the Kingsley and Newton Village Institute; Owley Wood Scouts and Guides and the Weaverham Community Centre.

Tim Gardner, Kingsley – Hollow Lane Co-op Store Manager, said: "We are delighted to have the opportunity to carry out such significant investment in Kingsley. It is exciting to have such a great looking store, and enhanced offer, in order to better serve our community. Our ambition is always to ensure our store is a local hub, a real asset locally, offering what our members and customers want, conveniently."

Paul Willcox, Co-op Area Manager, added: "We are investing in our people, stores, products, prices and communities – our aim is for our store to be at the heart of local life, bringing communities together and offering great quality products, when and where our members and customers need them. We also want customers to know that they can become a co-owner and member of their Co-op. And, that we are also giving back to the community. Our members make a difference locally, simply by swiping their membership card when they shop with us they raise much needed funding for organisations in the area who contribute to improving local life."

The Co-op – which won the title of Convenience Retailer of the Year at the latest Retail Industry Awards – this year unveiled a £50M price investment programme to cut the cost of everyday essentials including fruit, vegetables, bread, fresh meat and ready meals, as well as household brand names.

There are offers and promotions in and around the new store to mark its launch. Students and apprentices holding the NUS extra card receive a 10% discount off their groceries to support them during their studies.


World War One Centenary




